

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
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# Founder of the College



Late Shri Brij Krishan Chandiwala (1900 - 1986)

Shri Brij Krishan Chandiwala, the founder of Janki Devi Memorial College, was born in 1900 in a reputed family. As the third son of a flourishing silver merchant's family, there were no domestic pressures on him to join the family business. After the early demise of his wife, he joined the freedom movement led by Gandhiji. His mother's entreaties to remarry fell on deaf ears. Brij Krishanji became a true disciple of Gandhiji. He went to jail several times during the freedom movement. When Gandhiji started the agitation against the Salt Law, Brij Krishanji took an oath to give up salt and sugar for life. He was forced to break this vow in the last days of his life on health grounds.

At Gandhiji's behest, he had a prayer temple built in a Harijan Colony. He started the Delhi chapter of the Bharat Sewak Samaj, an organization for the upliftment of the downtrodden.


In 1959, Shri VKRV Rao, the then Vice-Chancellor of Delhi University appealed to the wealthy philanthropists of the city to come forward to open girls' colleges in Delhi. It was then that Brij Krishanji, who had no children, donated all his inherited wealth to the family trust, Shri Banarsidas Chandiwala Sewa Smarak Trust Society, which, in turn, funded the establishment of Janki Devi Memorial College in the memory of his late mother Smt. Janki Devi.

Today, Brij Krishanji is remembered for his social service and closeness to Gandhiji. When Nathuram Godse fired that fatal shot, Bapu fell into the arms of Brij Krishanji, who was sitting right behind him. Till his very end, this great visionary remained our mentor and guide.





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# Message from the Principal

JDMC is proud of the disciplined way in which classes are held in this college with regular tutorials as well as remedial classes. The University rules regarding internal assessment, especially attendance are strictly followed by us and we do not believe in compromising with them. There is transparency and a democratic approach in all that is undertaken within the college so that the students can express their suggestions/grievances through various means such as the monthly student faculty meetings, the feedback forms and the open door policy followed by the college at all levels. You will also find that your peers in the student community are helpful and dynamic; they will certainly motivate you to put your best foot forward.



The central location of the college, the ease with which one can access it on the Metro line and the sight of the impressive building with lush greens, make it an ideal place for teaching and learning. The classrooms are clean, comfortable and well ventilated; the premises contain a common room and a medical room with a sanitary napkin vending machine; an open air auditorium; a bank; a multi-cuisine and attractive cafeteria; computer laboratories; audio visual rooms; a recording studio; activity rooms; an e resource centre; language lab facilities; a photo copying centre as well as a Mother Dairy booth. The grand library houses over a lakh books and is fully computerized. Our girls' hostel that caters to a hundred plus outstation students of this college is surely one of the finest undergraduate hostels of Delhi University with its large rooms, facilities, cleanliness and the wonderful environment in which it is housed! It is truly a home away from home.

The college has won several awards such as a Green Campus Award Best Managed College of the Year Award and girl centric Tertiary Education and Training award from WAGE. In the last Garden show of the University, the college bagged 15 prizes! And only last session, the college received the District Green Champion Award from the Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education, Ministry of Education, Government of India. It was also recognized as a Swachhata Action Plan Institution as well as a sustainable Campus Institution. The college is well known for its many environmentally sound practices such as rain water harvesting, solar paneling, herbal garden, mechanised composting, paper recycling, e waste management and the development of the eco zones on campus. The ramps, the Braille sections of the library, the tactiles on the floors and the elevator are some of the ways in which we assist the physically challenged.

Those who are economically marginalized are assisted through fee concessions and scholarships by us. Not only in terms of intellectual and physical nurturing, the college is very concerned about the emotional well-being of the students. So we have counseling services of various kinds provided to the students with a visiting as well as on call counselor as also the workshops conducted by the Counseling agencies. We also ensure that medical aid is readily available through a qualified nurse in the medical room of the college which is well equipped.

Students of this college not only receive the best of scholarly training but have ample opportunities to participate in a wide range of extra and co-curricular activities through the innumerable clubs and Societies such as sports, NSS, NCC, Western and Classical dance and music, debate, photography, creative writing, theatre, investment cell and so many more. Students are encouraged to research and are actively involved in several research projects which forms part the work done under the JDMC-IQAC Research Centre of the college. I am proud to state that in the last two academic sessions, the college saw the publication by the students called Rediscovering Delhi. The college magazine, Janki gives students a space to express themselves creatively in words and many departments also have their exclusive department magazines. The active Placement Cell of the college works tirelessly to provide placements/internships to our students The Non collegiate Women's Education Board classes and the Janki Devi Vocational Centre are further contributions of the college towards providing holistic education. Many add on courses are provided by the college which help to enhance the skills and knowledge base of the students beyond the curriculum.

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# Ensuring the Safety of Students during the times of the Pandemic:



#### Student Advisory and Best Practices

The college is committed and equipped to handle the challenges thrown up by the pandemic and accepts them as opportunities to evolve and meet the needs of the students with renewed dedication.

#### All students are advised to:

- Get their Covid vaccines along with a booster shot in a timely manner.
- Wear a mask
- Co-operate with the staff at the gate for temperature checks
- Make use of the sanitization and hand washing facilities provided throughout the campus, including at the entry gate.

The college, on its part, follows stringent hygiene measures. All work areas are cleaned with alcohol-based disinfectants. Spraying with disinfectants is initiated by MCD as well as the college periodically. Masks, gloves and disinfectant are provided to all staff members including the safai-karamcharis and malis, who work tirelessly to keep the college clean and beautiful. The college followed the highest standards of building maintenance even during lockdown and is hard at work during the offline mode as well, to ensure health and safety measures.

The college takes every possible measure to sanitise the campus by:

- Temperature checks.
- A Hand washing facility at the gate itself.
- Provision of masks, gloves and disinfectant.
- Spraying of all areas with disinfectant at the college level as well as by the MCD.
- Cleaning all work areas with alcohol-based disinfectants every day.
- An instructional video about COVID prevention measures by the college physician, Dr. Chugh.

# 2022 - The Centenary Year of the University of Delhi



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





### JDMC-IQAC CENTRES





In accordance with the parameters provided by NAAC, JDMC is running the following centres:

#### 1. The JDMC-IQAC Research Centre

The JDMC-IQAC Research Centre was established in August, 2020 to encourage and enhance an outlook among students and faculty that is conducive to research; to study and analyse subjects that are germane to a better understanding of human behaviour, attitudes, literatures, cultures and societies. The Research Centre equips researchers by providing training and seed money to fund their research projects, while reinforcing values of academic integrity, rigour and excellence as well as collaborating with peers in pursuit of knowledge.

The students' wing of the Research Centre, Khoj, focuses specifically on promoting research among students by organising multiple, widely attended sessions on research methodologies. Khoj has also successfully hosted an inter-university and inter-college research paper writing competition. The research unit's primary focus is on encouraging an analytical mindset among students that results in quality research by providing them appropriate training and tools. The Unit takes care of a significant lacuna in providing quality training to students at the undergraduate level by organising workshops, sessions and paper writing competitions to enable them to learn the basics of research and experiment with their interests.

An example of the fruitful collaboration between faculty and students of the college that was initiated and funded by the Research Centre are the two books, Rediscovering Delhi, (eds. J. Gill and N. Sethi) and Rediscovering the City in Covid Times (editor J. Gill, co-editors R. Bhatia and T. Sharma). Both the books were launched internationally by Dr Kanika Batra of Texas Tech University and by the college as well.

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



The hostel building was newly constructed in 2018 and inaugurated by the Honourable former President of India, Shri Pranab Mukherjee on August 01, 2018, Founder's Day of the college.

Each room has ensuite facilities with a toilet and an attached balcony. A fully air-conditioned common room, 2 floors with AC fittings, open green area and a dining arrangement that conforms to high standards of hygiene are some of the attractive features of this hostel. Students' safety is taken very seriously and guards are deputed to provide security round the clock. The entire Hostel is covered through CCTV surveillance.

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# Special Features of the College

COLLEGE WORKING DAYS AND TIMINGS: The College observes a six day week from Monday to Saturday. Classes commence at 9.00 a.m. daily and end at VIII<sup>th</sup> period, with a break between 12.00 noon to 12.30 p.m. On Wednesdays, there is a special long assembly from 11.45 a.m. to 12.45 p.m. for various extra-curricular activities. Attendance in these sessions is mandatory.

IDENTITY CARD: After the college re-opens for the new academic session (2022-23), all new students will be given an identity card with a photograph and necessary details to prove their credentials as a bona-fide student of the institution. Every student will be required to contact the office with the original fee slip and collect the identity card on notified dates. All students are required to carry the I - card to the college everyday and produce it on demand. Duplicate Identity card will be issued by the college on receiving an application from the student and on payment of Rs.50/-in the Bank.

TIME TABLE: Copies of the time-table for the session will be distributed and explained to the first year students on the Orientation Day, when students meet their respective teachers, or be given online. Time Tables will also be available on the college website as well as notice boards.

