PANEL DISCUSSION

“Know the Northeast: Breaking Myths and Stereotypes”

The Northeast Students' Group (NESG) of Janki Devi Memorial College, University of Delhi had successfully organized a panel discussion on the theme **“Know the Northeast: Breaking myths and stereotypes”** by profound speakers **Dr Achan Mungleng**, **Dr Binu Sundas** and **Dr Kaushtubh Deka**, moderated by **Dr Korsi Dorene Kharshiing**, on 26 February, 2022 at 10 a.m. with the objective to raise awareness regarding the stereotypes and myths prevailing against Northeast people and breaking these chains of stereotypes in order to develop a better understanding of the region. The session was conducted virtually on zoom platform and attended by 69 students.

Dr Achan Mungleng reiterated the point that the Northeast India have been living in an egalitarian society and there are lots of things that can be learned from our cultures and society such as status of women in Northeast society, absence of caste system, practice of taking collective decisions, representing essence of our cultures and celebrating them through our attires and ornaments. *Dr Binu Sundas* emphasized on the portrayal of tribal communities during colonisation as one of the major causes for such prevailing myths and stereotypes. He talked about the representation of Northeast India in various fields in order to have a better understanding of us.

Dr Kaushtubh Deka highlighted the three major lenses through which the Northeast India is viewed. These are security, cultural obscurity and development. He said before breaking these chains of stereotypes and myths we must know about the Northeast India and its significance. On this note, he had delivered an insightful knowledge of Northeast India. He also spoke about the duality in representation of the region.

In the end the entire panel emphasised that young generation, need to know the region and eradicate the differences among us, which is crucial breaking these stereotypes and myths. If the larger goal is to understand the challenges of the North East, it requires a strong national narrative which reconciles its many identities and adds to the peace process. The session was concluded with a Q/A session and vote of thanks by the Convenor.






SKIT VIDEO - AZADI KA AMRIT MAHOTSAV

ESSAY COMPETITION



the society, was a celebration to reminisce those joyous moments of the years spent together with friends and teachers.




PANORAMA 2020-2021
