

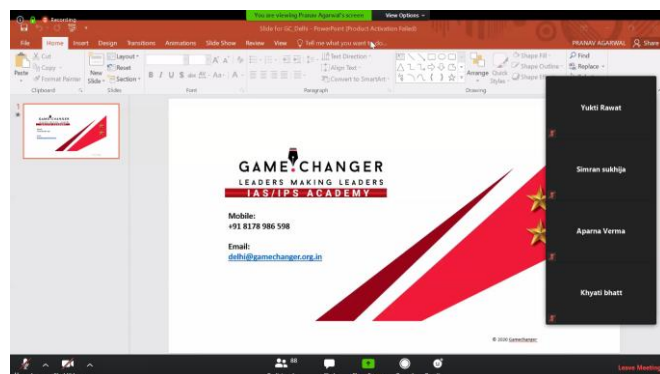
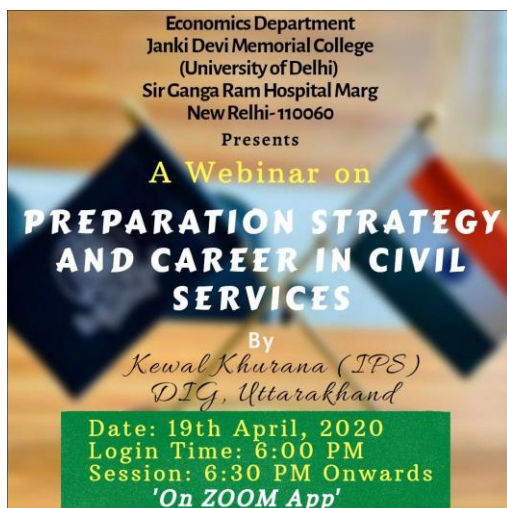
Initiatives taken by Economics Department during Covid19 Lockdown

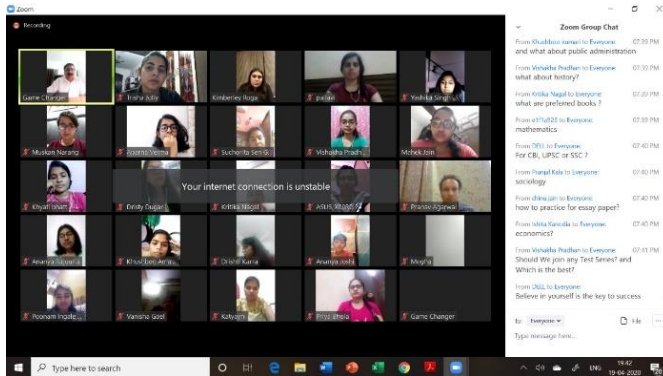
The Economics Department has tried its best to maintain continuity in not just teaching and learning but also co-curricular and extra-curricular activities even during the Lockdown period.

REALITY OF INDIAN HEALTH INFRASTRUCTURE