COLLEGE LIBRARY: JDMC's library is a repository of over one lakh books and one hundred journals, both academic and general. It is among the first fully automated libraries in the Delhi University and provides photocopying and free internet facilities. Newly admitted students should contact the library staff with their Identity card for the issue of library cards.

MEDICAL ROOM: JDMC's medical room is open on all working days from 10.00 am. - 12.00 p.m to cater to first aid and other emergency requirements of the students and staff. The doctor in-charge, Prof. Dr. Sudesh K. Chugh, is a Senior Consultant, Physician, Cardiologist, Diabetologist, Gastroenterologist and Neurologist.

COMPUTER LABS: Our first computer lab was inaugurated by Professor Shirin Rathore on 28/10/2005. Now, we have three computer labs with nearly 130 computers with internet connectivity for the use of students and faculty.

AUDITORIUM: JDMC has a unique open air auditorium with a fully equipped lights and sound room. Situated amidst lush green surroundings that lend a special charm to the functions it hosts. It seats more than 2000 people and also has green rooms.

CAFETERIA: The College has a spacious cafeteria that offers a wide variety of snacks to students and staff at reasonable rates. The cafeteria is supervised by a Canteen Committee consisting of the Principal, Bursar, Staff Council Secretary, Staff Association Secretary, Staff Advisors Canteen Committee members and the President of the Students' Union.

COLLEGE GARDEN: The College gardens are a constant source of pride. We have won many prizes in different categories. The Rock Garden has won the 1st prize at the University Flower Show.

PIO's ROOM / RESEARCH CENTRE / IQAC COORDINATOR'S ROOM: The Public Information Officer of the college is available during college hours.

STUDENTS' UNION: JDMC has an active Students' Union guided by designated Staff Advisors. It regularly organises cultural shows, seminars and workshops, the most exciting of them being 'SYMPHONY', the annual inter-college cultural festival of JDMC. Union members are elected once a year and help students who have any problems. The Students' Union comprises of 4 elected members - President, Vice President, General Secretary and Treasurer and 3 nominated members: Drama Club Secretary, Debate Club Secretary and Music & Dance Club Secretary.

# **College Societies**

National Cadet Corps (NCC): The NCC cadets have won accolades in shooting, firing, drill and line competitions. The NCC Programme ends with the certificate examination every year. NCC cadets are exempted from giving written test of CDS Exam (conducted by UPSC) and are also eligible to give SSB interview through direct entry. Under women paramilitary forces, NCC cadets are given reservation.

C-certificate holders are exempted from written exams. NCC cadets are also taught other skills such as parachuting, paragliding and basic aviation courses because of which they have an edge over others when applying for the armed forces. JDMC NCC was awarded the NCC Achiever's Award 2019 in the National Category of 'All India Best Senior Wing College', by NCC alumni Club of Delhi on July 15, 2019.

National Service Scheme (NSS): NSS unit of JDMC is affiliated to the NSS unit of Delhi University. Students who register for NSS take up projects like organizing Blood Donation Camps, volunteering for Community service,

The NSS aims to inculcate, in each of its volunteers, a spirit of selfless social service and a life-long commitment to work for the benefit of the community. An NSS volunteer may become eligible for the Indira Gandhi award if she fulfills the criteria which are available at nss.du.ac.in.

National Sports Organisation (NSO): The Sports organization is run by the Physical Education department of the college and is affiliated to the Delhi University Sports Council (DUSC) and the National Sports Council. Apart

from encouraging our students to engage in yoga, aerobics, and swimming, we organize various activities and Interdepartmental competitions for different sports to motivate and to raise health awareness among all. Students get the opportunity to participate at college level, at state level and at international level. This in turn, helps them get government jobs, for example with the railways, police and armed forces. They also get scholarships, cash awards and recognition from national and international bodies.

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



# Admission Procedure Reservation Policies

# Reservation of Seats for Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) Candidates

22.5% of the total numbers of seats is reserved for Candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes (15% for Scheduled Caste and 7.5% for Scheduled Tribes, interchangeable if necessary).

The Candidate must be in possession of the Caste/Tribe certificate in his/her own name at the time of Registration and Admission. The Caste certificate should clearly state:

- (a) Name of his/her caste/tribe
- (b) Whether candidate belongs to SC or ST
- (c) District and the State or Union Territory of Candidate's usual place of residence, and
- (d) the appropriate Govt. of India Schedule under which his / her caste / tribe is approved as SC or ST.

Candidate will have to produce the valid original SC or ST caste/tribe certi? cate at the time of admission. The following are empowered to issue the requisite SC / ST certificate:

- a. District Magistrate / Additional District Magistrate / Collector / Deputy Commissioner / Addl. Deputy Commissioner / Deputy Collector / 1st class Stipendiary Magistrate / City Magistrate / Sub-Divisional Magistrate / Taluka Magistrate / Executive Magistrate / Extra Assistant Commissioner.
- b. Chief Presidency Magistrate / Addl. Chief Presidency Magistrate / Presidency Magistrate.
- c. Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- d. Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the Candidate and/or his family normally resides.
- e. Administrator / Secretary to the Administrator / Development Officer (Lakshadweep Islands).

Candidates to note that the SC / ST Certificate from any other person / authority shall not be accepted in any case. If the Candidate happens to belong to SC or ST, Candidate's caste / tribe must be listed in the appropriate Govt. of India Schedule.

It is a statutory obligation on the part of Colleges to fill all seats reserved for Scheduled Caste / Scheduled Tribe Candidates.

Colleges shall not refuse admission to any SC / ST Candidate on the basis of medium of instruction. Any deficiency in the knowledge of any particular language should be addressed; for this purpose remedial classes may be arranged by the College by utilizing grants available from University Grants Commission.

# Reservation of Seats for Other Backward Classes (OBC, Non-Creamy Layer, Central List)

27% seats are reserved for the Candidates belonging to Other Backward Classes (OBC - Non-Creamy Layer, Central List).

At the time of giving admission to an OBC Candidate, the College will ensure that the caste is included in the Central List of OBC (the OBC status is to be determined on the basis of the Central (Govt. of India) List of OBCs notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes (available at the website http://ncbc.nic.in/backward classes/index.html.)



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The certificate must mention non-creamy layer status of the Candidate (Non-creamy layer status issued by an authority mentioned in DOPT Office Memorandum no. 36012/22/93- Estt. (SCT) dated 15.11.1993). The OBC Candidates who belong to the 'Non-Creamy Layer' and whose caste appears in the Central List of the OBCs only, shall be eligible to be considered for admission under the OBC category (Validity period of OBC certificate in respect of 'non-creamy layer' status of the Candidates as per DOPT Office Memorandum No. 36036/2/2013-Estt. (Res- I) dated 31 March 2016). The validity of the non-creamy layer certificate shall be for the? nancial year 2021-2022, issued on or after 31st March, 2022.

It is a statutory obligation on the part of Colleges to fill all the seats reserved for OBCC andidates.

# Reservation policy for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS)

As per the University of Delhi notifications (Reference No. Aca. I / Reservation of EWSs / 2019 / 63 Dated 28th March 2019 and Reference No. Aca. I / Reservation of EWSs / 2019 / 101 Dated 15th May 2019), for the reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) Category, the University Departments / Centres / Colleges have reserved 10% seats for admission of candidates be longing to EWS category.

# Admission to Supernumerary Seats

Admission to all supernumerary seats will be through CUET 2022. Candidates desirous of taking admission on Supernumerary seats must appear in CUET 2022.

# Reservation of Seats for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD)

# A. Locomotor Disability

Locomotor disability (a person's inability to execute distinctive activities associated with movement of self and objects resulting from a? iction of musculoskeletal or nervous system or both), including—

- 1. "leprosy cured person" means a person who has been cured of leprosy but is suffering from
  - i) loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye-lid but with no manifestation of deformity;



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- ii) manifest deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity;
- iii) extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him/her from undertaking any gainful occupation, and the expression "leprosy cured" shall construed accordingly;
- 2. "cerebral palsy" means a Group of non-progressive neurological condition affecting body movements and muscle coordination, caused by damage to one or morespecific areas of the brain, usually occurring before, during or shortly after birth;
- 3. "dwar? sm" means a medical or genetic condition resulting in an adult height of 4feet 10 inches (147 centimeters) or less;
- 4. "muscular dystrophy" means a group of hereditary genetic muscle disease thatweakens the muscles that move the human body and persons with multiple dystrophy have incorrect and missing information in their genes, which prevents them from making the proteins they need for healthy muscles. It is characterised progressive skeletal muscle weakness, defects in muscle proteins, and the death of muscle cells and tissue:
- 5. "acid attack victims" means a person disfigured due to violent assaults by throwing of acid or similar corrosive substance.
- B. Visual impairment
- 6. "blindness" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, after best correction
  - i) total absence of sight; or
  - ii) visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eyewith best possible correction; or
  - iii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degree.
- 7. "low-vision" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, namely:
  - i) visual acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 upto 3/60 or upto 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible corrections; or
  - ii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40 degree upto 10 degree.
- C. Hearing Impairment
- 8. "deaf" means persons having 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;
- 9. "hard of hearing" means person having 60 DB to 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;
- 10. "speech and language disability" means a permanent disability arising out of conditions such as laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neurological causes.

