ACTION TO BE TAKEN REPORT:



ACTION TO BE TAKEN REPORT:



ACTION TO BE TAKEN REPORT:



OBSERVATIONS:

Based on the survey it is found that 100% of the class found the course enabling them engage in a sociological interpretation of society and culture. ACTION TO BE TAKEN REPORT:







ACTION TO BE TAKEN REPORT:
