


THE NORTH EAST STUDENTS' GROUP




Cultural Performances

WEBINAR ON “Hidden emergency; Unearthing the impact of Childhood Trauma”

During this year 2020-2021, the Students of our Society have successfully organized a webinar on the theme "Hidden emergency; Unearthing the impact of Childhood Trauma" by a profound speaker Ms. Roshnila Gurung which was held on 7th November 2020, 4pm, in a zoom meeting. She goes on to talk about the impacts of childhood trauma on a person and how important it is to discuss this very topic. Children who have experienced complex trauma often have difficulty identifying, expressing, and managing emotions, and may have limited language for feeling states, which often internalize and/or externalize stress reactions and as a result may experience significant depression, anxiety, or anger. And how these impacts can be felt across several areas, such as emotional health, physical health, mental health and personal relationships.
