

FOUNDER OF THE COLLEGE



Shri Brij Krishan Chandiwala
(1900 - 1986)

Shri Brij Krishan Chandiwala, the founder of Janki Devi Memorial College was born in 1900 in a reputed family. As the third son of a flourishing silver merchant's family, there were no domestic pressures on him to join the family business. After the early demise of his wife, he joined the freedom movement led by Gandhiji. His mother's entreaties to remarry fell on deaf ears. Brij Krishanji became a true disciple of Gandhiji. He went to jail several times during the freedom movement. When Gandhiji started the agitation against the Salt Law, Brij Krishanji took an oath to give up salt and sugar for life. He was forced to break this vow in the last days of his life on health grounds.

At Gandhiji's behest, he had a prayer temple built in a Harijan Colony. He started the Delhi chapter of the Bharat Sewak Samaj, an organization for the upliftment of the downtrodden.

In 1959, Shri VKRV Rao, the then Vice-Chancellor of Delhi University appealed to the wealthy philanthropists of the city to come forward to open girls colleges in Delhi. It was then, that Brij Krishanji who had no children, donated all his inherited wealth to the family trust Shri Banarsidas Chandiwala Sewa Smarak Society which in turn funded the establishment of Janki Devi Memorial College in memory of his late mother Smt. Janki Devi.

Today Brij Krishanji is remembered for his social service and closeness to Gandhiji. When Nathuram Godse fired that fatal shot, Bapu fell backward into the arms of Brij Krishanji who was sitting right behind him. Till his very end, this great visionary remained our mentor and guide.

THE COLLEGE

Janki Devi Memorial College (JDMC) is a Women's college affiliated to the University of Delhi. The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore, has accredited the College with an A-Plus grade and a score of 3.43 in its second cycle of accreditation in 2023. It is also the only college of the University of Delhi to have been awarded the prestigious ISO 21001:2018 and ISO 9001:2015 certification. Recently, the Principal received the esteemed 'Jury Award' from COAE International on behalf of the College, and the College was recognized as a 'Joyful Institution'.

The Founder, Shri Brij Krishna Chandiwala, a renowned Gandhian who participated in the Indian National Movement, established the College in 1959 in memory of his mother, Smt. Janki Devi. Late Prime Minister Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru laid the Foundation Stone. The College offers education in Liberal Arts, Social Sciences, Mathematics and Commerce.

Beyond the curriculum, the College offers short-term add-on courses on topics ranging from Human Values: Problems and Prospects; SSB Preparations; Banking in Atmanirbhar Bharat; NGO Management; Yoga; Understanding Gender; Acupressure; early intervention for children with disabilities, kathak, AI, Legal Literacy and awareness and Gender and Sexuality. The Pratibha Foundation courses provide foundational knowledge as orientation for various competitive examinations.

JDMC boasts of a well-stocked, air-conditioned and well-lit Library with more than ninety thousand books and subscriptions to 69 (national and international) journals/magazines and 11 newspapers (English and Hindi) catering to the differing needs of students. The Library is fully computerized equipped with the Web-based Libsys Software. The database is updated daily and several terminals including twenty-five laptops with internet are provided for teachers to search online documents. An e-Resource Centre, attached to the Library, has forty laptops to access the online resources available for teachers and students. To provide equal access to the visually challenged, the Library has installed a screen reading software, NVDA. Braille books and talking books are also arranged. JDMC hosts an Annual Library Festival encompassing Talks by luminaries and various competitive events related to books.

Apart from providing all stakeholders – students, Faculty and non-teaching staff – with a pleasing, motivational environment, the College offers facilities and infrastructure to create a holistic atmosphere for the pursuit of academic and extra-curricular activities and a well-regulated administration. To achieve these ends, the College has a well-designed office block; spacious, ventilated Classrooms, Union Room,

IQAC Room, Common Room, a three-bedded Medical Room with modern facilities including an ECG machine, oxygen cylinder, and a sanitary napkin vending machine; photo-copying facilities; comfortable staff room; departmental rooms; seminar hall; committee room; computer labs, a large and modern cafeteria; an open air auditorium and two research rooms for teachers.

Sports receives a lot of encouragement and there is a state-of-the-art basketball court, a hockey and football field; a softball /throw ball/ volleyball, lawn tennis court and an open gymnasium. The Faculty undergoes an annual Academic audit done by External Academic Auditors while the Administrative and Accounts Departments undergo both External and Internal audits. The College also undergoes an environment audit.

In order to encourage research, the College has established a Research Centre where students are trained to handle research projects by teachers and some of these projects have now been published. Focused attention is given to e-Resources, Career Counselling, Skill Enhancement, Gender Equity, Indian Knowledge Systems, Extension Activities, National and International collaborations and Disability inclusivity through the eight other Centres bearing the same names.

