
A total of 8 professors and scholars participated in the session and presented their research paper out of which 5 participants presented offline and 3 in an online mode.



The valedictory session on the topic - Devolution, Development and Dignity commenced at 4:15pm with Dr.Bijoyata Yonzon welcoming the Chair and the Speaker. She then introduced the chair, Prof. Surender Kumar(Delhi School of Economics, University of Delhi, New Delhi). Following this, Deepti ma'am felicitated the esteemed guests. Prof. Surender Kumar then introduced the speaker, Mr.Amarjeet Sinha, IAS (Retd.) (Former Advisor to the Prime Minister of India, and Former Secretary, Department of Rural Development, Government of India) who addressed various challenges related to social inclusion in India.

The session delved into pressing issues such as wages of dignity, the low female labour force participation rate (LFPR), and learning outcomes in schools, which impact employability. Health care indicators and child nutrition were also highlighted as key concerns. A comparative analysis was presented on the enrollment of girls in schools across countries like Japan, Korea, China, India, and Bangladesh, emphasizing the importance of education in fostering gender parity.

The speaker discussed factors contributing to poverty reduction in southern Indian states, notably the increased participation of adolescent girls in higher secondary and higher education. This has led to reduced fertility rates, improvements in healthcare services, and livelihood diversification through skill development. Additionally, the establishment of bank linkages for self-help groups (SHGs) providing loans of up to Rs. 20 lakh without collateral was noted as a critical initiative.

The discussion also explored data on multidimensional poverty and highlighted the strong correlation between decentralization, increased private investment, and human development, all of which contribute to poverty reduction. The issue of underemployment was emphasized as a more accurate measure of the current socio-economic situation.

The session concluded at around 5:30pm with the chair Mr. Surender Kumar summarizing the speaker's key points, providing his own unique examples to underscore the importance of reforms, including the need for elections at the grassroots level.

The two-day conference concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by Mr. Abhinub Kumar, Assistant Professor, Janki Devi Memorial College. He expressed gratitude to all the participants, student volunteers, faculty members, and esteemed guests for their invaluable contributions in making the session a success.






