# Message






(1935-2017) श्रीमती स्नेहमयी चौधरी को श्रद्धांजिल

# Founder of the College



#### Shri Brij Krishan Chandiwala (1900-1986)


Shri Brij Krishan Chandiwala, the founder of Janki Devi Memorial College was born in 1900 in a reputed family. As the third son of a flourishing silver merchant's family, there were no domestic pressures on him to join the family business. After the early demise of his wife, he joined the freedom movement led by Gandhiji. His mother's entreaties to remarry fell on deaf ears. Brij Krishanji became a true disciple of Gandhiji. He went to jail several times during the freedom movement. When Gandhiji started the agitation against the Salt Law, Brij Krishanji took an oath to give up salt and sugar for life. He was forced to break this vow in the last days of his life on health grounds.

At Gandhiji's behest, he had a prayer temple built in a Harijan Colony. He started the Delhi chapter of the Bharat Sewak Samaj, an organization for the upliftment of the downtrodden.

In 1959, Shri VKRV Rao, the then Vice-Chancellor of Delhi University appealed to the wealthy philanthropists of the city to come forward to open girls colleges in Delhi. It was then, that Brij Krishanji who had no children, donated all his inherited wealth to the family trust Shri Banarsidas Chandiwala Sewa Smarak Society which in turn funded the establishment of Janki Devi Memorial College in memory of his late mother Smt. Janki Devi. Till his very end, this great visionary remained our mentor and guide.

Today Brij Krishanji is remembered for his social service and closeness to Gandhiji. When Nathuram Godse fired that fatal shot, Bapu fell backward into the arms of Brij Krishanji who was sitting right behind him.





## **The College**

Janki Devi Memorial College was founded in 1959 by the famous Gandhian Shri Brij Krishan Chandiwala in memory of his mother Smt. Janki Devi, who in that day and age cherished the value of female education. Since then it has been our endeavor to provide quality education to young women and empower them to become economically self reliant as well as contribute meaningfully to society.

The college offers education in liberal arts, social sciences, Mathematics and Commerce. We are ranked third in academic excellence at the University of Delhi in the field of Commerce. The college moves beyond the curriculum and offers short term add-oncourses. To our earlier add-on course - *Peace and Conflict Resolution* (initiated in 2011), we have added and successfully completed courses on *Safe Cities and Inclusiveness* (Sociology Department), *Travel and Tourism* (History Department) and *Capital Market Professional* (Economics Department). It is a matter of great pride for the college to have signed its first academic MOU with the University of Münster under the Bystander Intervention Programme, an initiative of the Sociology Department. In addition, the Janki Devi Vocational Centre offers full and part time courses such as Home Management, Cookery, Textile, Fashion Designing and Commercial Art.

The college prides itself in providing an enabling environment to its students that includes union room, a spacious common room, a clean and an equipped medical room. The sanitary napkin wending machine, photo stating facilities, comfortable staff room, individual departmental rooms, seminar hall, committee room, office block, computer labs, the sports infrastructure, the large and modern cafeteria and the open air auditorium, a research room for teachers, are some of the facilities that create a nurturing environment for the pursuit of academic and extra-curricular interests. The College continually endeavors to improve existing infrastructural facilities and recently installed multimedia facilities in a few classrooms. With almost one lakh books and around 82 journals, JDMC prides itself in having a fully automated and well stocked library, which is also a resource centre for Women's Studies. We are one of the few colleges to hold a Library Festival marked by various competitive events related to books and also talks by luminaries.

Our college also has the distinction of being one of the few to have a disabled friendly environment, with ramps, toilets and lift that cater to specific needs as well as an assistance system for the visually challenged students' and faculty. We have Braille signage as well as tactiles present all along the college and the former was sponsored by the Alumnae Association.

We are immensely proud to announce the completion of the hostel building. Named Krishna Hostel, it'll house more than a hundred students and will be a safe and nurturing place for outstation students.

Our founder, Bhaiji, built this college with a vision of making education both empowering and inclusive. In pursuit of that vision, JDMC has imitated a project on *Women Entrepreneurship and Support Training (WEST)* undertaken by the college with the support of The Netherlands Embassy and the ECORYS, knowledge partner of the Netherlands government, in 2014. In keeping with this spirit, the Entrepreneurship Cell or Impreneurs, has been making a concerted effort to promote entrepreneurship by encouraging start-up plans and creating an atmosphere that stimulates thinking in this sphere.

The Career and Counseling Cell – our "Placement cell" – has always been unflaggingly committed to providing placements and internships to JDMC students, relentlessly pursuing the job market for prospective jobs. This academic session, they held an online job and internship Fair in collaboration with *Triedge*, the aim being to create a wider network of options and jobs for our students, making their educational trajectories more secure and predictable.

This academic session saw TED talks being organized by students of the college where eleven renowned and accomplished speakers motivated the audience to think about creative and sustainable livelihoods. Besides all these ventures, the college has also signed various MOUs with different organizations, with the aim to sensitize students and faculty about significant and varied issues that include breast cancer, industry academia interface and so on.

The Women's Development Centre, National Cadet Corps, National Service Scheme and the Gandhi Study Circle provide an opportunity to our students to engage with social issues like legal literacy, women's health and empowerment and adult education. The College

recognizes the need for students to make informed choices and to be aware of all that happens in the larger world. The International and national Seminars, talks on contemporary issues held by practically all departments through the academic session, provide the right kind of intellectual impetus to students to analyze and evaluate critically.

Academic rigor is maintained in college through tutorials, preceptorials and presentations under the CBCS which are taken very seriously along with the tutorward/contact/counselling programmes which help keep a finger on the pulse of the students. The College is genuinely concerned about students who face academic challenges. We have been holding regular remedial classes every semester so that students with academic problems can benefit from them. Economically challenged students too benefit greatly through measures taken by the Equal Opportunities Cell, scholarships and free meals for the students.