### D. Intellectual Disability

A condition characterised by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and in adaptive behaviour which covers a range of every day, social and practical skills, including—

11. "specific learning disabilities" means a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is a deficit

- in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell, or to do mathematical calculations and includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental aphasia;
- 12. "autism spectrum disorder" means a neuro-developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate, understand relationships and relate to others, and is frequently associated with unusual or stereotypical rituals or behaviours.

### E. Mental Behaviour

"Mental illness" means a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behaviour, capacity to recognise reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, but does not include retardation which is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of mind of a person, specially characterised by subnormality of intelligence.

"Parkinson's disease" means a progressive disease of the nervous system marked by tremor, muscular rigidity, and slow, imprecise movement, chie? y affecting middle-aged and elderly people associated with degeneration of the basal ganglia of the brain and a deficiency of the neurotransmitter dopamine.F. Blood Disorder
- 15. "haemophilia" means an inheri1table disease, usually affecting only male but trans- mitted by women to their male children, characterised by loss or impairment of the normal clotting ability of blood so that a minor wound may result in fatal bleeding;
- 16. "Thalassemia" means a group of inherited disorders characterised by reduced or absent amounts of haemoglobin.
- 17. "Sickle cell disease" means a haemolytic disorder characterised by chronic anaemia, painful events, and various complications due to associated tissue and organ damage; "haemolytic" refers to the destruction of the cell membrane of red blood cells resulting in the release of haemoglobin.
- F. Multiple Disabilities (more than one of the above specified disabilities)

Multiple disabilities including deaf blindness which means a condition in which a per- son may have combination of hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, developmental, and educational problems.


- (a) All SC, ST students whose guardians are not assessed for income tax can avail of reimbursement of tuition fees after admission.





# **Undergraduate Curriculum Framework (UGCF)**

The Undergraduate Curriculum Framework- 2022 (UGCF) is meant to bring about systemic change in the higher education system in the University and align itself with the National Education Policy 2020. The following objectives of NEP are kept in perspective while framing UGCF:

- > to promote holistic development of students having the world view of a truly global citizen;
- > to provide flexibility to students so that learners have the ability to choose their learning trajectories and programmes, and thereby choose their paths in life according to their talents and interests;
- to eliminate harmful hierarchies among disciplines/fields of study and silos between different areas of learning;
- multidisciplinarity and holistic education to ensure the unity and integrity of all knowledge;
- > to promote creativity and critical thinking and to encourage logical decision-making and innovation;
- > to promote ethics and human & Constitutional values;
- > to promote multilingualism and the power of language in learning and teaching;
- > to impart life skills such as communication, cooperation, teamwork, and resilience;
- > to promote outstanding research as a corequisite for outstanding education and development;
- > to incorporate Indian Knowledge System relevant for a particular discipline or field of studies.

# **Features of UGCF**

The aforementioned objectivess of the NEP have been reflected in various features of UGCF:

> Holistic development of the students shall be nurtured through imparting life skills in initial years. These life skill courses shall include courses on 'Environment and Sustainable Development Studies', 'Communication



# **Courses of Study**

Skills', 'Ethics and Culture', 'Science and Society', 'Computational Skills', 'IT & Data Analytics', and similar such skills which shall make the students better equipped to deal with the life's challenges.

- Flexibility to the students to determine their learning trajectories and pursuance of programmes of study has been well ingrained in the UGCF. The Framework allows students to opt for one, two, or more discipline(s) of study as a core discipline(s) depending on his/her choice. He/she has been provided the option of focusing on studying allied courses of his/her selected discipline(s) (DSEs) or diversifying in other areas of study of other disciplines. Students have also been provided with the flexibility to study SECs or opt for Internships or Apprenticeship or Projects or Research or Community Outreach at an appropriate stage. In the fourth year, students are provided flexibility to opt for writing a dissertation (on major, minor, or combination of the two) or opt for Academic Projects or Entrepreneurship depending upon their choice and their future outlook, post completion of their formal education. For more details on the flexibility provided, refer to the Framework provided in Table -3.
- > Given the extent of plurality of the Indian society and the diverse background to which students belong, multiple exits and provision of re-entry have been provided at various stages of the undergraduate programme to accommodate their requirement and facilitate them to complete their studies depending upon their priorities of life. The earning and accumulation of credits in the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC), and the flexibility to redeem the requisite credit for award of appropriate Certificate / Diploma/ Degree, as the per the norms laid down by the UGC and the University, shall be made available to the students to provide the opportunity for lifelong learning as well as for availing academic outreach beyond the superstructure of the programme of study in another University / Institution at the national /international level depending upon individual choice of the student(s).
- > UGCF has incorporated multidisciplinary education by embedding within the framework the need to opt for at least four elective papers from any other discipline(s) other than the one opted as core discipline(s). In fact, a student who pursues a single-core discipline programme may obtain minor in a particular discipline, other than the core discipline, if he/she earns at least 28 credits in that particular discipline.
- > The framework does not maintain/support hierarchy among fields of study/disciplines and silos between different areas of learning. As long as a student fulfils the pre-requisites of a course of study, he/she shall be able to study it. Modules or systems of study shall be meaningfully laid down so as to guide the students in choosing the track/academic paths for the desired outcome.
- > One of the significant hallmarks of the framework is a provision of pursuing multilingualism while studying any other discipline as core subject(s), which has no bearing with any language and linguistics. I and II semesters of the programme provides an opportunity to the students to study languages which are enshrined under the eighth schedule of the Constitution of India, thereby allowing the students for their holistic development, including the ability to acquire proficiency in a language beyond their mother tongue.
- > The framework provides a mandatory programme on research methodologies as one of the discipline specific elective (DSE) courses at the VI & VII semester for students who opt for writing dissertation on major/ minor at VII and VIII semesters. Further, provision for internship / apprenticeship/ project/ community outreach right from the III semester up to VI semester provides ample opportunity to the students to explore areas of knowledge / activity beyond the four walls of the classroom and reach out to the world outside without any dilution of the academic feature of the course of study, he/she is pursuing. This also acts a precursor for the students to take up academic project or entrepreneurship at a later stage in VII & VIII semester. Such an initiative will help in skill development and laying a strong foundation for research and thus contribute towards overall national development through the development of skilled manpower and innovation.

# **Courses of Study**

Intra and inter University mobility of students is another element of critical importance which has been ingrained in the framework. A student, by virtue of such mobility, will be able to make lateral movement within the University as well as from the University to any other Institution and vice-versa. Such an attribute allows a student maximum flexibility in terms of pursuance of education with special reference to higher education and enables him/her to achieve goal of life, the way he/she perceived it.

# **Qualification Type and Credits Requirements**

"Qualifications are formal 'awards' such as a certificate, diploma or a degree are awarded by a competent authority such as a college or university in recognition of the attainment by students of the expected learning outcomes on the successful completion of a particular programme of study. They are awarded after an assessment and evaluation of learning levels conducted by a competent body that determines the achievement by students of the expected learning outcomes to 2 given standards." A student who exits at the end of any even semesters has to earn the requisite credits (stated in Table - 4) in order to be awarded the relevant certificate/diploma/degree. The qualification title/nomenclature and corresponding credits requirements relevant for Level 5 to Level 8 of the undergraduate programmes are clearly stated in Table below.

- \*\* There shall be choice in Semester III and IV to either choose a DSE or a GE.
- \*\*\* There shall be choice in V and VI Semesters to choose either one 'SEC' or in the alternative 'Internship/Apprenticeship/Project/Research/Community Outreach' in each Semester for two credits each.
- # There shall be four choices in VII and VIII Semesters -
- (i) to choose three DSEs of 4 credits each OR
- (ii) to choose two DSEs and one GE of 4 credits each OR
- (iii) to choose one DSE and two GEs of 4 credits each.
- 'Research Methodology' shall be offered as one of the DSE courses in VI and VII Semesters. Students can opt for it either in VI semester or VII semester. However, a student pursuing multidisciplinary studies in three core disciplines shall have to choose research methodology in VI semester, if she/he wishes to Major in one of the three disciplines in the fourth year.

Suppose a student wishes to study the Research Methodology course offered by another discipline (as one of its DSEs). In that case, he/she may opt for it provided such discipline is his minor discipline. The Research Methodology of another discipline so opted shall be treated as GE for him/her.

