Comments: The students must be exposed to practical life and entrepreneurship. Department's efforts in the area of entrepreneurship and research needs improvement. Details regarding CTC, internships undertaken need to be mentioned. Higher studies undertaken by the alumnae can also be added. Results of the students are good with majority falling in first division. Department should establish MoUs with foreign universities.

Grade: Satisfactory

B Faculty

Comments: The research work of the faculty is satisfactory but is lopsided. Not all the faculties are equally indulged in research work. Also, the impact factor by google scholar is not acceptable. It has to be published by Clarivate. Moreover, conferences and FDPs needs little attention. Also, information on approved PhD guides and members of editorial board of journals can also be added. Best paper awards in various international and national conferences can be added. Memberships of literary organization can also be mentioned. Faculty must have ORCID if and Google Scholar id. Also, every published research paper should mention no. of citations and h-index. Impact factor by Clarivate should be mentioned.

Grade: Needs improvement

Variety of seminars by experts have also been conducted by the department. Regarding students, mentor-mentee details and the frequency of the meeting needs to be mentioned. Also, what is the mechanism of collecting student feedback?

Grade: Good

D. Vision, mission and future plans of the Department

*Comments: Vision is related to making JDM as one of the best institutes. However, as an **educational** institution what vision does it hold for its students? Department vision needs to be clarified and must be precise. Mission needs to be student oriented. For example- instilling logical thinking, entrepreneurial skills, leadership qualities etc. Thus, vision and mission must be student oriented.*

Grade: Needs improvement

E. Additional remarks- The department can focus upon building a research and inquisitive environment for its faculty. Every faculty member must have ORCID id and a google scholar profile. Also, every published research paper should mention the number of citations and h-index. Faculty must fill the APAR form regularly for every duty and work undertaken. Lastly, the department must establish MoUs with foreign universities for great exposure to its students.

F. Overall comments and Grade – Department of Commerce, Janki devi Memorial College is working in the right direction for its students but a little more efforts are expected in the following areas-

Part A: Follow-Up Action Planned

In light of the Auditor's recommendations and SWOC analysis, what is the Follow-up Action planned by the department?

The Departmental Meeting was conducted on 19th July, 2023 to discuss the actions to be taken with respect to Academic Audit Report 2022-23, shared by Prof. Amit Singh. The following steps have been taken by the department to improve its performance in the future.

1. The Impreneurs, the Entrepreneurship Cell of the College has taken huge steps to expose our students to practical life and hone their entrepreneurial skills. The E cell has shared its data with respect to revenues earned by the students, and their other entrepreneurial adventures including incubation programme and project ANUPAM, undertaken during 2022-23. This data will be shared regularly by them and presented in Academic Audits of the department in future.
2. The CTC packages offered by companies to our students in campus placements has been collected and will be will be presented in Academic Audits.
3. The data on students' research projects shows six research projects undertaken by them in 2022-23 and they will be encouraged more to take up research projects in 2023-24.
4. The department is making its efforts to sign an MOU with a foreign university and an FDP will be conducted soon with a foreign collaboration.
5. The faculty will share the impact factor published by Clarivate for its publications in future. Google Scholar and Widwan IDs have been shared by the faculty and will be presented for Academic Audits.
6. More conferences and FDPs will be conducted in future.
7. One M.Phil and two Ph.Ds were supervised in 2022-23 and more information will be available for 2023-24.
8. Memberships of literary organisations will be shared for 2023-24.
9. The information for Add on courses conducted during 2022-23 has been collected and mentor-mentee details compiled.
10. The Department of Commerce aims at working hard in future and make its best efforts to instil logical thinking, entrepreneurship skills and leadership qualities among its students.

B. Faculty:

The proportion of faculty holding PhD degree was very low in department. All faculty members of the department who do not have PhD should start working on their doctoral degrees, as that is not just a professional requirement; it also makes the faculty better teachers.

The faculty members of the department need to start publishing more articles in reputed UGC and Scopus-Indexed journals both at national and international level. The faculty needs to focus more on research projects and try to send research proposals to research funding institutes like ICSSR.

C. Best Practices of Department/ Department initiatives:

The Economics Department should try to take more initiative for extension and social responsibilities along with donations. Some suggestions could be to engage with NGOs or villages. Socio-economic study of the villages that is adopted could also be another way of doing extension activities.

D. Additional remarks

The department presentation method was excellent where in all the members presented portions of the PowerPoint presentation. The faculty could also take effort to attend seminars and

conferences outside the institute.

Part A: Follow-Up Action Planned

In light of the Auditor's recommendations and SWOC analysis, what is the Follow-up Action planned by the department?

The Economics Department is thankful and appreciative of Prof Bathula for agreeing to give his time to assess the Department. Following his recommendations, the Department has come up with the following action plan.