The college is concerned about not just the intellectual and academic growth of its students but also the mental health of all who are a part of the JDMC family. So, the academic session has seen the college making more efforts to provide regular counselling services through a part time counsellor, SaniaBedi, as well as dedicated monthly workshops by *Zyego*. Zyego hopes to launch a mobile app for counseling so that students can access counselling services at any point of time from trained psychologists and therapists.

The college seeks to strike a fine balance between the academic and co-curricular. Besides securing university positions in different disciplines every year, we have excelled in sporting activities and competitions as well. The Physical Education Department has outdone itself this session, bagging firsts at inter college Hockey and Soccer and second at Yoga Championships. JDMC Physical Education department is extremely active and provides specialized training in a variety of sporting activities.

The NCC too has proved its mettle by bringing home many laurels in a variety of activities that include drill, tug of war, mountain climbing and cultural events. They are truly an inspiring force. The Annual Inter-college Festival 'Symphony', together with the twenty eight clubs and societies -Shakespeare Society: Bardolators, Dance Societies (both Indian Classical and Western), Debating, Street theatre Society, Music (Indian and Western), Film, Photography, Garden, Creative Writing, Finance and Investment, Entrepreneurship and Environment Clubs, to name a few – offer a wide forum for the expression of the creativity and talents of the students. In addition, each department has its own association that organizes interesting events, both academic as well as creative, all through the academic session.


JDMC believes that the curriculum and the text book is not the only way to gain knowledge or to progress. Departments such as HDFE have been exemplary in the way that they have worked tirelessly to engage with diverse and explored issues such as retinoblastoma, a form of eye cancer. They have done stellar work to promote sensitization about the same. The English Department too has worked hard to bring awareness and promote the understanding of Breast Cancer. The initiation of the Eco Zone by the Environment Club Avani has made a significant impact upon environmental studies within college. Students of JDMC along with their enthusiastic teacher-mentors, have been very proactive in engaging with various programmes proposed by the MHRD or the University. This academic session, students from the Classical dance society as well as the North East Group were invited to perform at the various University events.

Our college gardens never fail to fetch admiring glances from visitors. It is worth mentioning at this point, that ours was the first college to install a rain water harvesting system which has been rated as one of the best in Delhi by the Centre for Science and Environment and has won the Chief Ministers prize for Institutional Rain Water Harvesting. In keeping with our mission of recognizing our responsibility towards the environment, the college has an active environment programme which covers rain water harvesting, recycling, composting, solar lighting, CFL conversion, and campaigning for a tobacco free zone. We have installed a solar power grid of 88 KW in collaboration with Azure Solar Power Ltd. We have also completed our tree audit.

At Janki Devi Memorial College, we provide students every opportunity to express themselves. The annual College Magazine, Janki, is a vibrant space for students to express their perspectives on a wide range of issues through varying literary styles in English, Hindi and Sanskrit. There are also Departmental Magazines such as *Ecogene*which is run by the Economics Department and it is delightful to see another department magazine, *Speculo*, launched by the Political Science Department this session.

The college completed its first cycle of accreditation this year with a B++ (2.76) grade. The entire process, from preparing the SSR to gearing up for the Peer team visit, was a learning one. The feedback given to us, by the peer team as well as by the report, has proved beyond doubt that JDMC has much to be proud of. In the years to come, the college hopes to improve its grade and strive towards a high rank. For this, all stakeholders: Management, Governing body, staff and students(current and retired), alumnae association, parents and employers of our students need to collectively focus on the best practices that can make JDMC touch greater heights and become a premier institution.

### **Our Principal**

Dr. Swati Pal has been a member of the Department of English, Janki Devi Memorial College, University of Delhi since the past twenty two years. She has been a Charles Wallace Scholar (1997 and 2008) as well as the John McGrath Theatre Studies Scholar (2005) at Edinburgh University. She was the first Asian to receive the John McGrath award. She was also selected for and participated in a Leadership Programme organised by the British Council, India called Leadership Breakthroughs held in Dubai in March 2012.


Dr. Pal has published widely and is the author of the book, Look Back at Anger: Agit Prop Theatre in Britain from the Sixties to the Nineties and a co-author of the books A Handbook of Academic Writing and Composition and Creative Writing: A Beginner's Manual. She has edited a volume of essays on Modern European Drama: From Ibsen to Beckett as also Indo-Australian Connections: Retrospect and Prospects. She has translated a number of Premchand's stories into English and has written essays on a variety of subjects. She has also written a number of book reviews and several of her newspaper articles articulate her views on education and her research in drama. She is a member of the Executive Body of the Indian Association for the Study of Australia (IASA) and Indian Association for Commonwealth Literature and Language Studies (IACLALS). She is also Editor of the IACLALS Journal.

Dr. Pal has presented a number of papers at both national and international conferences including a public lecture at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival on the life and works of John McGrath. She is a Resource person for many workshops on Performance Studies, Creative Writing etc.

In the last two and a half academic sessions, Dr. Pal has endeavored to create a workplace that offers facilities for quality teaching and learning as well as out -of the- classroom education. She believes that an educational institution must strive to better itself, not just in academics but in the creation of informed citizens who contribute meaningfully to society. Hence, she has encouraged an atmosphere of discussion and healthy debate about all contemporary issues, environment friendly practices, a spirit of service, and has provided a platform to both, students as well as staff to voice their views and hone their skills. She has also tried to enhance infra structural facilities so that there is a comfortable atmosphere, conducive to the teaching learning process. In the last academic year, Dr. Pal was felicitated by the Women's Agency for Generating Employment (WAGE) for her outstanding contribution in the area of educational planning and administration as well as gender development. This year she has been awarded with Exceptional Women of Excellence in Academia 2017 by All Ladies League and Women Economic Forum.

