


Online NEP Orientation Session for Optional Courses, 26th November 2025

Workshop on “Data Collection and Field Work Report”, 11th November 2025

The Heritage – The History Association organised a workshop on “Data Collection and Field Work Report” on 11 November 2025, with the objective of familiarising students with the theoretical and practical dimensions of field-based research. The workshop was aimed at enhancing students’ understanding of data collection techniques and strengthening their ability to translate field experiences into structured academic reports. The workshop was conducted by Dr Nupurnima Yadav, Assistant Professor, Department of Sociology, Delhi School of Economics, University of Delhi. Dr. Yadav began the session by outlining the significance of fieldwork in the social sciences, emphasising its value for generating empirical insights and grounding theoretical arguments in lived realities. She discussed different methods of data collection, including interviews, surveys, participant observation, and the use of questionnaires, highlighting their respective advantages and limitations.

A key focus of the workshop was on maintaining ethical standards during fieldwork, such as informed consent, confidentiality, and reflexivity. Dr. Yadav also provided practical guidance on note-taking, organising field data, and presenting findings coherently in the form of a fieldwork report. Attention was given to linking data with research questions and existing literature to ensure analytical depth. The session was interactive, with students raising questions related to field challenges and report writing. Overall, the workshop was highly informative and contributed significantly to developing students’ research skills, reaffirming The Heritage – The History Association’s commitment to experiential and methodologically sound learning.

Online Workshop on Dissertation Track for Fourth-Year Students, 3 November 2025

Heritage – The History Association organised an Online Workshop on the Dissertation Track for Fourth-Year students on 3 November 2025, with the aim of guiding students through the conceptual, methodological, and practical dimensions of writing a history dissertation. The workshop was designed to address the specific academic needs of 4th -year students who are required to undertake independent research as part of their programme. The workshop was conducted by Dr Abhinav Mishra, who focused on familiarising students with the overall structure and expectations of a history dissertation. The session emphasised on the importance of clarity of argument, coherence of structure, and critical engagement with both primary and secondary sources.

Dr. Mishra also discussed methodological issues such as source selection, archival research, and the ethical use of evidence. Practical guidance was offered on proposal writing, citation practices, and managing timelines, helping students understand how to plan and sustain long-term research work. The workshop further highlighted common challenges faced by students, including narrowing down themes and maintaining analytical focus, and suggested strategies to overcome them. The session was interactive, with students actively participating and seeking clarifications regarding their individual research interests. Overall, the workshop proved to be highly beneficial, equipping fourth-year students with essential tools and confidence to undertake their dissertation work effectively, while reinforcing Heritage – The History Association's commitment to academic mentoring and research-oriented learning.



10th Dr. Vijay Nath Memorial Lecture, 27th October 2025

Heritage – The History Association organised the 10th Dr. Vijay Nath Memorial Lecture on 27 October 2025, continuing its tradition of commemorating the scholarly legacy of Dr. Vijay Nath through engagements with cutting-edge historical research. The memorial lecture series serves as an important academic platform for dialogue on themes central to early Indian history, culture, and historiography. The theme for this year's lecture was "Myth, Memory and Place-making in Early Kashmir", delivered by Prof. Shonaleeka Kaul, Centre for Historical Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University. In her lecture, Prof. Kaul explored the complex interrelationship between mythological narratives, collective memory, and the construction of sacred and political landscapes in early Kashmir. Drawing upon literary texts, inscriptions, and spatial traditions, she demonstrated how myths were not merely stories but active agents in shaping historical consciousness and place-making processes.

The lecture highlighted methodological approaches that move beyond rigid distinctions between myth and history, instead emphasising memory as a dynamic force in historical production. Prof. Kaul's nuanced analysis offered valuable insights into early Kashmir's cultural and intellectual world, while also raising broader questions relevant to the study of early South Asian histories. The session concluded with an engaging interaction between the speaker and the audience. Overall, the lecture was intellectually enriching and reaffirmed Heritage – The History Association's commitment to fostering rigorous historical scholarship and academic dialogue.





