
Methods and Approaches to Comparative Politics

The paper offers in-depth discussion on methods, different approaches in terms of their advantages and disadvantages to help understand politics in a critical-comparative framework. Students would be made familiar to the diversity of approaches to study politics such as institutionalism, political culture, political economy and specific debates within each of the approaches. Discussion on a diversity of approaches will highlight different tools, perspectives and parameters to understand the behaviour and functioning of institutions in a political system. This paper would also impart students the ability to use the analytical frame of gender with reference to specific issues like the women's political representation in comparative perspective. The paper will inculcate reflective thinking and research aptitude students as they will learn to apply these critical outlooks in understanding politics and political processes, particularly from the perspective of developing societies.





Analysis

Out of 110 students, 73 responded to the survey. Among them, 41.1% *strongly agreed* and 54.8% *agreed* that their ability to understand politics from a critical and comparative perspective improved as a result of this course.

Approximately 90% of respondents acknowledged the importance of understanding and researching gender-related issues within the context of comparative politics.

Over 95% agreed that they gained insight into the diverse approaches to studying comparative politics.

Overall, the feedback from students has been highly positive and encouraging.


Action Taken



Action to Be Taken





Observation

The responses from the students suggested that they found the course and pedagogy very helpful and effective. Through this course, 96 percent students were able to gain an understanding about the Indian constitution and its basic features. The course enabled 94 percent students to develop understanding about their constitutional rights, obligations and duties as citizens of the country. The course also succeeded in familiarizing 92 percent of students about the functioning of constitutional governance in India and the powers divided between different tiers of government respectively. Attendance of the students remained a cause of concern as only 57 percent students attended more than 67 percent attendance in the given course, while 38 percent students had attendance between 50 and 67 percent. Six percent

students had less than 50 percent of attendance. Overall, the student gave positive feedback about the course and expressed full satisfaction with the structure, pedagogy and assessment methods employed in the course.

Action Taken Report

Though the students did not give any suggestions to improve the pedagogy, yet to make course more interesting and engaging more integrative and interactive pedagogical methods will be employed in future such as case study, problem solving, flip classroom etc. to make the course more interesting for the students.

Action to Be Taken



Course Specific Outcomes

Based on student feedback, the course was effective in achieving its learning outcomes. Over half of the students agreed that it improved their understanding of the core concepts of public administration. Around 90% felt it clearly explained the complex institutional structures in India. Nearly all students found the course helpful in understanding decentralisation issues, while 93.9% agreed it clarified the foundations of local governance in both rural and urban areas. 
Based on the feedback received, following outcome have been observed:



OBSERVATIONS:

From the given responses, it can be summarised that 41% of the students strongly agreed that the course enabled them to understand Indian cultural traditions and heritage, while 38.5% agreed and 17.9% remained neutral. However, 2.6% of students strongly disagreed with the view. Further, 38.5% of students strongly agreed that the course provided them with an understanding of complex issues such as environment and gender, while 43.6% agreed, 15.4% remained neutral and 2.6% strongly disagreed with the view. In addition, 38.5% of the students strongly agreed that the course enabled them to understand communication skills such as empathetic listening and considerate speaking, while 43.6% agreed, 15.4% remained neutral and 2.6% strongly disagreed. This suggests that the majority of students have reached a consensus on the effectiveness of the course in helping them understand and gain knowledge on Indian cultural traditions and heritage, as well as complex contemporary issues such as environment and gender. While a very small percentage of students (2.6%) strongly disagreed with these aspects, the overall agreement reflects the course's positive impact in broadening students' perspectives towards the course. In terms of attendance observations, 30.8% students had above 67% attendance, while 41% had their attendance between 50-67% and 28.2% had less than 50% attendance.




Action to be taken