Dr. Pal believes that it is the collective responsibility of all stakeholders to take the College to new levels of success. She is convinced that uncompromising commitment to the college is essential for the college to scale great heights. A transparent system, true self-assessment and the will and determination to strive against all odds are the bedrock on which the College must be built.

The Academic Session 2017-18, has been a landmark one. Much has been achieved and I can only give a bird's eye view of our accomplishments over the last year. I shall highlight some outstanding achievements of the institution which prove that we every have reason to be proud and happy.

Janki Memorial College completed the process of accreditation by the NAAC and was awarded a B++ grade (2.76) on 12<sup>th</sup> September, 2017. This is our first cycle of the Accreditation Process, achieved in the fairest and most transparent manner. We have learnt a lot and I am sure that the knowledge gained will make us all strive to achieve higher goals. I once again thank all faculty members, in particular, Dr. Jitender Gill the NAAC Coordinator, non-teaching staff and students for their cooperation in helping facilitating the accreditation process. I congratulate us all for this achievement.

We have fared well in academics. Our results have been creditable in the University across subjects. To mention a few details:

- And in first year (CBCS) B.Sc (Hons.) Mathematics, B.A. (Hons.) Political Science and B.A. (Hons.) Sociology secured 100% result. B.Com (Hons.), B.Com and B.A. Programme secured more than 98% pass results.

Limited (a wholly owned subsidiary of National Stock Exchange (NSE) of India Ltd). The 4<sup>th</sup> annual issue of the departmental magazine ECOGENE was released in April 2017 by the Department. It has also launched a blog 'Ecognizance: Economics in Panorama' in February, 2018 to broaden our perspectives in political economy and world affairs as well.

The department organized a peace walk on "Awareness against Retinoblastoma" on the occasion of World Cancer Day in collaboration with Centre for Sight and Womenite. More than 200 people including teachers and students headed by a 19 year old survivor participated in the walk.
- The History Department organized its first History Festival, "TATHASTU" focusing on academics and culture. It was inaugurated by Mr. Manish Sisodia, Deputy Chief Minister of Delhi. Events like Panel Discussion on "Imaging Gender through the Matrix of Power, Love and Hate", Quiz, Poster-Making, Photography, What-If, Treasure-Hunt and Dance were organized during the fest. Each of the events saw immense participation from many different colleges across Delhi and NCR and by our own students. - The Political Science Department organized its Annual Inter-College Political Science festival POLITIQUE'18 on the theme 'Uniform Civil Code and the Personal Laws of Minorities'. Competitions such as namely 'Argumentative India' (Debate Competition), 'Chanakya' (Quiz Competition), Poetry, 'Parikalpana' (Logo Making Competition) and Lip Synching Battle were organized during the event. All the competitions received tremendous response from the colleges all over the University of Delhi. The department is coming out with its first ever Political Science Student Magazine entitled "Speculo".
- **The Sanskrit Department** in collaboration with Delhi Sanskrit Academy organized Sanskrit Essay Writing Competition. The Department also organized a lecture on "Sanskrit and World Literature, Sanskrit Recitation and Quiz Competition.
- The students of **Sociology Department** participated in the "One Billion Rising" at the Central Park, Connaught Place to show their solidarity against the exploitation of women and end sexual violence. The Sociology Department organized its Annual Festival "Ethos" on the theme "Youth and Freedom". A variety of inter-departmental activities and competitions were organized during the fest. The department signed an MoU with the University of Münster, Germany under the Add-on Course Safe Cities and Inclusiveness. The Department conducted a four day Bystander Intervention Programme, "Rise" in collaboration with Münster University to sensitize and create awareness among the students regarding the need to provide assistance to victims of gender and sexual violence.

The College Library, which is fully automated and well stocked with about 1 lakh books and subscriptions to about 72 national and international journals, caters to the needs of all the courses offered by the college. The Annual Library Festival was organized on March 22<sup>nd</sup> this year and organized various competitions like Book Hunt, Book Quiz, Debate etc. and a special prize was given to a student for "maximum use of the library".

The needs of visually challenged users are not ignored and computer facilities are provided to the visually impaired students and teachers. The library has installed a screen reading software NVDA and Plex talks Angel Pocket Recorders are issued to visually challenged users. We also arranged Braille books and talking books. Computer training is also provided to our visually challenged students/teachers.

JDMC has initiated tie-ups with many institutions to promote academic and non-academic linkages and collaborations this academic session. The details are as follows:

- **2.** ALS Wellness Network Pvt. Ltd. (ALS)- The Company with a brand name 'ZYEGO' is engaged in the business of providing counseling, wellness and emotional support services to cater to the needs of students, faculty and non-teaching staff.
- 3. **ATS InfoTech Pvt. Ltd.-** A Microsoft-AEP (Authorized Education Partner)- The company would be offering International Certifications to the interested students from different vendors at academic discounted price and those who volunteer for paying exam fee would be getting bundled training fee free of cost mapped to the certifications. Free of charge, FDP once a year for the faculty members will also be provided.
- 4. Breakthrough Trust- an international human rights organization which promotes values of equality, justice, and dignity around the world- will be moderating the 'Media and Technology' module of an add on course offered by the Sociology Department, JDMC. The title of the course is 'Safe City and Inclusiveness' for the academic year 2017 -2018. As part of the engagement, Breakthrough will be building the capacity of the students in understanding the intersection between media, technology and gender. It will also be conducting skill building training on social and digital media.
- 5. Bliss Foundation- The aim of this alliance between JDMC and Bliss Foundation is to sensitize faculty and students at JDMC and to train them in Breast Self Examination (BSE). At a later stage, other schools/ colleges in the vicinity will also be made aware about the causes and implications of Breast Cancer. It will also familiarize them with signs, symptoms and procedures of early detection. This will be done through workshops, surveys, questionnaires and other modalities to arrive at better practices regarding disease control through social awareness.
- ICT Academy- is an initiative of the Government of India in collaboration with the State Governments and Industries. It endeavors to train the higher education teachers and students thereby developing the next generation teachers and industry ready students.