## Note

- 1. Entry level eligibility: The general feeder category for entry into Level 5 is the Secondary School Leaving Certificate obtained after successfully completing Grade 12. A programme of study leading to entry into the first year of the Bachelor's degree is open to those students who have met the entrance requirements, including specified levels of attainment at the secondary level of education mentioned in the programme admission regulations. Admission to the Bachelor degree programme of study is based on the evaluation of documentary evidence (including the academic record) of the applicant's ability to undertake and complete a Bachelor's degree programme which is specified in the UGC Guidelines for Multiple Entry and Exit Scheme in Academic Programmes Offered in Higher Education.
- 2. Number of hours of a credit course shall be defined by its component of lecture, tutorial and practical.
- 3. Every student has to study "Environmental Science and Sustainable Development" courses I and II of two credits each in the first year (I/II semester) and the second year (III/IV semester), respectively. The AEC pool will also consist of credit courses in languages listed in the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India, as updated from time to time. The University of Delhi shall extend necessary support to those Colleges (where faculty is not available) which may require it in course of teaching learning in these languages.
- 4. Design of degrees: Students shall be able to design their own degrees according to their mission and aspiration for a future befitting to their ability and attainment, rather than following the conventional pathway.
- 5. A student who pursues three years undergraduate degree programme in a specific discipline as a Core course [for example, B.A. (Honours) English, B. Com (Honours), B.Sc. (Honours) Physics and such other Programmes] will earn at least 80 credits in that discipline (from 18 DSCs and at least 2 DSEs of that discipline) and shall be awarded Honours degree in that discipline, if he/she exits after completion of VI semester.
- 6. A student who pursues three years undergraduate degree programme in more than one discipline as core courses of study (for example B.A. in Social Sciences/ Humanities, B.Sc. in Life Sciences, B.Sc. in Physical Sciences, B.Sc. in Mathematical Sciences, Bachelor in Commerce Studies and such other programmes) he/she shall be awarded Bachelor's degree in that field of multidisciplinary course of study, if he/she exits after completion of VI semester.

- 7. If a student wishes to pursue four years Honours Degree with research, he/she shall compulsorily opt for a Research Methodology course in either VI Semester or VII Semester as DSE.
- 8. Dissertation/Academic Project/Entrepreneurship in the 4th year shall commence from VII semester and conclude in VIII semester. Detailed outcomes of each track chosen out of these three options shall be notified and assessment at the end of VII and VIII semesters shall be done accordingly.
- 9. Dissertation may be written in the Major or Minor or Interdisciplinary (combination of Major and Minor) discipline.
- 10. If a student mentioned at (6) above continues or re-enters the fourth year for pursuing an Honours degree in that field of multidisciplinary study, he/she has to choose only one of the disciplines he/she had studied as core courses of study in the previous six semesters and earn credits from the 2DSCs and 6DSEs of that chosen discipline in the VII and VIII semesters and write dissertation or opt for Academic Project or Entrepreneurship.
- 11. If a student mentioned at (5) above, continues or re-enters to study the VII and VIII semesters in the same discipline, and writes dissertation mentioned at (9) above, but no Minor discipline is made out (i.e., credits earned in the GEs of any one discipline is less than 28 credits), then he/she shall be awarded 'Honours with Research' with Major in that discipline on successful completion of VIII Semester.
- 12. A student mentioned at (6) above, shall be awarded 'Honours' degree in that field of multidisciplinary study on successful completion of VIII semester. For example, B.A. (Honours) Social Sciences/ Humanities, B.Sc. (Honours) Life Sciences, B.Sc. (Honours) Physical Sciences, B.Sc. (Honours) Mathematical Sciences and Bachelor in Commerce Studies (Honours). Major and Minor shall be indicated on fulfilment of the conditions mentioned above at III(3)(b) and III(5)(b), respectively. For instance, a student who pursues four years B.A. (Honours) in Social Sciences/ Humanities with History, Political Science and Hindi as core courses, shall get Major in History, on successful completion of VIII semester, if he/she earns minimum 80 credits in History from 8 DSCs and at least 9 DSEs of History and writes dissertation on a topic related to History. Such a student shall get a Minor in Political Science/Hindi, if he/she earns minimum 28 credits from 6 DSCs and one DSE of Political Science/Hindi.
- 13. Only a student mentioned at (5) above who opts to write a dissertation in the Major/Minor subject in VII and VIII semesters in the fourth year, shall be awarded 'Bachelor of Field of Study/Discipline (Honours with Research) in Discipline'. For instance, a student who pursues B.Sc. (Honours) in Physics and writes a dissertation on a topic relating to Physics or the Minor in VII and VIII semesters, shall be awarded 'Bachelor of Science (Honours with Research) Physics. Major and Minor shall be indicated on fulfilment of the conditions mentioned above at III(3)(a) and III(5)(a), respectively.
- 14. A student who opts for 'Academic Project' or 'Entrepreneurship' in VII and VIII semesters, instead of writing dissertations, and has earned 28 credits in the relevant GEs, SECs, AECs & IAPC, shall be awarded Minor in Academic Project or Entrepreneurship, as the case may be. 'Bachelor of Field of Study/Discipline (Honours with Academic Project/ Entrepreneurship) in Discipline (Major) & Academic Project/ Entrepreneurship (Minor)'. If he/she is unable to earn the requisite 28 credits, he/she shall be awarded 'Bachelor of Field of Study/Discipline (Honours with Academic Project/ Entrepreneurship) in Discipline (Major).
- 15. A student who a pursues four-year undergraduate degree programme shall be awarded after completion of the VIII semester an appropriate degree.
- 16. Exit Options: The minimum credit to be earned by a student per semester is 18 credits and the maximum is 26 credits. However, students are advised to earn 22 credits per semester. This provision is meant to provide students the comfort of the flexibility of semester-wise academic load and to learn at his/her own pace. However, the mandatory number of credits have to be secured for the purpose of award of Undergraduate Certificate/ Undergraduate Diploma/ Appropriate Bachelor's Degree in the field of Study/Discipline, to a student who chooses to exit at the end of even semesters (details provided in Table 4).



#### Department of English



#### NOTIFICATIONS

- After declaration of the cut off lists by the University, the student will need to report to the college of her choice for admission within the stipulated period. The student would then get her documents verified and pay the admission fee.
- In case, a student cancels her admission in a college, in order to move to another college on declaration of a subsequent cut off list
  or needs certificates for institutions outside Delhi University, the college must promptly return the documents to the student.
- No student will be allowed to take admission in two courses/colleges simultaneously. In case, they are found to be admitted in two courses/colleges simultaneously, their admission will be cancelled.

#### Concession/Waiver of fees in respect of Persons With Physical Disabilities (PwD)

- Consequent upon amendment to Ordinance X(4) of the University, the following proviso has been added after Sub-clause 2
  of Ordinance X(4) of the said Ordinance:
  - "Provided that the Persons With Physical Disabilities shall be waived off all the fees payable including the Examination fee and other University fees, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University Students' Union and Identity Card fee for pursuing under-graduate, post-graduate or other courses in the University or its Colleges."
- In pursuance of the above, the students with physical disabilities pursuing various courses of study in the Faculties, Departments, Centers, and Institutions/Colleges of the University shall be exempted from payment of fees, including examination fee and other University fees, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University students' Union and Identity Card fee.
- 3. In pursuance of the Executive Council Resolution No. 50 dated 03.11.2012, it is notified that the students with physical disabilities residing in different Hostels/Halls of the University are exempted from payment of all hostel fees and charges except refundable caution fee and the mess fees. The Persons with Physical Disabilities students shall pay 50% of the Mess fee and the remaining 50% of the Mess Fee in respect of the PwD students is being met by the University. Similar norms are to be adopted by the Colleges in respect of PwD Students residing in various hostels of the Colleges.
  - It is clarified further that the PwD students who are getting fellowships/financial assistance shall be exempted from payment of fees/charges/mess fees subject to the following conditions:



#### ATTENDANCE RULES AND CREDITS

Ideally a student should attend all lectures, preceptorials, tutorials and practical classes held during the Semester in all the subjects (or papers). In case the student is unable to do so, then she/he must have:

- Aminimum of 66.67% attendance in lectures, preceptorials, tutorials and practical classes separately
  in all the subjects (or papers) for all the six semesters of the course. Failing this, she/he will not be
  permitted to appear in the university examination.
- Please note that 66.66% attendance is also required in each course separately in each Semester, failing which the student will be detained.

Students who have missed classes on account of:

- A serious disabling illness
- II. Participation in Sports activities
- III. Participation in an Inter-College, inter-University event

should submit a medical/participation certificate duly signed by Teacher-in-charge at the college administrative office within 10 days of returning to college after recuperation/return.

Attendance of detained candidates will be calculated afresh for the Semester she has rejoined. Attendance for the Semester already passed will, however, remain unchanged.

Students failing to attend a minimum of 66.67% of the lectures/ tutorials / preceptorials / practical classes will not be permitted to appear in the University Examination.

5% weightage awarded for regularity in attending lectures and tutorials shall be calculated as follows:

85% and above	5 marks
80% or more but less than 85%	4 marks
75% or more but less than 80%	3 marks
70% or more but less than 75%	2 marks
67% or more but less than 70%	1 mark
Less than 67%	0 marks

Every student admitted to the College shall be compulsorily required to sign an undertaking that she shall fulfill the minimum attendance requirement.

The monthly attendance of student shall be uploaded on the college website.

Parents/guardians are requested to keep track of their ward's attendance in classes. They may note that if their ward falls short of the minimum attendance requirements, she shall not be permitted to appear in the examinations.

Smoking and consumption of alcohol is strictly prohibited in the campus. The college is a smoke free zone and the Nodal Officer for anti-smoking campaign is Ms. Vandana Madan, Convernor, Avani.



#### INTERNAL ASSESSMENT: ORDINANCE VIII-E

- 1.1. The scheme for Internal Assessment shall be followed in the regular stream only, with exclusions as per the Appendix (at Page 6), and shall be applicable to the students admitted from the academic session 2003-04 onwards (i.e. to begin with for the first year students) in both undergraduate and postgraduate degree courses. This scheme of Internal Assessment shall not be applicable to the School of Correspondence Course and Continuing Education, Non-Collegiate Women's Education Board and Non-Formal Education Cell (formerly External Candidates Cell). The specific Ordinances pertaining to schemes of examinations of various courses shall stand amended, mutatis mutandis, to the extent of internal assessment as laid down in this Ordinance, subject to exclusions referred to above.
- 1.2. Internal Assessment marks shall be shown separately in the Marks Sheet issued by the University and these marks shall be added to the annual/semester examination marks for determining the division of the student. 25% of the maximum marks in each paper in undergraduate courses shall be assigned for Internal Assessment and the remaining 75% marks for the annual/semester University Examination; the time duration and other modalities of the annual/semester Examination with respect to this 75% component shall remain as per existing schemes of examination for various undergraduate courses.
- 2.1.1. There shall be 10% weightage assigned to House Examinations to be conducted by each college, for all subjects in Pass course and B.Sc. (General) and all papers of the main Subject in Honours courses.
- 2.1.2. The duration of each paper in the House Examination shall be the same as the duration in the University Examination. The maximum marks for each paper of the House Examination shall be 100 or the same as the maximum marks in the corresponding University Examination.
- 2.1.3. The University reserves the right to scrutinize some or all the scripts of any paper in any course in a College during the period of retention of papers, Which duration shall be till declaration of results by the University, a copy of the question paper shall be sent to the Examination Branch of the University and the College shall maintain a proper record of the question papers of the House Examination.
- 2.2.1. Each student shall be assessed on the basis of written assignments/tutorials as well as on the basis of project reports/term papers/seminars. There shall be 10% weightage for such written assignment; and project reports/presentations/term papers/seminars. Each student shall be given at least one written assignment per paper in each term, subject to a maximum of 12 written assignments per year for all the papers taken together.
- 2.2.2. Where the maximum marks in a paper are less than 100, for example 50 marks, the nature of written assignments/ tutorial work shall stand adjusted pari passu.
- 2.2.3. There shall be 5% weightage for regularity in attending lectures and tutorials, and the credit for regularity in each paper, based on attendance, shall be as follows:

More than 67% but less than 70%-1mark

70% or more but less than 75% -2 marks

75% or more but less than 80% - 3 marks

80% or more but less than 85% -4 marks

85% and above -5 marks

[Medical certificates shall be excluded while calculating credit towards marks to be awarded for regularity, though such certificates shall continue to be taken into account for the purpose of calculating eligibility to appear for examinations as per the existing provisions of Ordinance VII.2.9.(a)(ii).]

- 2.2.4. There shall be a Moderation Committee for Internal Assessment in each College, discipline-wise, which shall comprise of the senior most teacher in the department, the teacher-in-charge of the department and the previous teacher-in-charge of the department: provided that if, for any reason, the membership of the Committee falls below 3, the Principal of the college shall nominate suitable members from among the teachers of that department/college to fill the vacancies.
- 3. With the introduction of Internal Assessment, the maximum marks for the University Examination in each paper shall stand reduced accordingly.
- 4. The promotion criteria shall be as per the existing Ordinances for University Examinations, as applicable to respective courses. In addition, the same criteria shall apply to the total of the University Examination and the Internal Assessment, taken together.
- 5.1. There shall be a Monitoring Committee for Internal Assessment at the University level consisting of the Dean of Colleges as the Chairperson along with three other Deans one of whom shall be a member of the Executive Council, and the Controller of Examinations as Member-Secretary. The Committee shall monitor the receipt of Internal Assessment marks from various colleges and ensure timely compliance. If a College fails to submit the Internal Assessment marks in time, the University shall not declare the result for such a course in that College.
  - The responsibility for non-declaration of the result of any course in the college in such circumstances will be solely that of the college.
- 5.2. There shall be a Monitoring Committee for Internal Assessment in every College, which shall be chaired by the Principal of the College and will be made up of the Vice-Principal (and in case there is no Vice-Principal, the Bursar), Secretary Staff Council, and two

- senior faculty members to be nominated by the Principal. This Committee shall be responsible for the entire process of Internal Assessment in the College, including redressal of grievances, if any.
- 6.1. In the case of students who repeat one or more paper (s), or all papers of Part I or Part II or Part III, the Internal Assessment marks shall be carried forward.
- 6.2. In the following special cases, in lieu of Internal Assessment, students shall be awarded marks (for the previous years papers) in the same proportion as the marks obtained in that paper in the University Examination:
- 6.2.1. Students who migrate from other Universities to the University of Delhi in the IInd Year;
- 6.2.2. Students who fail in the Part I Examination of Honours Courses and join Pass/General Courses in the IInd year; and
- 6.2.3. Students who transfer from 1st year Pass/General Courses to Honours Courses in the 2nd year.
- 6.3. Students who migrate from non-formal streams in the University of Delhi (i.e. School of Correspondence Courses and Continuing Education, Non-Collegiate Women's Education Board and Non-Formal Education Cell, formerly External Candidates Cell) to the Regular stream and vice versa, shall carry as such the marks obtained in the preceding year(s).
- 7. Tutorials shall be held regularly for the post-graduate courses of the University by the concerned Department in cooperation with Colleges; and at least 25% marks shall be assigned for Internal Assessment in each paper of the post-graduate courses. The Internal Assessment in the post-graduate courses may be based on regularity and attendance; class tests and house examination; and written assignments, projects/term papers/seminars/fieldwork. Post-graduate courses where the weightage of Internal Assessment is 25 per cent or more, Departments may continue with the existing schemes.
- 8. In the case of a student who is selected as a member of the N.C.C. to participate in the annual N.C.C. Camps or is deputed to undertake Civil Defence work and allied duties, or in the case of a student who is enrolled in the National Service Scheme and is deputed to various public assignments by or with the approval of the Head of the institution concerned, or a student who is selected to participate in sports or other activities organized by the Inter-University Board or in national or international fixtures in games and sports approved by the Vice-Chancellor, or a student who is required to represent the University at the Inter-University Youth Festival, or a student who is required to participate in periodical training in the Territorial Army, or a student who is deputed by the College to take part in Inter-College sports, fixtures, debates, seminars, symposia or social work projects, or a student who is required to represent the College concerned in debates and other extracurricular activities held in other Universities or such other activities approved by the Vice-Chancellor, the following provision will apply:
- 8.1. A student in the categories listed above, will have to fulfil the requirement of written assignments and projects/term papers/seminars/field-work with the flexibility, however, that he/she may, if necessary, be allowed additional time for submission of written assignments.
- 8.2 A student in the categories listed above, who is unable to write the House Examination on account of his/her participation in such aforesaid activities, may be assessed by the College through an alternative mode in lieu of the House Examination. This may be done only in exceptional circumstances.
- 8.3 A student in the categories listed above, will get the benefit of attendance for Internal Assessment for the classes missed as per the existing provisions of Ordinance VII.2.(9)(a)(i).
- 9.1. The University reserves the right to review, and if necessary moderate the marks in Internal Assessment in any paper/ papers in any College/Department.
- 9.2. The respective University Moderation Committees in each subject shall moderate, if necessary, the Internal Assessment marks across Colleges.

- विशेष रुप से छात्र सभा या चुनावों के दौरान दुराचार या दुर्व्यवहार करने से बचें।

- कॉलेज गेट के बाहर बेवजह घूमना सख्त मना है।

अध्यादेश के तहत अनुशासन के अनुपालन हेतु शक्ति की व्यापकता के प्रति बिना किसी पूर्वग्रह के निम्न उल्लिखित कार्यों को घोर अनुशासनहीनता का कार्य माना जाएगाः

- दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय में किसी भी छात्र और किसी भी संस्था / विभाग के शिक्षक वर्ग और गैर शिक्षक वर्ग के किसी सदस्य पर शरीरिक हमला या शरीरिक शक्ति के प्रयोग की धमकी ।
- 2. हथियारों को अपने पास रखना, उसका प्रयोग करना या उसके प्रयोग की धमकी देना।
- 3. सिविल राइट्स प्रोटेक्शन ऐक्ट 1976 के प्रावधानों कर किसी तरह का उल्लंघन।
- 4. अनुसूचित जाति या जनजाति से संबंधित छात्राओं की स्थिति, गरिमा और सम्मान का उल्लंघन।
- 5. औरतों के प्रति किसी भी तरह के मौखिक या अन्य प्रकार से किए गए अपमानजनक कार्य।
- 6. किसी भी तरह की रिश्वत देने का प्रयास या किसी भी तरह का भ्रष्टाचार।
- 7. संस्था की संपत्ति का जानबूझकर नाश।

#### **Code of Conduct**

#### Students should avoid the following:

- Causing Disturbance in or outside rooms, the office, the library and the playgrounds.
- Refusal to participate in co-curricular or extra-curricular activities of the college or perform duties assigned to them.
- Misconduct or misbehavior of any kind especially during elections or students' meetings.
- Damage to the college building, property and books is strictly prohibited.
- Loitering outside the college gates is not allowed.
- Using or charging mobile phones in classrooms and corridors is strictly prohibited.