1. The recommendation of highlighting detailed aspects of curricular and other activities in the presentation would be inculcated in future.
2. In terms of aiding students of different backgrounds, like language barriers, remedial classes are being taken to help students cope with their studies.
3. Out of 11 faculty members, 4 are PhD holders, 5 are enrolled in PhD programmes. Other faculty members are in the process of enrolling themselves in a PhD programme. Some faculty members who are already enrolled are also in the process of completing their thesis.
4. Many faculty members are applying for research projects in various institutes. Two project proposals have already been accepted.
5. Faculty members have undertaken to work on research articles and would be looking towards publications of the same in reputed journals
6. On the social responsibility front, the Department has already organized an educational visit for students and faculty to Aanganwadis of Azam Garh, Greater Noida in collaboration with an NGO named "Let's Educate Children in Need (LECIN)". The Department also engaged itself in a Donation collection drive of stationary materials for

children of these Anganwadis in collaboration with “LEGIN”. The Department is also in discussion with the same NGO for working towards students volunteering/internship in Anganwadi.

7. The faculty would be making an effort towards attending and participating in seminars and conferences outside the institute.

A. Students

Comments: It is highlighted that students have participated at international, National and State level and won laurels for the college. The progression to higher classes is also being highlighted by the department of physical education. Good number of students are participating in sports competitions. Numerous activities are being conducted by the college for the students. Placement of the student was not highlighted. Only few students' involvement in research has been highlighted. Department has also highlighted the mass participation and sports excellence by the students. Students were also involved in community services such as "Yog for preventive health care" which was organized by the department successfully. The progression of the students to the higher educations was also reported significantly.

Grade: Excellent

B Faculty

Comments: The faculty members of the department are well qualified and all the faculty possess Ph.D degree in physical education. Faculty is involved in research work and few publications were also presented. Departments are conducting very effective extension activities. It was observed that most of the research publication is in peer journal. An effort should be made to publish research articles in Scopus indexed journal or listed journals of UGC CARE.

Grade: Very Good

C. Best Practices of Department/ Department initiatives

Comments: Department is conducting capacity building and skill enhancement activities for the students. Placement of the students and progression to higher education are encouraging. Students need more encouragement for participation in extra- curricular activities. Department is introducing students to General Fitness and Wellness programmes regularly. Yog and Meditation camps are being conducted by the department on regular basis. Department has presented its best practices by dividing the practices into academic pursuit, sports excellence and extension of sports for all and motivating them to pursue excellence by rewarding them with cash and prizes. Student's fitness progress in the program is monitored regularly and online modes of fitness apps like Strava & Google fit apps are good practices which has been adopted by the department. In my view use of fitness app for monitoring the fitness of the students is encouraging for students by giving them informed feedback.

Grade: Excellent

D. Vision, mission and future plans of the Department

Comments: Department has presented its future plan as development of infrastructure, incorporating scientific based coaching, involvement of external experts, water harvesting in different fields, different workshops are also planned for capacity building among faculty members. However, workshop for developing the skills of their coaches and educating athlete about the menace of the drugs should also be taken into consideration.

Grade: Very Good

E. Additional remarks

Department of Physical Education is doing commendable work for the students those who are participating in sports. Department of physical education is required to broaden its horizon beyond medal winning and competitive sports.

F. Overall comments and Grade Based on the findings following are recommended for the department to incorporate in their planning to make their contribution more effective for the development of the college.

- i. The Department can evolve a system where the students are awarded stars (1 star to 5 star) based on their fitness level and awarding 80 percentile and above 5 star and 20 percentile and below 1 star on demand basis.
- ii. Department can also develop fitness norms for students and staff of the Institute.

- iii. Research culture among students needs to be strengthened further.
- iv. Department needs to develop a Physical Education Policy for a college where department need to work across all verticals.
- v. Learning outcome has been set but a mapping of LO's needs to be developed.
- vi. Best practices of individual department for various aspects need to be institutionalized.
- vii. Students should be involved in the extension activities.
- viii. More collaboration needs to be established for faculty exchange, students exchange, internship etc.
- ix. FDP programmes to enhance teaching and coaching quality need to be organized on regular basis.

Overall the Department of Physical Education is doing VERY GOOD.