With training of teachers and students as the primary objective, ICT Academy will be working through a seven pillar program in the following areas:

- Faculty Development
- Student Skill Development
- Entrepreneurship Development
- Youth Empowerment
- Research and Publications
- Digital Empowerment
- Industry-Institute Interaction

Counselling is an integral part of addressing the problems and issues faced by people. As an institution, it is imperative that we take care of the emotional well-being of all within college. In pursuance of this goal, the College has set up a Counselling Committee and took following initiatives to strengthen counselling system in the College

- Signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with ALS Wellness Network Pvt Ltd., with the brand name "Zyego", for online counselling, and for organizing workshops for students, faculty members and administrative staff.
- In order to provide face to face counselling services to our students, JDMC also appointed Ms. Saniya Bedi, (Counselling Psychologist, University of Delhi) for providing counseling on bi-weekly basis. Students raised issues like stress management, family problems, body image issues, self-confidence, etc.

The college appears to have received a complete facelift. In this academic session, apart from major external repair works, re-plastering and painting of the college building have been done. The roads have been re-surfaced, Braille signage and tactiles have been added within the building as well as outside. An emergency entry/exit has also been created at the main entrance. The signage system throughout the college has been overhauled. The Basket Ball Court has been reconstructed and it promises to provide the best court facility to a future Basketball team of the college.

The construction work of the Hostel named "Krishna" is now completed and we are in the process of framing rules for the same.

Apart from infrastructural changes the college has strengthened its administration by procuring automation software that takes care of Admission, Time Table, Monthly Attendance, Internal Assessment, Stock Management, Maintenance of Leave Record, Payroll and Financial Accounting etc. Furthermore, we have also facilitated the method of selection of Generic Elective and Skill Enhancement Papers by providing an option form portal to ensure that classes for the same can be held in a timely manner. In the years to come these measures will certainly improve the quality of administration and reduce the burden upon both teaching and non-teaching staff.

The college gardens are the pride of JDMC. They are a treasure trove of several species of flora that include, trees, flowers, palms, shrubs, cactii, grass and several varties of herbs. Our gardens include main (front) garden, herbal garden, rose garden, an exclusive display of rockery and a green cliff at the entrance with the name of the college embossed on it. A new herbal garden, with tiled pathways, has been created which houses more than 150 varieties of herbs.

Apart from the regular courses taught at JDMC, there is a recognition that there are many who are unable to attend regular college. The Non Collegiate Women Education Board (NCWEB) facilitates the education of such students and at JDMC, approximately 2000 students are provided quality education through the NCWEB. In addition to this, the college

has also become a centre for School of Open Learning, University of Delhi from this academic session for conducting classes under Personal Contact Programme. The first session was successfully completed on 25<sup>th</sup> March, 2018.

Remedial classes have been offered in both semesters to the regular students of JDMC who may have faced some difficulty in a paper or missed many classes due to unavoidable reasons.

At JDMC we recognize the importance of developing skills and the need for vocational education. Playing a significant role in enabling girls to develop such skills is the Janki Devi Vocational Centre where courses like fashion and interior designing, animation, graphic and web designing, etc. enable the students to lead independent lives and become economically empowered.

This report, as I said at the outset is only an outline of all that the college has worked towards and achieved in this academic session. The theme for the year had been, 'Act, Act in the Living Present' and undoubtedly, it has been an action packed calendar year. While a lot has been achieved, a lot remains to be done. I am confident that with our collective efforts, we will soar to greater heights in the years to come.

I seek the guidance of our highly supportive Governing Body and members of the Trust to help us realize our goals.

I would like to conclude with a special word of thanks to the members of the Annual Report Committee: Dr. Rajshree Chandra, Dr. Saumya Gupta, Ms. Deepti Sethi, Ms. Sakshi Bansal, Ms. Tannu Sharma, Mr. Vikas Jorwal and Mr. Kush Kumar Gayasen, the Prize Distribution Committee, the Staff Advisors and also the Administrative Staff who helped me to access information for this report, I thank you all.

The B.A. (Hons.) Sociology III year were taken for a **field trip** from 23<sup>rd</sup>-25<sup>th</sup> February, 2018 to Dehradun to visit the NGO-*Kaya*. The trip familiarized students with issues related to rural development, forestry, agriculture and diary.

The students participated in the "One Billion Rising" on 11<sup>th</sup> February, 2018 at the Central Park, Connaught Place to show their solidarity against the exploitation of women and end sexual violence.

A four day **Bystander Intervention Programme**, "Rise" was conducted in collaboration with Münster University starting from 7<sup>th</sup> February, 2018 onwards to sensitize and create awareness among the students regarding the need to provide assistance to victims of gender and sexual violence.

The **Annual Departmental Fest**, *"Ethos"* was held on 2<sup>nd</sup> February, 2018. The highlight was a Panel discussion on the theme *"Youth and Freedom"* chaired by Prof. Bimol Akoijam, CSSS, JNU; Shri Ajay Govind, Filmmaker and Ms. Lotty Alaric, Film and Documentary Critic. Varied inter-department competitions and activities were organized for the students.

**The Department signed an MOU with the University of Münster, Germany** on 31<sup>st</sup> January, 2018 under the Add-on course on *Safe Cities and Inclusiveness*. Such a course is being held in the University of Delhi for the first time.

A **session on stress management**, *"Growing Anxieties among College Students"* was held on 17<sup>th</sup> January, 2018. Ms. Charnita Arora, from Perfect Life Spot interacted with the students on

issues related to emotional well-being, motivation and educational skills, while focusing on different dimensions of stress in youth.

A **forum for students**, **"SOCH"** was inaugurated on 15<sup>th</sup> November, 2017. The forum endeavors to strengthen intra-department unity and team spirit, alongside honing academic and creative skills of the students. Under its aegis a series of activities were organized, which led to a lively engagement between students and the faculty.

An **interactive session** with Mrs. Asha Singh (mother of Nirbhaya) was organized for students on 8<sup>th</sup> November, 2017. She spoke regarding her experiences of fighting against the violence meted out to her daughter and emphasized upon the importance of raising voice against injustice and harassment.

Kamla Bhasin, an eminent feminist conducted a **session** for students on 11<sup>th</sup> October, 2017. She focused on the feminist ideas, patriarchal power relations and the inter-sectionality between gender, caste and race.

Khadija Faruqui, an eminent lawyer gave a **talk on** *"Triple Talaq"* on 9<sup>th</sup> September, 2017 making students aware that it is unconstitutional and that a personal law can be challenged in the supreme court if it violates fundamental rights.

**A Film Festival** was organized on 17<sup>th</sup> August, 2017. "*The Color Purple*" and "*The India Untouched: Stories of People Apart*" were screened and their sociological relevance discussed.

The Department of Sociology in collaboration with the Department of Political Science organized **Ambedkar and Democracy Lecture series**, *"Universal Identity of Ambedkar"* by Prof. Gopal Guru, on 12<sup>th</sup> April, 2017. Professor Gopal Guru highlighted Dr. B.R. Ambedkar's ideas and perspective.

The students of the III year were taken for an **excursion** on 15<sup>th</sup> March, 2017 around Delhi through the Hop-on Hop-off Bus Service. The trip took the students through the romanticism of erstwhile rulers of Delhi over the last 5000 years and enabled them to focus on built-up space and town planning as socio-historical legacy.

Shri Dheeraj Sarthak, a **documentary filmmaker conducted a workshop** for the B.A.(Hons.) Sociology II year on 13<sup>th</sup> March, 2017 on the fundamental tools of filmmaking. The students were also shown clips from the making of various films throwing light on techniques involved in filmmaking.

#### Add-On course

The Department began a 100 hour **Add-On course** on "Safe Cities and Inclusiveness" on 12<sup>th</sup> August, 2017. The Course is divided into 5 modules on subjects like Women and Children, Health and Environment, Urban Planning and Infrastructure, Media and Technology, Aged and Differently-abled. Various organizations such as Breakthrough, Delhi Commission for Women (DCW), Jagori, Institute for Transportation and Development Policy (ITDP), National

Institute of Urban Affairs (NIUA) and TARU are in collaboration. The programme is geared towards organizing expert lectures, workshops and field-visits to educate students on issues related to safety in a city. Some of the highlights are:

**Talks and workshops** conducted by experts like Ms. Geeta from Jagori; Ms. Sonal Shah from Delhi Commission; Dr. Varun Kakde from TARU and Mr. Abhijeet Sarkar from ITDP etc. on varied concerns that contribute to making a city safe.

The programme adopts beyond-a-classroom approach. **A field-visit to DCW** was organized on 29<sup>th</sup> September, 2017 to make students observe the working of the organization. Also, students were regularly engaged in conducting Safety-Audits, with the help of organizations like Safetipin, DCW and Jagori. These included field survey or mapping of streets of the specific areas of the city of Delhi like Lodi Garden, Balmiki colony behind Khan market, in and around the JDMC college to examine how safe and secure they are for women. Students also conducted a Safety Audit with ITDP to examine design and maintenance of footpaths outside college.

The programme offers **internship opportunities** to students in various collaborating organizations. Many students have worked as interns with 181 Helpline, DCW providing telecounseling and support to the victims of sexual abuse and violence. Some took internship at Chintan and worked in various capacities like with the STM (Scavengers to Managers) team, outreach program trying to seek agencies that would collaborate to recycle waste to make Delhi environment healthy and No Child in Trash (NCIT) programme entailing designing of curriculum for the children of rag-pickers. The students also worked with ITDP as interns from the first week of March.

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
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
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



Department of Commerce Result: B.Com (Hons.), 2016-17 Division Obtained by the Students (%)





# The College Library

The College Library is the hub of academic activities of the College. We have a well-equipped and well stocked library with about one lakh books and subscriptions to 72 national and international journals catering to disciplinary and research requirements. The library has an air-conditioned reading hall and stack room.

Our library is **fully computerized** using the **Libsys Software** (an integrated Library management system), where all the processes are performed through Libsys. The database of books and journals available is updated on a day-to-day basis and several terminals are provided for students and teachers to search online documents. Internet access is also provided to the users.

We are also sensitive to the needs of our visually challenged users. To provide them equal access, the library has installed a **screen reading software NVDA and Plextalks Angel Pocket Recorders** are issued to visually challenged users. We also arrange Braille books and talking books. Computer training is also provided to our visually challenged students/ teachers.

The Library also serves as a **training centre for students enrolled in C.L.S.** (Certificate in Library Science) in Janki Devi Vocational College. The Library also has a Women Studies resource centre.

The College Library organized an **orientation programme** for the freshers and apprised them about the library rules, available reading materials, services offered by the library and the library staff.

Every year, we organize the **Library Festival**. It motivates the readers for better use of library services. During our "LibFest" we organize various competitions like Book Hunt, Book Quiz,

Debate etc. and a special prize is given to a student for the "maximum use of the library". The booksellers and publishers are also invited to display their books. It is scheduled for March 23<sup>rd</sup> this year.

# AAMDANI-The Finance and Investment Cell

**AAMDANI**, The Finance and Investment Cell of the College organized **a month-long Paper Presentation competition** for its members starting from 31<sup>st</sup> January up till 28<sup>th</sup> February, 2018. Each member prepared and presented a topic from contemporary financial issues every day to enlighten the other members and expand their horizons regarding today's financial world. This helped members develop their confidence, update knowledge and polish their presentation skills, thereby contributing to their holistic development.

