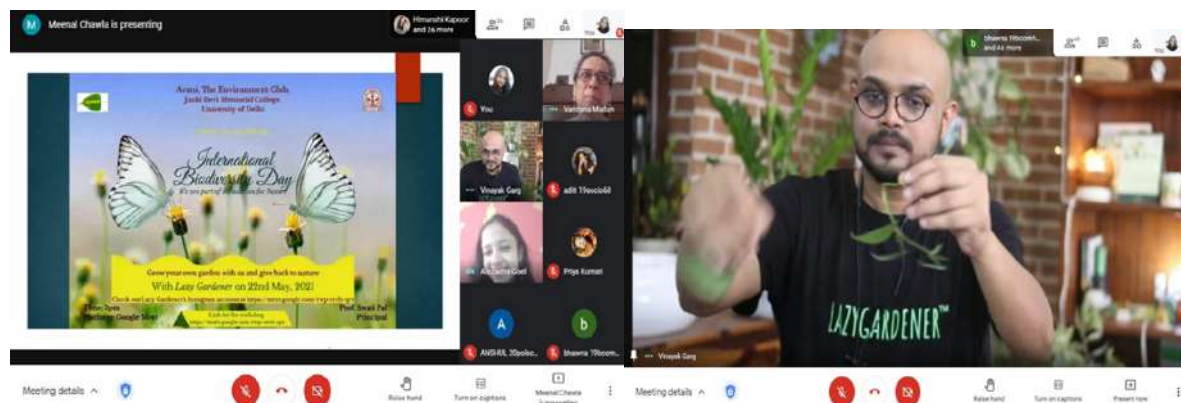


Lazy Gardener Workshop

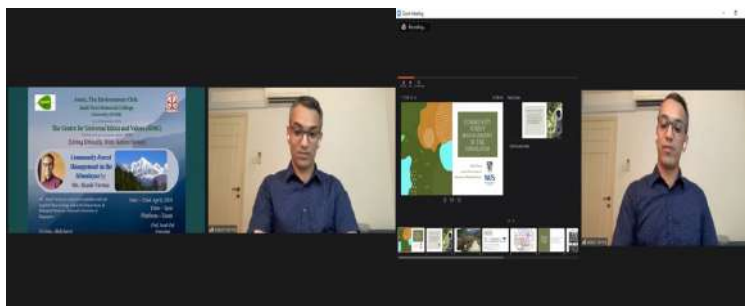
Webinar on Community Forest Management In Himalayas

On April 22, 2021, Avani, the environmental club of Janki Devi Memorial College, University of Delhi organized an international webinar on the topic, Community Forest Management In Himalayas under LENS (Living Ethically with Nature Series) on the occasion of the Earth Day. The speaker was Mr. Akash Verma, a doctoral candidate with the Applied Plant Ecology Lab at the Department of Biological Sciences, National University of Singapore. The event commenced with a poem written by Prof. Swati Pal, Principal, JDMC for the occasion.

Mr. Verma explained the mechanism of forest change in the Himalayas by discussing forest cover and quality. He highlighted the mutual relationship between forests and the local people; described the concept of community forest management by referring to his study on Nepal and Uttarakhand;

and explained the functioning of the systems of joint forest management and vanpanchayats in India and the system of community forest user groups in Nepal. Additionally, he stressed on the importance of community forest management and explained its limitations.

After the culmination of his speech, posters made by the members of Avani on the occasion of the Earth Day were presented. The event ended with the appeal to preserve the earth and contribute towards it in every way possible.

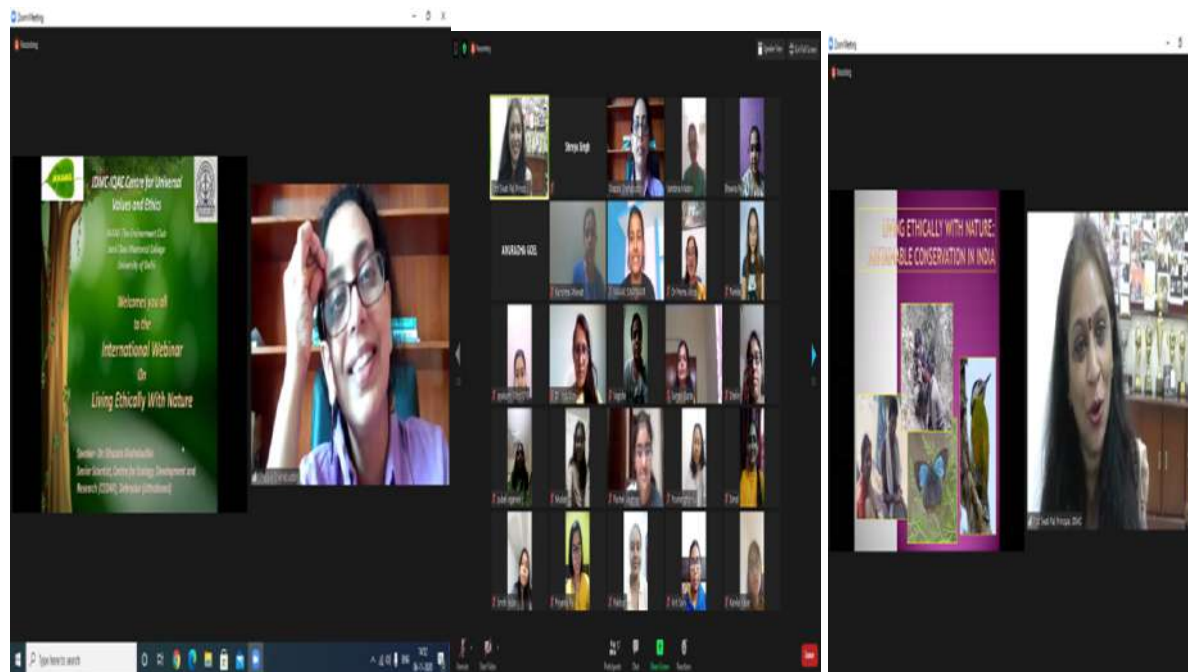
Create From Waste, Symphony 2021-February13, 2021

