74 Volunteers from other colleges participated in the event to showcase diverse talents, providing a platform for participants to display their skills, fostering creativity, and enthusiasm.



VOTING DEMO WORKSHOP





OBJECTIVE- To promote the importance of trees to protect nature for a better future.