**A Seminar on 'Derivative and International Markets'** was organized on 13<sup>th</sup> October, 2017. The seminar was chaired by Mr. Kunal from "The Financial Corridor", a Financial-Training Institute that helped the students develop a clear understanding of the basic concepts and trading of derivatives, particularly in Indian markets. The seminar was accompanied by a virtual live trading session in the derivative and foreign exchange markets. The seminar enhanced students' knowledge on foreign exchange market application (including forex trading mechanism, domestic vs. international currency, spread, pair currency and data impact) and derivative trading skills (including NSE real market application).

The Society collaborated with the BSE Institute Ltd. to organize **a mock stock event** (virtual stock trading) developed by both the parties. This was held on 20<sup>th</sup> September, 2017 as 'MOCKSTATION: The BSE Mock Stock', in which 110 teams and more than 200 individuals participated. A virtual stock trading platform was created wherein participant teams traded through public outcry mechanism and the market was partially driven by real market prices and partially by demand and supply of stocks being traded on the virtual platform. Top 5 teams were acknowledged with cash prizes amounting to 15,000 and scholarships.

It enables students to showcase their singing, acting and writing talent around socially relevant and we **performed "Maila Kuchaila"** on the occasion of college's founder's day celebrated on 1<sup>st</sup> August, 2017 in the presence of Mr. Bindeshwar Pathak, Chairperson of Sulabh International.

Anubhuti along with Bardolators performed a **short play on "Fall of the Sparrow"** in the cultural program presented in front of the NAAC peer team.

A vigorous round of the auditions for the session 2017-18 were conducted for which we we got an overwhelming response from students. The first round of auditions was followed by a **10 day workshop**, **"Kaleidoscope"**, aimed at developing and honing theatrical abilities of the freshers. It was organized by Anubhuti under the guidance of its director Mr. Amit Tiwari.

**A theatre lecture** was organized by Anubhuti where eminent personalities like Mr. Sudhanva Deshpande and Mr. Benil Biswas were invited as speakers who enlightened the audience about various aspects of street and stage theatre respectively.

The Environment Club has had a very constructive and fun filled year in 2017-2018. We finished some projects and began two new ones.

The highlight of the year has been the **idea of an ECOZONE** which emerged from conversations with the Principal .The entire AVANI team under the guidance of the NGO *Give Me Trees* worked tirelessly towards realizing this dream and our new project, the ECOZONE was inaugurated on the Founder's Day (1<sup>st</sup> August, 2017). It is already producing food!

Paper is a material that can be easily recycled. This year AVANI started a **new project with the NGO GREEN-O-TECH INDIA** where the College can exchange paper waste collected from the faculty with A-4 size reams of paper. # **BARDOLATORS - The Shakespeare Society**

Bardolators, is the Shakespeare Society of Janki Devi Memorial College, and consists of students from different departments. The Society is both a proscenium based theatre and

street play society and usually performs in both Hindi and English. In the previous academic session, Bardolators participated in the **musical dance drama, Tabeer,** which was performed on the Annual Day of the College. The audition for this academic session was held on 17<sup>th</sup> August, 2017 and saw a wide participation of students across departments of the College.

The Society started its work for this academic session with a **screening of Akira Kurosawa's Throne of Blood (1957**), an adaptation of Shakespeare's play Macbeth, on 15<sup>th</sup> September, 2017. The screening provided an opportunity to engage with the larger debates related to the theories of adaptation.

The Society then held a **three day acting workshop** from 25<sup>th</sup> – 27<sup>th</sup> September, 2017 conducted by Mr. Amit Tiwari. The workshop covered multiple significant aspects related to theatrical acting such as various physical exercises to enhance body movements and the usage of various body parts, vocal exercises, voice projection and modulation, mime, team spirit building, to name a few. There was also a detailed discussion on *Navrasa* so as to help students understand the nuances of portraying various emotions on stage. The students were also encouraged to think innovatively via a creativity enhancement activity. The workshop was a huge success and was extremely beneficial for the students.

On 26<sup>th</sup> September, 2017, Bardolators - in collaboration with Anubhuti, the Street Play Society of JDMC, organized **"A Theatre Lecture"** by Mr. Sudhanva Deshpande, actor and director with Jan Natya Manch and Mr. Benil Biswas, Assistant Professor, School of Culture and Creative Expressions, Ambedkar University. In his lecture, Mr. Deshpande briefed the audience about the origin and evolution of street theatre in India. Mr. Biswas' lecture focused on Gender and Theatre; wherein he began by giving a brief introduction of the basics of theatre before detailing the issues of gender in theatre. The Principal, Dr. Swati Pal, also shared her experience in theatre with the audience. The lecture concluded with a question and answer session between the speakers and the students and teacher convenors.

The Society then held a **lecture demonstration on "Shakespeare in Performance"** and a Script Writing workshop on 14<sup>th</sup> October, 2017. Both the lecture demonstration and workshop were conducted by Dr. Sanjay Kumar, Associate Professor, Department of English, Hansraj College. The lecture focused on a critical analysis of play texts and theatre, the power that theatre holds and specific attention was paid to the political nature of theatre. Students were shown a few clips of modern adaptations of Shakespeare's plays. The lecture concluded with an interaction between Dr. Kumar and the students.

The Shakespeare Society of India in collaboration with the English Department of Janki Devi Memorial College and Bardolators hosted a **National Conference**, **"Shakespeare Now!"** on 27<sup>th</sup> October, 2017. The conference saw wide participation by renowned scholars from various parts of the country, such as, Supriya Chaudhuri, Harriet Raghunathan, Jonathan Gil Harris, Anannya Dasgupta, Madhavi Menon, to name a few.