#### Students should comply with the following:

- Attendance in long assemblies on Wednesdays is compulsory.
- Membership of the college library is compulsory.
- Parents/Guardians are requested to cooperate with the college authorities in maintaining discipline and decorum in the college.
- Students are expected to be respectful to the faculty and staff of the college.
- Students should regularly see college notice boards and website for important information.

#### Ordinance XV-B. Maintenance of Discipline among Students of the University

- 1. All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Vice-Chancellor.
- 2. The Vice-Chancellor may delegate all or such powers as he/she deems proper to the Proctor and to such other persons as he/she may specify in this behalf.
- 3. Without prejudice to the generality of power to enforce discipline under the Ordinance, the following shall amount to acts of gross indiscipline:
  - (a) Physical assault, or threat to use physical force, against any member of the teaching and non-teaching staff of any Institution/Department and against any student within the University of Delhi;
  - (b) Carrying of, use of, or threat to use of any weapons;
  - (c) Any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act, 1976;
  - (d) Violation of the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes.
  - (e) Any practice-whether verbal or otherwise-derogatory of women;
  - (f) Any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner;
  - (g) Willful destruction of institutional property;
  - (h) Creating ill-will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds;
  - (i) Causing disruption in any manner of the academic functioning of the University system;
  - (J) Ragging as per Ordinance XV-C.

JDMC students are required to conduct themselves in a disciplined manner in the college premises and outside.

  - ग. कथित समय के लिए नहीं, विश्वविद्यालय की संस्था या विभाग, कॉलेज में पाठ्यक्रम के अध्यय हेतु स्वीकार की जा सकती है, या रोकी जा सकती है।
  - घ. निर्दिष्ट धनराशि का उस पर जुर्माना किया जा सकता है।
  - ड. एक या एक से अधिक साल के लिए विश्वविद्यालय या कॉलेज या परीक्षाओं से वंचित किया जा सकता है।
  - च. परीक्षा में छात्रा का परीक्षाफल या परीक्षा से संबंधित छात्रा या परीक्षा जिसमें वह उपस्थित हो चुकी हैं, को रह किया जा सकता है।
  - छ. कॉलेजों के प्राचार्यों के पास अपने कॉलेज के छात्र / छात्राओं पर अनुशासनात्मक शक्यों के प्रयोंग हेतु समस्त अधिकार सन्निहित होंगे। वे अपने अधिकारों का प्रयोग स्वयं या इस उद्देश्य के लिए हुए विभाग या संस्था या अपने कॉलेज के शिक्षकों को सौंप सकते हैं।

#### अध्यादेश 15 रैगिंग की मनाही तथा सजाः

- 1. दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय की किसी भी हिस्से में रैगिंग किसी भी तरह से संस्था या कॉलेज / विभाग के परिसर में अथवा जन परिवहन में सख्त मना है।
- 2. दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय के किसी भी हिस्से में रैगिंग किसी भी तरह से संस्था या कॉलेज / विभाग के परिसर में अथवा जन परिवहन में सख्त मना है।
- 3. किसी भी व्यक्ति या समूह के द्वारा रैगिंग को अंजाम देना एक घोर अनुशासनहीनता का कारण माना जाएगा और उससे इस अध्यादेश के तहत निपटा जाएगा।
- 4. इस अध्यादेश के अनुसार रैगिंग का तात्पर्य प्रभावशाली या वरिष्ठ छात्रों द्वारा नवागंतुक नामांकित छात्रों पर या कनिष्ठ छात्रों पर किसी व्यक्ति या समूह द्वारा किया जाने वाला कार्य, आचरण या अभ्यास जैसे—
  - क. शारीरिक हमला या शरीरिक शक्ति के प्रयोग की धमकी।

The Principal appoints a board of faculty members to take care of discipline among students with power to deal with breach of discipline.

- 4. Without prejudice to the generality of his/her powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of maintaining discipline as may seem to him/her appropriate, the Vice-Chancellor, may in the exercise of his/her powers aforesaid order or direct that any students of the University:
  - (a) be expelled; or
  - (b) be, for a stated period rusticated; or
  - (c) be not for a stated period, admitted to a course of courses of study in a College, Department or Institution of the University; or check
  - (d) be fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified; or
  - (e) be debarred from taking a University or College or Department Examination for one or more years; or
  - (f) that the result of the student or students concerned in the Examination or Examination in which he/she or they have appeared be cancelled.
- 5. The Principals of the Colleges shall have the authority to exercise all such disciplinary powers over students in their respective Colleges. They may exercise their authority through, or delegate authority to, such of the teachers in their Colleges, Institutions or Department as they may specify for these purposes.
- 6. The rules framed by the University may be supplemented, where necessary, by the Principal of the college. Each student is expected to provide herself with a copy of these rules. At the time of admission every student shall sign a declaration that on admission she shall submit herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice Chancellor and the several authorities vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Acts, Statutes and Ordinances framed by the University.

#### Ordinance XV-C. Prohibition of and Punishment for Ragging

- 1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
- 2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
- 3. Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which
  - a) Involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force;
  - (b) Violate the status, dignity and honour of women students;
  - (c) Violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes;
  - (d) Expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self esteem;
  - (e) Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behaviour.
- 4. The Principal of a College shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
- 5. Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also suo motto enquire into any incident

- ख. महिला छात्राओं के सम्मान, गरिमा और सामाजिक रिथति का अतिक्रमण।
- ग. अनुसूचित जाति और जनजाति से संबंधित छात्र / छात्राओं के सम्मान, गरिमा व सामाजिक स्थिति का उल्लंघन।
- घ. छात्रों का मजाक उड़ाना और तिरस्कार करना तथा उनके आत्मसम्मान को ठेस पहुँचाना।
- ङ मौखिक अपशब्द, आक्रामक तेवर, अशोभनीय संकेत और अभद्र व्यवहार करना।
- 5. रैगिंग से संबंधित किसी भी तरह की सूचना मिलते ही कॉलेज की प्राचार्य तुरंत कार्यवाही करेंगी।
- 6. उपरोक्त अनुच्छेद 4 में दी गई समस्त सूचनाओं के बावजूद, प्रोक्टर स्वयं रैगिंग की घटना के संबंध में जाँच—पड़ताल कर सकता है और उस घटना की प्रकृति और रैगिंग से जुड़े छात्रों के पहचान का विवरण बना कर वाइस चांसलर को भेज सकता है।
- 7. प्रोक्टर रैगिंग की घटना की प्रकृति और रैगिंग जैसे दुष्कृत्य को अंजाम देने वाले छात्रों की पहचान से संबंधित प्रथम विवरण जमा कर सकता है।
- 8. कॉलेज की प्राचार्या, विभागध्यक्ष या संस्था या प्रोक्टर को किसी कारणवश ऐसा प्रतीत हो कि इस तरह की जाँच—पड़ताल करना तार्किक रूप से व्यावहारिक नहीं है तो ऐसा लिखित रूप में दर्ज करते हुए इससे संबंधित परामर्श कुलपित को दे सकता है।
- 9. अगर कुलपति को ऐसा ज्ञात होता है कि इसकी जाँच—पड़ताल की आवश्यकता नहीं है तो उनका निर्णय अंतिम माना जाएगा।
- 10. धारा (5) या (6) के तहत रिपोर्ट की रसीद या धारा (7) के तहत संबद्घ विभाग द्वारा वर्णित घटनाओं में रैगिंग की घटना के खुलासे पर विचार और धारा 3 (a) और (c) में वाइस चांसलर छात्रा को एक वर्श में नियम समय सीमा हेतु सीधा या आदेश द्वारा निश्कासित कर सकता है।
- 11. रैगिंग के किसी भी मामले में कुलपित सीधे आदेश दे सकते हैं कि किसी छात्र या छात्रों को अध्यय पाठ्यक्रम में प्रवेश दें या एक अविध तक निष्कासित करें या न करें या कॉलेज, विभागीय परीक्षा के लिए एक या अधिक वर्शों तक या कि छात्र के परीक्षा परिणाम या परीक्षा में संबद्ध छात्र या परीक्षा जिसमें वह पास नहीं हुआ रद्द करें।
- 12. यदि किसी मामले में जिस किसी भी छात्र ने दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय की डिग्री वापस लेने के बाद उचित कार्यवाही की जाएगी।
- 13. इस अध्यादेश का उद्देश्य रैगिंग को उकसाने चाहे वह जिस भी तरीके से या कार्य या व्यवहार या रैगिंग को भड़काने हेतु हो उसका जुर्माना होगा।
- 14. दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय में आने वाले सारे संस्थानों के लिए इस अध्यादेश के तहत दिए गए सभी निर्देश मान्य होंगे ताकि इस अध्यादेश को दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय के कुलपित प्रभावकारी तरीके से लागू कर सकें।

