They also expressed a growing interest in the genres of poetry and short stories introduced in this course and how these concepts relate to the social structures they live in. 88.2% of the students also felt that their language skills also improved as a result of studying this course. 94.1% of the students had more than 67% and above attendance.


ACTION TO BE TAKEN REPORT:

Paper 13: Modern European Drama



OBSERVATIONS:

58.3% students strongly agreed that the course contributed to my understanding of Modern Indian drama and performance. 25% agreed with the statement whereas 16.7% felt neutral towards it. The same statistics were reflected in the responses for the question on reading texts like Nabanna and Procession is important for students of EnglishLiterature. Half of the students strongly agreed that the course helped them in understanding concepts like proscenium, street theatre, third theatre, audience

participation clearly. Similarly, the responses reflected the same number of students for each component for the quersion on

interpreting and analysing an Indian play with respect to performance traditions now. 41.7% strongly agreed that their ability to express themselves in writing and speech improved, 41.7% agreed with this and 8.3% strongly disagreed.

For the DSE: Speculative Fiction and Detective Literature paper, 59.1% strongly agreed that they understand the importance of this course. 31.8% agreed with this and the remaining students in equal numbers disagreed and were neutral. 81.8% of students strongly agreed that understanding why reading different genres of literature like speculative fiction and detective stories is also important for students of English Hons and 13.6% agreed with this, the remaining were neutral.

69.6% strongly agreed with the statement that they understand concepts like science fiction, detection, crime novels and different sub-genres like the police procedural, cosy murder mystery, locked room mystery, noir,thriller, spy story etc. now. 21.7% agreed with this and 8.7% were neutral. For the question on interpreting and analysing a text better now, 56.5% strongly agree and 34.8% agreed, and 8.7% students remained neutral. 50% of the students said they strongly agreed that their ability to express yourself in writing and speech has improved, the remaining disagreed.














OBSERVATIONS:

For the SEC Paper, Translation Studies form's given responses, it is observed that around over 53% of students had over 67% attendance/above. 37.5% students stated that they had between 50% to 67%. 50% of students strongly agreed and 50% agreed that they learned about major theoretical concepts like Equivalence, Code Switching, Code Mixing, Transliteration, Back Translation etc.

56.3% of students strongly agreed that they became more aware of the different types of writings/ texts and genres and that they needed different strategies of translations. 37.5% agreed with the same statement, and 6.2 % were neutral regarding it. 62.5% of the students said that they strongly agreed that they were aware of the different modes of translation like Semantic Translation LiteralTranslation, Free Translation, Official Translation, Subtitling Dubbing, Interpretation Etc. 37.5% of students agreed with this statement.

50% of students strongly agreed that they could attempt some basic translations of Proverbs/Idioms, Advertisements/ Taglines,Newspaper Headings, Series/Scenes from Films etc. 43.8% agreed with this and the remaining students were neutral regarding this statement.

56.3% students said they agreed that they were aware of issues of Language and its relationship with Gender, Class and Casteand its relevance to translation. I am also familiar with Machine based applications and their use and limitations in translation, whereas 37.5% strongly agreed with this statement. The remaining stated they were neutral.

SEC 8: Modes of Creative Writing: Poetry, Fiction and Drama

62.5% strongly agreed that the course contributed to their understanding of Creative Writing and how it is different from Academic writing. 50% of students agreed they had been introduced to a variety of tropes and figures of speech and have a better understanding of the various nuances of literary language. 43.8% strongly agreed with this and the rest remained neutral. Half of the students, said they understand concepts like plot, setting, characterisation, narrative style, meter and other such technical terms involved in writing a short story, poem and a play. 37.5% strongly agreed with this, and 12.5% remained neutral. 50% of the students mentioned they had strongly been encouraged to revise and edit my work and inculcate the skills of editing for publishing my work. 37.5% stated that they agreed with the statement and

12.5% said they were neutral. 56.3% agreed that my ability to express myself creatively has improved and they can put down my ideas more comprehensively and 37.5% agreed with this statement. The remaining were neutral.

Overall, the feedback has been positive and insightful