The Keynote Lecture, titled "Masala Shakespeare", by Jonathan Gil Harris discussed various cinematic adaptations of Shakespeare in Bollywood. Coursing from Shakespearewallah to

more recent film adaptations of the Bard's plays, he drew attention to the lost experience of watching these films in theatres such as Chanakya. Compared to a more inclusive experience in the erstwhile theatres of a pre-globalized period, present day multiplex theatres cater only to a select audience. Drawing parallels with London's Globe theatre, Gil Harris focussed on a similar phenomenon. In the sixteenth century, the Globe Theatre with its space for groundlings and an experience amenable to that of a commoner now charged an exorbitant fee, keeping it out of reach of the day-to-day lived reality.

There were **multiple panel discussions** which focused on varied aspects of Shakespeare within the contemporary context, such as teaching and performing Shakespeare now, and the relevance of Shakespeare's politics and texts in current times. The Principal, Dr. Swati Pal and faculty, Dr. Payal Nagpal presented papers in this conference. The students of Ashoka University also performed Cardenio, Shakespeare's lost play. The performance was introduced by Madhavi Menon.

On 11<sup>th</sup> January, 2018, Bardolators held its event **Bardoratory: Slam Poetry** on the second day of the college festival, Symphony. The judges for the event were Ms. Indu Jain, Assistant Professor, Janki Devi Memorial College, and Mr. Ambikesh Sharma, an eminent slam poet. The event saw wide participation from students from various colleges and universities. Ms. Mani Dixit from Janki Devi Memorial College won the First prize, Ms. Aalakshaya Hira from Motilal Nehru College won the Second prize and Mr. Anubhav Tekwni from PGDAV College received the Third prize. A special recognition award was given to Ms. Shreyasi from AUD.

The Society then began its rehearsals on 15<sup>th</sup> January, 2018 for the Annual Drama Competition conducted by the Shakespeare Society of India. This year, the Society **performed "Gaming Macbeth"** which is a rework of Ms. Prachi Gambhir's script, a part of the play "Spectres of Shakespeare", directed by Mr. Sanjay Kumar and performed at Studio 81. In the play, Shakespeare's Macbeth is placed within the 21<sup>st</sup> century world of gaming heroes, matrices, networking sites and so on. The three witches emerge from the virtual world to entice Macbeth into a game of power and brutal acquisition. The competition was held on 3<sup>rd</sup> February, 2018 in Indraprastha College for Women Delhi University. The play was received very well and garnered a lot of praise for its unique concept.

#### **CAREER OPPORTUNITY CELL**

Career Opportunity Cell of JDMC was established with a view to empower young women by generating opportunities to make them financially independent. Our emphasis is not only on providing job opportunities but also internships, scholarships, conducting seminars, career counselling sessions and online assessment tests.

In order to equip students with skills and virtues of time management, **a seminar on "Time Management"** was organized in collaboration with T.I.M.E. To enhance their employability skills, the cell organized a seminar on "Interview Ready" with Enigma and on "Public Speaking" with T.I.M.E. The Cell has organized an online test conducted by CoCubes for "American Express Campus Engagement Programme" in June, 2017. EY conducted two soft skill sessions for the students where they provided a brief about their company as well as some interview skills and tips on building an effective CV.

The Cell endeavours to create and familiarize students with various career options. In pursuance, **a seminar on "Career in Banking and Finance"** was organized in collaboration with TKWS Institute. The Institute conducted an Aptitude Test, the results of which are still awaited. Shortlisted students will face an Interview and the finalists will get a scholarship of 1,00,000/-.

**Seminar on "Colloquim: New Age Game changer"** was organized in association with IILM. The seminar focused on artificial intelligence, robotics, internet and their disruptive outcomes. The Cell in collaboration with Facebook and Josh Talks organized an interactive workshop on entrepreneurship "Startab" on 26<sup>th</sup> September, 2017. Mr. Ayush Jaiswal and Mr. Vedant Maheshwari from Josh Talks were the speakers for the workshop.

The Cell always remains active to enhance its industry interface. 34 students from the college **unfold "The Indo Global Skills Summit & Expo 2017"** on Skills, Start-up & Entrepreneurship" on 28<sup>th</sup> July, 2017. It was organized by The Indus Foundation in association with The Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, New Delhi to take a deeper look at the present skill ecosystem and to identify future jobs & skills requirement. Many prestigious exhibitors like Alliance Francaise, Digital India, Incredible India, Amity University and other institutions took part in the expo and solved the queries of students and unveiled information about their institutions. The participants were awarded with E-Participation Certificates.

EY (earlier Ernst and Young) **conducted the Anchor Programme** for the members of Placement Cell of various colleges to bridge the gap between the company and institutions.

For the year 2017-18, the cell has **associated with Callyxpod**, to provide us with the web portal for online registration, intimation of placement events, record keeping and result analysis.

FIS Global Services IND Pvt. Ltd (Fortune 500 Company), Universal Data Solution and Flexability (RPO of ABC consultant) recruited our students for the first time during the session 2016-17.

For 2017-18, EY was allotted slot zero as per their request for the recruitment drive. The drive was conducted for the profile of Assurance Associate and after a **two-day recruitment process**, company finally selected four B.Com (Hons.) students for the same.

**ARCUS Multi Services Pvt. Ltd. conducted its recruitment drive** whereby around 55 students appeared from various streams. Profiles offered were Social Media Marketing, Human Resource and Academic Counsellor. Six students were finally selected by the company for its two months educational internship after which they will be selected for final placements based on their performance.

**Alight Solutions also visited the college**. Alight Solutions is the leading provider of cloudbased HR and financial solutions. Around 25 students appeared for the Drive. Finally, 13 students were offered the Letter of Intent. **FIS conducted its placement drive** for the role of search engine optimization and ad-words support. Around 64 students turned up for the placement drive from various courses. Two students were finally selected from B.A. (Hons.) Economics.

During the year 2016-17, many of our students have interned through *Internshala* in various organizations such as Jagbros, Financial Doctors, BPB Publication, Akaro, The Rising Welfare Society, Creation Cradle etc. EXIDE LIFE came up with the internship opportunity for second year students in November, 2017.