In Following measures have been taken -

- 1) Sports motivational speech/lectures should be conducted for sports excellence aspirants – **We have been touch with various experts to chalk out the programme to implement it.**
- 2) Motivational lectures on Fitness should be conducted for all according to specific target groups – **same as above.**
- 3) Regular feedback as a whole on yearly basis as well as against each programme should be procured – **We already have adopted this as a practice, but did not reflect in our academic report. We will include the feedback in the next report.**
- 4) Research programme in collaboration with other institutions should be promoted with financial and administrative support – **We have started the collaboration with the Department of Physical Education, University of Delhi.**
- 5) Some research equipments be procured specific to games, sports and fitness – **We have purchased some as part of research programme and in the process of purchasing more as per requirement.**
- 6) Yearly ratings of randomly selected sample (who have actively participated), regarding the issues of department as well as future programmes be generated – **We are doing the same for the last three years.**
- 7) Display the feedback on notice boards & reports – **This we will do as soon as our feedback analysis is ready.**
- 8) There should be a number of sports academies in the college for promotion of sports as well as excellence in performance with controlled entry- **This is a policy matter and needs elaborate discussion with the governing body of the college trust.**
- 9) Research programme with external agencies/researchers on contractual basis - **We will work on it.**
- 10) For outstanding achievements and contributions of sports alumni, there should be some kind of honour/award to the mentor/resource persons/ alumni/faculty – **We already have adopted this practice on a regular basis on the occasion of Alumni Association Function and the distinguished alumnae are invited as experts or motivational speakers to have discussion with the sports girls.**

3. As suggested by our external auditor a thirty hour add on course in learning the skill and technique of playing the Harmonium is scheduled to start in January 2024.

She has also contributed two articles in 'International journal of creative research thoughts' and 'Rabindra Bharati Journal of Philosophy' respectively. She presented a paper in an International Conference on Natural Products and Human Health.

Ms. Purna Butta was felicitated with Teacher's Award for Excellence 2021 in the category of 'The All Rounder teacher' by Love care foundation on September 5th 2021.

The Department of Human Development & Family received a Certificate of Appreciation from the Love Care Foundation on October 16th, 2022, for contributing 276 thalis and volunteering in the World Food Day campaign at Noida and Kaushambi.

Both the faculty members enriched themselves by participating in several faculty enrichment programmes and organized workshops, trainings, visits, Add on course (designing the curriculum and coordinating), events for student. Outreach and Extension activities are the strength of the HDFE department. The list of webinars, lectures and workshops is truly impressive, the 2 faculty members deserve credit. Not only were these events well organized they also had very large number of participants in each event both from the college and from outside.

The department is engaged in research projects that provide opportunities to students gain experience with conducting research. Project on Early detection of white eye reflex in children (Student research project) strengthens the skills of students to screen eyes of children with a smart phone in location that are accessible to them. New projects on 'Medical Tourism' and 'Implications of Self-Presentation and Identity Formation in the Digital Space' have also been initiated. Long

term projects are extremely beneficial in creating a culture of research and providing large sample data and greater understanding of the area. The passion that Ms. Muralidhar has created in students and the younger faculty member is evident in the interactions.

The faculty also mentors and provides guidance to students of other departments in undertaking Internships. The networking with NGO's and organizations working for women and children has given them an edge in undertaking this very important task.

Part A: Follow-Up Action Planned

In light of the Auditor's recommendations and SWOC analysis, what is the Follow-up Action planned by the department?

A meeting of the Faculty members of the HDFE department was held to discuss, review the suggestions and feedback given by the external auditor during the interaction with the faculty on 26th June, 23 in the college and the auditor's report shared by the principal.

The feedback received from the auditor is being incorporated in planning the future course of action in the forthcoming academic session. As suggested by the auditor the department has planned to strengthen the component of Early Childhood Care & Education. The students are already doing placement in playschools to get hands on experience. We plan to offer more opportunities to the students by giving them exposure to experts from the field of ECCE, giving them in-depth knowledge and equipping them to become Early Childhood Educators. Another important suggestion that the department could continue it's work on wellbeing of young adults, incorporating life skills will be taken ahead in the form of workshops, talks, discussions involving experts from diverse fields.

The auditor also stressed on the need to address issues in the area of parenting & Family wellbeing. The Department plans to collaborate with NGO's working in this field and hold talks/ webinars. In the context of research projects, the auditor appreciated that that, Early Detection & Screening of White Eye Reflex was not limited only to Delhi. The department has already started spreading awareness across the country. We plan to strengthen the reach of this project further as recommended by the auditor.

The department will take steps to enhance alumni interaction with the present batch of students as part of peer mentoring. This practice has been appreciated by the auditor as it also reflects students' progression.

Many suggestions that were made during the interaction are already being implemented / complied with and only need to be worked on keeping in mind the vision of the department.

The feedback and insights shared by the external auditor are extremely relevant and beneficial and will enhance the quality of work done by the department.

D. Vision, mission and future plans of the Department



I think students behind this effort properly understood the meaning of ‘personal is political. I understand that the students in general are inquisitive and are keen to have class discussions. An active student population is one of the most important assets of any department or college. A concerted effort is needed to have a comprehensive record of alumni profile as it is a good measure of the achievements of the efforts the department and the institution put in.

