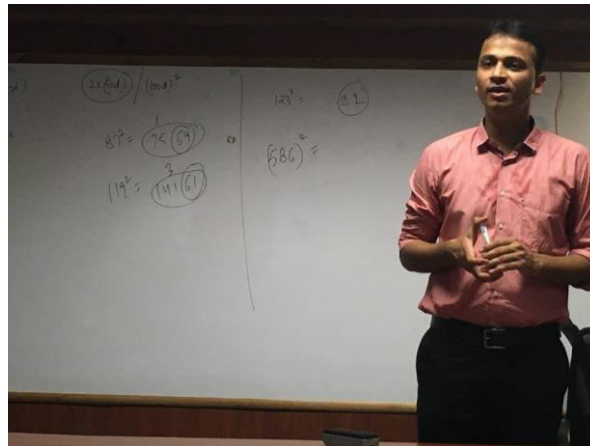
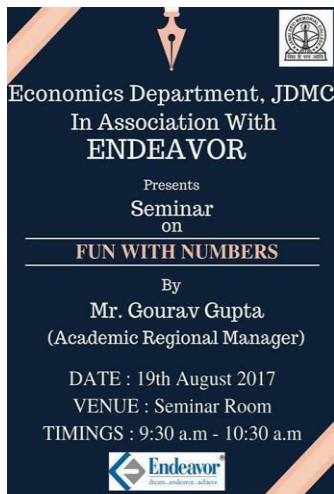


## Seminar

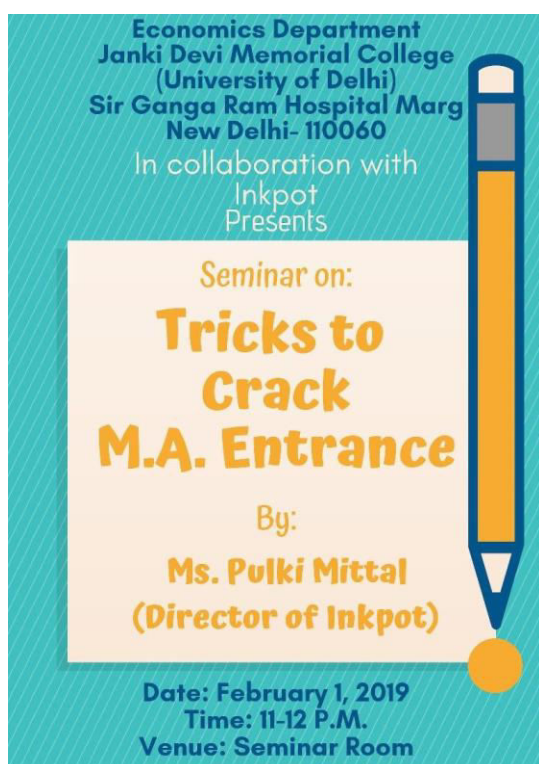
### “Fun with Numbers”

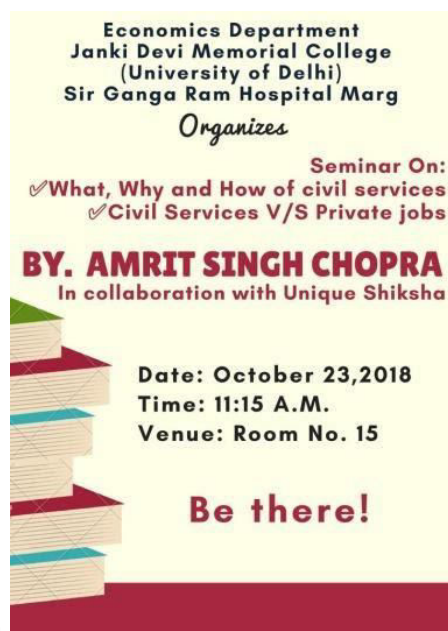

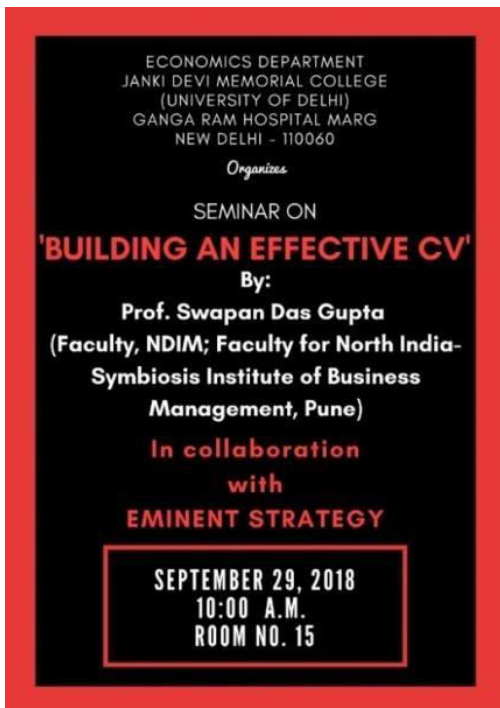

5) The Department conducted a seminar on **“Personal Financial Planning”** in collaboration with **National Stock Exchange, NSE**, on October 10-11, 2018


## National Webinar on “Monetary Policy Framework in India”