The cell also provides a platform for social organizations to reach out to students and persuade them to join them as interns. One such association was with the **NGO "Rangroot";** an innovative learning organization created to improve the quality of education in India and spread social awareness on issues like women empowerment, child abuse, health etc. Ms. Tina Verma, the President of Rangroot introduced the project "HOPE" through the workshop. Similarly, the cell organized a seminar with OXXY HEALTHCARE which aimed at informing students about the scholarship opportunities offered by the organization. Students can apply for the profile of lifetime campus ambassador to promote gender equality and women's healthcare.

The cell has also **connected with its alumni** to update them about job and internship opportunities through mails, WhatsApp groups, etc. They have been informed about the latest opportunities available at various companies such as HCL Technologies, American Express, HDFC Life, Google, LifCare, OYO Rooms, Josh Talks, Knowledge XP, Motilal Oswal Securities Ltd etc.

Counselling is an integral part of addressing the problems and issues faced by people. As an institution, it is imperative that we take care of the emotional well-being of all within college. In pursuance, **JDMC has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with ALS Wellness Network Pvt Ltd**., with the brand name **"Zyego"**, for online counselling, and for organizing workshops for students, faculty members and administrative staff. Zyego is a professional counselling and emotional wellness company based in Delhi. It provides services which give instant relief, comfort, and on-going support to its clients who are undergoing emotional problems and stress.

According to the MoU, the Scope of Services to be provided by Zyego is as follows:

- a) Counselling of students, using the app
- b) Face to face counselling of students

- c) Group therapy sessions, both face to face and via invite only (confidential chat rooms)
- d) Personality assessments using psychometric methods
- e) Organizing workshops for students and faculty members on relevant issues
- f) Events which foster wellness, cohesion and a healthy work environment.

The first **workshop for the faculty members** was held on 24<sup>th</sup> January, 2018 on the topic "Interpersonal Relationships at Workplace", and "How to Handle Issues Concerning Protocol, Hierarchy etc." The workshop saw active participation from the faculty members across departments of JDMC.

The first **Workshop for the students** of Sociology, Sanskrit and History was held on 31<sup>st</sup> January, 2018 on the topic "Relationship and other Related Issues.". The next workshop for the students was scheduled on 21<sup>st</sup> February, 2018. Both workshops were well attended and elicited a positive response from students.

The Counsellor on call is Dr. Renu Gulati from July, 2017.

Thus, the academic session 2017-18 has seen JDMC successfully undertake counselling services and move a step ahead in its mission of progressively adopting best institutional practices.

# **ENABLING UNIT – Enabling Students with Disability**

The Enabling Unit Is a society that seeks to enable and empower students with disability (SWD). We carried out various activities in the present academic session with the purpose of providing our students with opportunities and facilities.

The unit began the session by conducting a **two day training program** in collaboration with SAKSHAM on NVDA (Non Visual Desktop Access).

This was followed by **training on scanning pen drives** and learning to upload data in the computers. The unit further enabled students by providing them with a **two day workshop on Hindi typing.** 

The unit has kept up with the changing syllabus under CBCS by converting the basic study material of the students into Braille. We have also provided the students with **Braille dictionaries, an 8 GB pen drive** to enable them to be independent.

This year, the unit conducted an **Inter-College Fest** on 5<sup>th</sup>February, 2018, for the SWD. Under the fest, we organized three competitions, Braille Reading, Self-Composed Poem Recitation and Mimicry. Students across colleges participated in these events.

The students of JDMC are the only ones who are provided with a **free mid-day meal** and an assistant to record their lessons, help them in filling their forms, helping them with their lessons.

JDMC also takes these students on a **picnic** every year which is unique to our college. Further, ours is the only college that **conducts an event for SWD** under its Annual Fest Symphony.

The unit provides all these facilities through sponsorship to the students.

We, the members of the unit, hope to carry on with the activities in the future and further enabling the SWD.

# National Accreditation and Assessment Council (NAAC) Peer Team Visit to JDMC

The NAAC Peer team consisting of Prof. Vaikunthan (Chair), Prof. Venkatramani and Dr. Lalitha (members) visited the college on 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> August, 2017. This visit was the culmination of the collective efforts that had been made over two years by the management, faculty members, administrative staff, students, their parents and the alumni of JDMC. This six hundred page long report was compiled by a committee of forty faculty and staff members, who worked uncomplainingly for nearly three years to compile it. The process involved a lot of hard work and made us introspect about JDMC's unique strengths and lacunae and rethink some of our educational strategies.

In the Exit Meeting held in the auditorium in the presence of the faculty and staff members on the final day of the visit, the NAAC Peer Team Chair apprised us of the team's views and gave us valuable suggestions to improve the college further. The team was highly appreciative of the environment friendly practices of the college; its ambiance and the mission of the college Founder to not only educate the young women of India but also to make them responsible citizens. The team also applauded the democratic and transparent set up of the college; the dynamism of the Principal; the efficient functioning of the administration; the feedback mechanisms, the faculty's research and publication records, the environment friendly practices, the efforts of the college placement cell; the diversity of students and JDMC's attempts to make the campus disabled friendly. However, the team also suggested that we need to improve the ICT resources further and introduce new courses at undergraduate level. We have taken their inputs in the spirit they were given and plan to implement them in the near future.

JDMC was the first college in Delhi University to be assessed under the new, revised system of NAAC, in which only 20% weightage is given to the peer team's inputs, thereby making the process of assessment and accreditation more objective and transparent. Thus, the award of B++ given to the college by NAAC has spurred us to work harder and improve our score when the visit takes place again after five years. As a result of the NAAC peer team's visit, the college IQAC has started working with more vigour on improving the quality of the educational experience of our students by introducing more interaction between all stakeholders and introducing more courses and quality consciousness in education and administration.



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