#### नोट : अध्यादेश XV-C के अनुसरण के लिए कुलपति के आदेश

रैगिंग से सम्बन्धित घटना (घटनाओं) की सूचना, अध्यादेश में शामिल अगर किसी भी प्राधिकारी की तरफ से कुलपित को दी जाती है तो रैगिंग में शामिल छात्र / छात्रा या छात्रों को निर्दिष्ट आदेशानुसार निष्कासित किया जाएगा। रैगिंग में शामिल गैर शामिल गैर छात्र (जो कॉलेज में नहीं पड़ते) के खिलाफ भारतीय क्रिमिनल लॉ के तहत कार्रवाई की जाएगी। ऐसे गैर छात्र / छात्राएं अगले पांच साल तक दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय के किसी भी और न्याय का सख्त अनुपालन किया जाएगा।

#### 1. लघु शीर्षक और सीमा

- of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
- 6. The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
- 7. If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice- Chancellor accordingly.
- 8. When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
- 9. On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under Clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3(a), and (c) the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.
- 10. The Vice-Chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a course of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
- 11. In case any students who have obtained degrees of Delhi University are found guilty under this Ordinance appropriate action under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees conferred by the University shall be initiated.
- 12. For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way or any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.
- 13. All institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instruction/directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid and assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.

#### NOTE: ORDER OF THE VICE-CHANCELLOR in pursuance of Ordinance XV-C

Where incident(s) of ragging are reported to the Vice-Chancellor by any authority, the student(s) involved in ragging shall be expelled for a specified term, designated Non-students involved in reports of ragging will be proceeded with under the criminal law of India; they will also be rendered ineligible for a period of five years from seeking enrolment in any of the institutions of the University of Delhi. Students against whom necessary action is taken under this note, will be given post decisional hearing, with strict adherence to the rules of natural justice in the order.

#### XV-D-Sexual Harassment

Some significant aspects of Delhi University's Ordinance XV-D: Sexual Harassment are as follows (For details, please check the college website: www.jdm.du.ac.in):

#### 1. Short Title and Extent:

The present ordinance is based on the Policy against Sexual Harassment by the Delhi University and seeks to maintain and create an academic and work environment free of sexual harassment for students, academic and nonteaching staff of the Delhi University. The ordinance will also apply to outsiders and residents, on the Delhi University campus, to the extent specified herein these rules and procedures. "Sexual harassment" includes any unwelcome sexually determined behaviour, whether directly or by implication and includes physical contact and advances, a demand or request for sexual favours, sexually-coloured remarks, showing pornography or any other unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct of sexual nature.



#### नियम और विनियम

वर्तमान अध्यादेश दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा यौन उत्पीड़न के खिलाफ की नीति पर आधारित है छात्रों और दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय के शिक्षक और गैर शिक्षक कर्मचारियों के लिए यौन उत्पीड़न से मुक्त शैक्षिक और कार्य के वातावरण को बनाए रखने का प्रयास। यह अध्यादेश दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय परिसर में रह रहे निवासियों और बाहरी व्यक्तियों पर निर्दिष्ट किए हुए नियमों और प्रावधानों तक लागू होगा। यौन उत्पीड़न के तहत किसी भी प्रकार के अशोभनीय यौन निर्धारित व्यवहार, चाहे प्रत्यक्ष रूप से या निहितार्थ और जो शारीरिक संपर्क तथा उसके लिए आगे बढ़ने की चेष्टा को समेकित करता है, यौन—समर्थन के लिए निवेदन करना या कहना, यौन संबंधी टिप्पणी, अश्लील साहित्य दिखाना या अन्य किसी भी प्रकार का यौन संबंधी अशोभनीय शारीरिक, कथित या अकथित।

#### 2. "यौन उत्पीड़न" में शामिल होगा लेकिन निम्नलिखित तक ही सीमित नहीं किया जाएगाः

- क. दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय में अवसरों या सेवाओं की पात्रता या रोजगार प्रदर्शन, अतिरिक्त पाठ्यक्रम कार्यकलाप से संबंधित किसी भी निर्णय के आधार पर जब प्रत्यक्ष या अप्रत्यक्ष रूप में एक अप्रिय यौन संबंध स्थापित करने हेतु प्रस्तुत, यौन समर्थन के लिए निवेदन, और कथित या यौन प्रकृति का शारीरिक आचरण किया जाता है।
- ख. अप्रिय यौन संबंध, कथित, अकथित और / या शारीरिक आचरण जैसे अप्रिय टिप्पणी, संकेत या मजाक, पत्र, फोन करना या ई मेल, शारीरिक बनावट, अश्लील साहित्य का प्रदर्शन, भयंकर रूप से घूरना, शारीरिक संपर्क, पीछा, अपमानजनक प्रदर्शन या आवाजें, का उद्देश्य और या प्रभाव जब किसी व्यक्ति विशेष के व्यवहार के साथ दखलंदाजी करना या शत्रुतापूर्ण, डरा हुआ या आक्रामक वातावरण तैयार करना हो।
- ग. जब कोई व्यक्ति यौन उद्देश्य से अपने शरीर के किसी हिस्से को या किसी वस्तु को जो शरीर का ही विस्तार लगे, का किसी दूसरे व्यक्ति के संबंध में बिना उसकी स्वीकृति के या उसकी इच्छा के खिलाफ प्रयोग करता है तो इस तरह के व्यवहार को यौन अत्याचार कहते हैं।
- घ. जब प्रतिकूल टिप्पणी, आचरण या ऐसा कोई भी व्यवहार जो किसी व्यक्ति के यौन उन्मुखीकरण या लैंगिक पहचान पर आधारित है और / या जब विश्वविद्यालय के सार्वजिनक मंच या कक्षा का प्रयोग किसी व्यक्ति को कलंकित करने / तिरस्कृत करने या किसी व्यक्ति के लैंगिक पहचान / यौन उन्मुखीकरण के आधार पर शत्रुतापूर्ण माहौल बनाने के लिए किया जाता है।

#### 3. अध्यादेश के विषय-क्षेत्र / उद्देश्यः यह अध्यादेश सभी प्रकार की यौन उत्पीड्न की शिकायतों पर लागू होगा जो किया गया होः

- 1. विश्वविद्यालय के किसी एक सदस्य द्वारा विश्वविद्यालय के अन्य किसी सदस्य के विरुद्ध चाहे वह परिसर के बाहर या अंदर कथित रूप से किया गया है।
- 2. किसी निवासी द्वारा विश्वविद्यालय के किसी सदस्य के विरुद्ध या विश्वविद्यालय के किसी सदस्य के द्वारा किसी बाहरी व्यक्ति के विरुद्ध चाहे वह यौन उत्पीड़न परिसर के बाहर या अंदर कथित रूप से किया गया है।
- 3. किसी बाहरी व्यक्ति द्वारा विश्वविद्यालय के किसी सदस्य के विरुद्ध या विश्वविद्यालय के किसी सदस्य द्वारा किसी बाहरी व्यक्ति के विरुद्ध अगर यौन उत्पीडन परिसर के अंदर कथित रूप से किया गया है।
- 4. विश्वविद्यालय के किसी सदस्य द्वारा किसी बाहरी व्यक्ति के विरुद्ध अगर यौन उत्पीड़न परिसर के बाहर कथित रूप से किया गया हो ऐसी स्थिति में समिति सिफारिश करेगी कि विश्वविद्यालय का कॉलेज प्राधिकरण उचित प्राधिकारी से शिकायत कर जांच पड़ताल शुरू करे। इसके साथ ही समिति सक्रिय रूप से मदद करेगी और शिकायत को दर्ज करवाने में शिकायतकर्ता को उचित संसाधन मुहैया करवाएगी।

#### 4. शिकायत संरचना

#### 5. सुनवाई

दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय के प्रत्येक कॉलेज में शिकायत और विवरण समिति के रूप में होगी।

- 1. कॉलेज शिकायत समिति प्रशासनिक पद / वर्ग से कथित शोषण करने वाले निष्कासित करने के लिए कह सकता है अगर उसकी उपस्थिति जांच—पडताल में बाधा उत्पन्न करती है।
- 2. यौन उत्पीड़न के शिकार व्यक्ति के पास यह विकल्प होगा कि वह या तो अपना तबादला दूसरी जगह करवाए या शोषण का तबादला दूसरी जगह करवाए।
- 3. सेवा शर्तों से संबंधित किसी भी अन्य अध्यादेश की सामग्री आदि के होते हुए भी संस्था के प्रधान से जांच रिपोर्ट प्राप्त होने

#### 2. Explanation. "Sexual harassment" shall include, but will not be confined to the following

- (a) When submission to unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favours, and verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature are made, either implicitly or explicitly, a ground for any decision relating to employment, performance, extra-curricular activities, or entitlement to services or opportunities at the Delhi University.
- (b) When unwelcome sexual advances, and verbal, non-verbal and/or physical conduct such as loaded comments, remarks or jokes, letters, phone calls or e-mail, gestures, exhibition of pornography, lurid stares, physical contact, stalking, sounds or display of a derogatory nature have the purpose and/or effect of interfering with an individual's performance or of creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive environment.
- (c) When a person uses, with a sexual purpose, the body or any part of it or any object as an extension of the body in relation to another person without the latter's consent or against the person's will, such conduct will amount to sexual assault.
- (d) When deprecatory comments, conduct or any such behaviour is based on the gender identity /sexual orientation of the person and/or when the classroom or other public forum of the University is used to denigrate/discriminate against a person or create a hostile environment on the basis of a person's gender identity/sexual orientation.