Movie Screening of *Antarjali Yatra*, 9th October 2025

Heritage – The History Association organised a special screening of the acclaimed Bengali film *Antarjali Yatra* on 9 October 2025 as part of its efforts to use cinema as a pedagogical tool for understanding history, society, and culture. The event aimed to encourage faculty members and students to engage with visual narratives as historical texts that open up discussions on social practices, belief systems, and marginalised voices.

Antarjali Yatra, directed by Gautam Ghosh, is set in nineteenth-century Bengal and offers a powerful critique of patriarchal customs and ritualised violence, particularly the practice of burying widows alive along riverbanks. The screening provided the audience with an opportunity to reflect on the intersections of history, gender, religion, and reform, as well as the role of cinema in representing historical realities with sensitivity and depth. Following the screening, a discussion session was conducted by faculty members Dr Tara Sheemar, Dr Akanksha Kumar, Dr Nirmal Kumar and Dr Abhinav Mishra. The discussants highlighted the historical context of the film, drawing connections with nineteenth-century social reform movements and debates around widowhood, caste, and agency. They also examined the cinematic language of the film, including symbolism, narrative structure, and the use of landscape as a historical metaphor.

The discussion was interactive, with participants raising questions about the limits and possibilities of cinema as a source for historical understanding. Overall, the event was intellectually engaging and underscored the value of interdisciplinary approaches in history teaching. The screening reaffirmed Heritage – The History Association's commitment to innovative pedagogical practices that combine historical inquiry with cultural analysis.



Pedagogy Workshop, 14th August 2025

Heritage – The History Association organised a pedagogy workshop for its faculty members on 14 August 2025, with the objective of encouraging critical reflection on history teaching and fostering innovative classroom practices. The workshop brought together distinguished historians and educators whose work has significantly shaped contemporary historical scholarship and pedagogy. The sessions were conducted by Prof. Salil Misra, Ambedkar University, Delhi; Prof. Saifuddin Ahmad, University of Delhi; and Prof. Aniruddh Deshpande, University of Delhi. Each speaker addressed different dimensions of pedagogy, drawing upon their extensive research and teaching experience.

Prof. Salil Misra focused on the relationship between historiography and classroom practice, emphasising the need to introduce students to debates, methods, and the politics of knowledge production rather than treating history as a fixed narrative. Prof. Saifuddin Ahmad discussed strategies for engaging students with social and cultural histories, highlighting the importance of interdisciplinarity and the use of diverse sources to make history more inclusive and accessible. Prof. Aniruddh Deshpande reflected on teaching modern and contemporary history, stressing critical reading, archival sensibility, and the pedagogical value of connecting historical themes to present-day concerns. The workshop was interactive in nature, with faculty members actively participating in discussions and sharing classroom experiences. 




Lecture on Partition Horrors Remembrance Day, 13th August 2025

The Department of History, Janki Devi Memorial College, University of Delhi, organized an online lecture on the occasion of *Partition Horrors Remembrance Day* on 13 August 2025. The lecture was delivered by Dr. Bhuwan Kumar Jha, Associate Professor, Department of History, University of Delhi, and witnessed enthusiastic participation from faculty members, students. Dr. Jha, in his address, offered a nuanced exploration of the Partition, underlining the complexities of communal relations, political decisions, and the challenges faced by the displaced populations. Drawing upon archival sources, oral histories, and personal narratives, he emphasized how the horrors of Partition transcended mere statistics of displacement and loss, becoming a profound human tragedy. He also discussed the resilience and struggles of ordinary people who rebuilt their lives amidst the wreckage of violence and division. The event concluded with a vote of thanks by the faculty, expressing gratitude to Dr. Jha for his insightful and moving lecture. The session proved to be a valuable reminder of the enduring relevance of Partition studies in understanding India's contemporary socio-political fabric.





Orientation Session for First-Year Students, 4th August 2025