Comments: From my interaction with faculty members and from the information that I gathered from the presentation, I can confidently say that the teachers are well-qualified and experienced. Many teachers find it difficult to devote time for research as the workload for teaching is quite high. Another area where they need greater assistance is in materializing conference participation in India and abroad. NAAC-related activities also consume substantial time of the faculty members. Most faculty members contribute to the department and college work. I was extremely

happy to see the leadership of Political Science faculty in launching college level initiatives such as the Centre for the Study of Disability and Exclusion.

Part A: Follow-Up Action Planned

In light of the Auditor's recommendations and SWOC analysis, what is the Follow-up Action planned by the department?

The department has planned collaborative actions on various fronts.

The Alumni profile is being worked on as suggested by the auditor in order to have a comprehensive list of the students in terms of career progression, higher studies, achievements etc. A special committee for Alumni Association has been established at the department level, consisting of two faculty members: Dr. Md. Zuber Ahmed and Dr. Raju Keshari. The committee will engage with the alumni at various fronts, by organizing talks by the alumni, holding special lectures and also organizing a special meet for interaction. To strengthen the connectivity special WhatsApp group has also been curated, where the students will share their achievements, and progression to higher studies. Further, the department will continue to organize a special paper presentation by the alumni under the banner of SAMVAAD at least once in a year in association with the college level Alumni Committee.

On the faculty research profile, their publications and research collaborations, the department will strive to maintain a balance between the teaching hours and research engagements of faculties. Since we have a larger department after faculty recruitment, the balance will be easier to maintain. The IQAC cell of JDMC is also taking initiatives to offer grants for attending FDPs and also for attending conferences. JDMC Research Centre has been revamped and there will be larger participation and facilitation to engage in faculty research and student-led faculty research. Certain proposals have also been submitted for the same.

In the category of Best Practices, the department was commended for its co-curricular and academic departmental activities. The department has decided to strengthen these initiatives and practices, especially student's magazine SPECULO, the departmental festival Politique, and the social outreach programmes amongst the students and faculty through collaborations with NGOs.

The department aims at extending its podcast section and enriching students' exposure and experiences by engaging with various societal issues.

The department aims to build up the spirit of social outreach amongst the students and faculty members as well through collaborations with NGOs. Donations have been carried out by the department in the recent floods as well.

The department has also decided to hold various workshops related to research methodology, gender issues, environmental concerns, use of ICT and other soft skills. The department has also decided to start an Add-on course on Human Rights. The department is planning to collaborate with the Centre for International Programmes (CIP/ JDMC) to organise academic events, talks, presentations with international institutions of various fields. Dr Debahuti Brahmachari and Mr Dinesh Ahirrao of the department are already working as members in CIP.

The department also plans to enter into a research collaboration with Centre for Global Studies, University of Delhi for the upcoming Rajasthan Assembly Election Survey so that the students can engage in psephology at the ground level and can engage in a practical study of voting behaviour.

The department plans to carry forward the Bystander Intervention Program (BIP) with greater zeal and conduct a series of workshops aimed at gender awareness and sensitization and teaching the strategies of intervention to students.

Part B: Department Feedback on Audit**What was the overall experience of the audit? How has feedback from the auditor contributed to quality enhancement?**

Academic Audit is an imperative step for ensuring persistent development and growth within the department. It is a fruitful exercise to self-analyze and constructively work on the feedback, received through the academic audit process. It results in more engaged and capable actions through a systematic process. The external auditor was patient throughout the process and provided valuable suggestions. He acknowledged and congratulated the department for its various achievements and initiatives over the last session and added suggestions for further improvement. The department has holistically incorporated the suggestions and aims to work for a better outcome in the coming academic session.

The session was held on 23rd June 2023 in the Committee Room of the college from 11 am to 1.00 pm.

Prof. Prasad began by complimenting the department on the impressive academic performance of the students in the academic year.

He also reiterated his deep appreciation for the wide ranging co-curricular and extra-curricular accomplishments of the students and faculty of the department.

Lacuna 1:

Prof. Prasad felt that all faculty members of the department who do not have PhD should start working on their doctoral degrees, as that is not just a professional requirement, it also makes the faculty better teachers.

Action taken – the department has decided to create email and whatsapp groups to share information about openings for PhD enrolment in different universities. Collectively working towards this goal may act as an incentive for the faculty to undertake this task.

The department also plans to organise lecture sessions on the abstract writing process and research methodology etc to help the faculty achieve this goal.

Lacuna 2:

This point is connected to the preceding one. Prof. Prasad felt that the department faculty needs to start publishing more scholarly articles in reputed Scopus-Indexed international journals.

He advised that if each faculty member publishes at least one article in a well-established journal annually; by the end of the next NAAC cycle, the department will have an impressive number of academic articles to its credit.

Action Taken - The department will organise seminars on how to publish articles in academic journals to encourage the faculty achieve this goal.

The faculty could also attend the online sessions that the DU Library organises on this subject to get a better understanding of the process of publishing in academic journals.