#### 3. Scope of the Ordinance:

#### This Ordinance shall be applicable to all complaints of sexual harassment made:

- (i) by a member of the University against any other member of the University irrespective of whether the harassment is alleged to have taken place within or outside the campus.
- (ii) by a resident against a member of the University or by a member against a resident irrespective of whether the sexual harassment is alleged to have taken place within or outside the campus.
- (iii) by an outsider against a member of the University or by a member of the University against an outsider if the sexual harassment is alleged to have taken place within the campus.
- (iv) by a member of the university, against an outsider if the sexual harassment is alleged to have taken place outside the campus. In such cases the Committee shall recommend that the University college authorities initiate action by making a complaint with the appropriate authority. Further the committee will actively assist and provide available resources to the complainant in pursuing the complaint.

#### 4. Complaint Mechanism:

(i) College Complaints Committees, which shall be set up in each college of the University of Delhi as complaints and redressal bodies.

#### 5. Redressal:

- (i) CCC may ask the College to suspend the alleged harasser from an administrative post/class if his/her presence is likely to interfere with the enquiry.
- (ii) The victim of sexual harassment shall have the option to seek transfer of the perpetrator or her/his own transfer where applicable.
- (iii) Notwithstanding the contents of any other ordinance relating to service conditions etc., the head of the institution upon receipt of the enquiry report, shall refer the same to the Governing Body/Executive Council (EC) and take disciplinary action on the basis of recommendations of the Complaint Committees provided that in the case of termination of service the existing rules of the University will also be forwarded.
- (iv) The disciplinary action shall be commensurate with the nature of the violation.

#### ख. छात्रों के मामलों में अनुशासनात्मक कार्यवाही निम्न रूप में हो सकती है:

1. चेतावनी 2. लिखित माफीनामा 3. अच्छे व्यवहार का अनुबंधन 4. छात्रावास या परिसर में प्रवेश से निष्कासन 5. एक निर्दिष्ट अविध के लिए निलंबन 6. परिणाम रोकना 7. परीक्षा से निष्कासन 8. चुनाव लड़ने से निष्कासन 9. पद ग्रहण करने से निष्कासन 10. निष्कासन 11. प्रवेश में रोक 12. एक निर्धारित समयाविध के लिए अवांधित व्यक्ति के रूप में उत्पीड़क की घोषण 13. कोई अन्य प्रासंगिक व्यवस्था

#### ग. तीसरे पक्ष द्वारा उत्पीड़न के मामले में विश्वविद्यालय / कॉलेज प्राधिकरण उचित प्राधिकरण से शिकायत करके उचित कार्यवाही शुरू करेगा।

#### जानने का अधिकार

जानने का अधिकार (RTI) भारत सरकार के अनुसार है:

- 1. लोक प्राधिकरणों के नियंत्रण के तहत नागरिकों के लिए जानने उपयोग को सुरक्षित करने हेतु सूचना के अधिकार का व्यावहारिक शासन स्थापित करना, प्रत्येक लोक प्राधिकरण के कामकाज में पारदर्शिता और जवाबदेही को बढ़ावा देने के क्रम में और संविधान में केंद्रीय सूचना आयोग और राज्य सूचना आयोग के मामलों के लिए इससे संबंधित या उसके आनुशांगिक एक अधिनियम उपलब्ध करवाना।
- 2. जबिक भारत के संविधान में लोकतांत्रिक गणराज्य की स्थापना है,
- 3. और जबिक लोकतंत्र हेतु एक जानकार नागरिक और सूचना की पारदर्शिता की आवश्यकता है जो उसके कामकाज के लिए और भ्रष्टाचार को रोकने के लिए भी महत्त्वपूर्ण है और शासित सरकारों के प्रति जवाबदेह और उनके साधनों को धारण करने के लिए है।
- 4. और जबिक वास्तिवक व्यवहार में जानकारी का रहस्योद्घाटन संवेदनशील जानकारी की गोपनीयता का संरक्षण सरकार के अधिकतम इस्तेमाल के कुशल संचालन के सीमित वित्तीय संसाधनों सिहत और अन्य सार्वजिनक हितों के साथ संघर्ष की संभावना है
- 5. और जबिक यह इन परस्पर विरोधी हितों के अनुरूप लोकतांत्रिक आदर्श की सर्वोपरिता को संरक्षित रखने के लिए आवश्यक है।
- 6. और अब इसलिए यह नागरिकों की इच्छा को प्रस्तुत सुनिश्चित जानकारी को प्रदान करने के लिए फायदेमंद है। कॉलेज की प्राचार्या प्रथम अपील प्राधिकारी है। जितने भी जानकारी के अधिकार से संबंधित सभी मामलों की जिम्मेदारी कॉलेज जन सूचना अधिकारी की है।
- 7. यह भारतीय गणतंत्र के छप्पनवें वर्ष में संसद द्वारा अधिनियमित है।

- **C.** In the case of third party harassment, the University/College authorities shall initiate action by making a complaint with the appropriate authority.

#### **RIGHT TO INFORMATION**

According to Government of India, Right to Information (RTI) is

- (i) An Act to provide for setting out the practical regime of right to information for citizens to secure access to information under the control of public authorities, in order to promote transparency and accountability in the working of every public authority, the constitution of a Central Information Commission and State Information Commissions and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.
- (ii) WHEREAS the Constitution of India has established democratic Republic;
- (iii) AND WHEREAS democracy requires an informed citizenry and transparency of information which are vital to its functioning and also to contain corruption and to hold Governments and their instrumentalities accountable to the governed;
- (iv) AND WHEREAS revelation of information in actual practice is likely to conflict with other public interests including efficient operations of the Governments, optimum use of limited fiscal resources and the preservation of confidentiality of sensitive information;
- (v) AND WHEREAS it is necessary to harmonise these conflicting interests while preserving the paramountcy of the democratic ideal;
- (vi) According to the university, the first apellate authority of the college is the Principal, who is responsible for all matters pertaining to RTI in this institution.
- (vii) BE it enacted by Parliament in the Fifty-sixth Year of the Republic of India.

#### 3 - YEAR JOURNEY - RAISING AWARENESS FOR RETINOBLASTOMA

Retinoblastoma is the most common intraocular cancer in children. One out of 15,000 children suffer from this malignancy. Typically, parents notice that one or both pupils turn white and their child has difficulty seeing. In 2017, a university in New Delhi, India initiated a long-term project to detect that white eye reflex in children. It was spearheaded by Nirmala Muralihlar, the project coordinator of Janki Devi Memorial College, under the direction of Dr. Vikas Menon, their consultant ocular oncologist. What began as a student faculty project, in November 2017, it transformed into a larger initiative where a Non Governmental Organization (NGO), ophthalmologists, ocular oncologists from specialty eye cancer centers collaborated to create awareness for early detection of retinoblastoma cancer.

The long-term goals of this project included sensitizing families to the appearance of the white eye reflex, stirring awareness amongst doctors about retinoblastoma and prompting parents to be aware of their children's eye health. Using photography as a tool for early detection, they created awareness of children with special needs who suffer from retinoblastoma. Though these objectives were slowly accomplished over 3 years, there were many activities, learning opportunities, and research studies presented to educate the public. The Strides for Retinoblastoma was most profound and heartfelt, as an RB survivor led a walk with over 200 people during World Cancer Day on February 4, 2018.

While many research studies are able to spread awareness of retinoblastoma within the bealthcare professional world, this initiative is unique as its audience was varied. It included parents, children and healthcare workers. All were involved in this coordinated campaign to save both vision and life. The Eye Cancer Foundation continues to be determined to create awareness of retinoblastoma, to supply trained eye cancer specialists to underserved communities and is more than proud to announce the success of the JDMC awareness campaign.






















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