Webinar on Living Ethically with Nature by Dr. Ghazala Shahabuddin

On November 6, 2020 an international webinar was held from 3pm to 5pm on the topic, Living Ethically with Nature. The webinar was organised by IQAC Centre for Universal Values and Ethics along with Avani, the Environment Club, JDMC, University of Delhi. The speaker for the webinar was Dr. Ghazala Shahabuddin who is a member of Asia Board, Society for Conservation Biology and is a senior scientist, Centre for Ecology, Development and Research, Dehradun. The webinar started with keynote addresses by Prof. Swati Pal, Principal, JDMC and Ms. Vandana Madan, Convenor, Avani, JDMC. This was followed by an insightful session with a power point presentation by Dr. Shahabuddin.

During the webinar, Dr. Shahabuddin focused on the relationship between nature and humanity. In this context, she discussed the ecological disasters that occurred in 2020. She highlighted issues of forest degradation and worldwide decline in insects. She educated the participants about nature based tourism in the Himalayas and also enlightened them regarding disaster management and taking care of nature in the times of COVID-19 by giving examples of her personal experiences and workings of her organisation. Lastly, several questions were asked to Dr. Shahabuddin on how

to be eco-friendly in specific situations, which she addressed in detail. The participants included people from all over the country, India. Dr. Shahabuddin, with her expert views on the topic, made the webinar very informative.

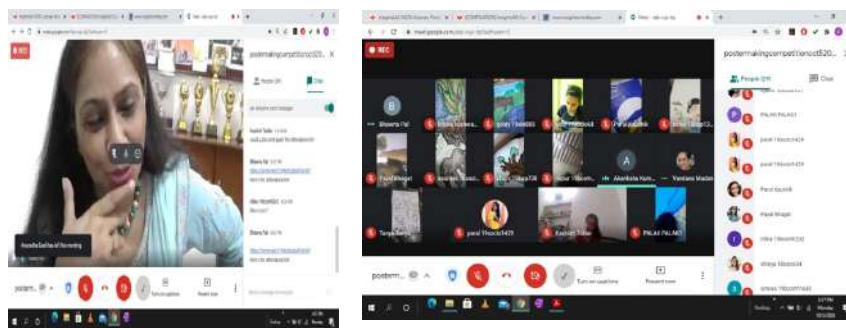

prizes. The other participants were also provided of participation. It was a fun and entertaining event.



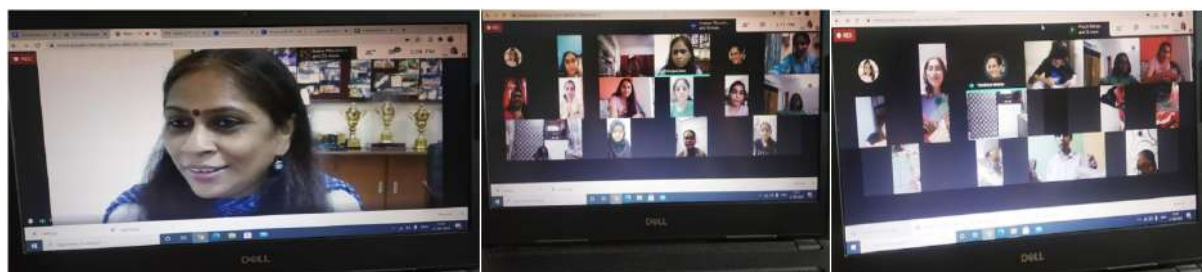

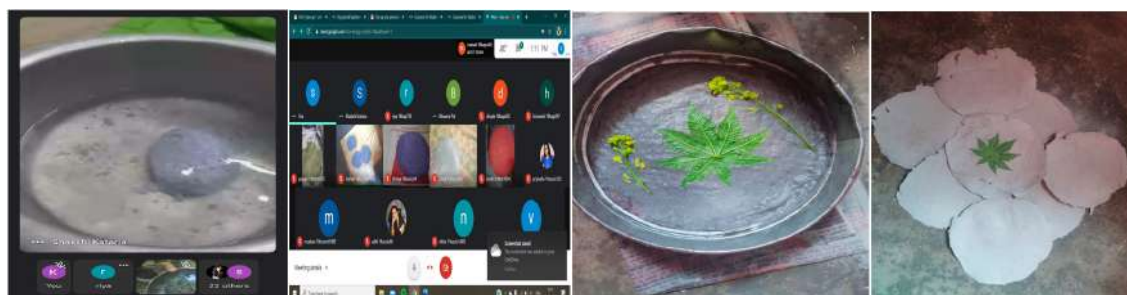