The College has begun publishing an annual blind peer reviewed e-journal called *Perspectives*, for which academics from across the world have been writing; four issues of the journal are already available. Besides, the College has an annual magazine called *Janki* and several departments/clubs have their own journals/magazines/ blogs such as the Economics, Political Science, Sociology, Philosophy, English Departments and Impreneurs, the e-Cell. Aamdani, the Finance and Investment Club, publishes a newsletter.

There are at least 36 Clubs and Societies, which provide a platform to students for their many talents and skills. The College's NCC is considered the best among the five DGBN women's colleges. It has won the NCC Achiever's Award for Most Active Girls College by the NCC Alumni Club of Delhi for three years in succession. In 2025, the JDMC NCC was awarded the Best Institution (2nd runner up- SW Coy) under the Delhi Directorate, by the Lt. Governor of Delhi. During the pandemic, both the NCC and the NSS, along with the Centre for Extension Activities, the Alumnae Association and the staff, facilitated many people materially and medically and continue to do so, through various tie-ups such as with Robin Hood Army and Goonj. Two villages and slum areas are also being mentored by the students of HDPE and NSS. Impreneurs, the Entrepreneurship Cell, has started Project Anupam which aims to provide an online facility to students for selling products made by them such as paintings and perishable items. Many students have started selling products made by them through the Project.

The College endeavours to be a green college and the lush gardens are prize-winning; each year the lawns win prizes at the University Flower Show. The College has also won awards for its lawns at other horticultural organizations such as the Indraprastha Horticultural Society. More than 100 plants/ herbs and trees are planted annually. Among the green initiatives of the College, the rain water harvesting system which won the Chief Minister's Prize, the Herbal Garden with over 100 herbs, the efforts to ban plastic, the composting of garden waste, the paper recycling, and e-waste disposal (the last in collaboration with an NGO, Chintan) stand out. Green practices aside, the College has several good practices for the disabled which includes disabled-friendly toilets, braille signage, tactiles on the major pathways for easy movement, ramps and braille books and software as also an active Equal Opportunities Cell, that strives to provide the same opportunities to all. The College was recognized by the Ministry of Education for its excellent environmental practices and was awarded as the District Green Champion for academic year 2021-22 by the Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education (MGNCRE). Furthermore, the MGNCRE recognized the college as a Swachhata Action Plan Institution as also a Sustainable Campus. The College has been consistently winning the District Green Champion Award for Central Delhi by National Edutrust of India.

Existing infrastructural facilities are consistently improved in the College. Multimedia set-ups have been installed in several classrooms. Smart boards in classrooms, four Computer Labs, a full-fledged e-Resource Room, a Recording Studio (Lecture Capturing System), Language Lab facilities offering five

languages, are available. The College boasts of a beautiful hostel for 105 outstation students, inaugurated by the Hon'ble former President of India, Late Shri Pranab Mukherjee.

The College has an active Placement Cell that promotes placement through on-campus interviews and internships. The students are encouraged to take up internships and many are well placed in companies, while others opt for higher studies. Some opt for competitive exams and the Pratibha Foundation trains students for the same. NCC Cadets have been inducted as officers in the Indian Armed Forces and Police Forces. In the last academic session, the College successfully facilitated placements for twenty-seven students across thirty-three renowned companies, including EY, Accenture, Optum, Corizo, Teachnook, Innovist, etc. The placed students have secured roles such as Business Development Associate, Assurance Core, Tax Analyst, and Accounting Analyst. Furthermore, around eighty students have benefited from various internship opportunities provided by the Cell, securing positions in twenty-two companies like Skill Tank, KRG, Womenite, Prodigal AI, and Social Parindee, etc.

Remedial classes, mentorship and counseling for students help them to fare well in subjects they find difficult as well as maintain good emotional health. Grievance redressal is actively undertaken through regular feedback, student faculty meetings and an open-door policy. The Faculty is among the best in the University, having many publications to their credit, and being recipients of many annual scholarships and awards. The College pays attention to capacity building and skill enhancement of not only its students but also of its teachers and non-teaching staff. Both are encouraged and financially supported to participate in FDPs, Refresher Courses and Orientation Programmes. The active IQAC Centre of the College also conducts many such Workshops and FDPs.

Academic rigour is reflected not just through the pedagogical methods and use of ICT by teachers, but also through the Academic Audit and robust feedback mechanisms of the College, including monthly student-Faculty meetings and annual feedback forms. This is also visible through the number of Conferences / Seminars / Talks held by different Departments as also in the mentor-mentee system, the remedial classes and the special attention paid to Pedagogy as evidenced in the series of books that are being published by Departments focusing on teaching methods. Apart from these and the individual and Departments' publications, the College has published several books under the Rediscovering Delhi Project ; a book documenting the history of the College titled *All our Yesterdays* and a book titled *Tribes of India: Realities and Representations*.

The College is a mentoring institution under the Vidya Vistar Scheme for the Mahatma Gandhi Government College, Mayabunder, Andamans, as also for the Devnar Foundation for the Blind in Hyderabad. Apart from the inclusion of stakeholders from MGCC and Devnar Foundation in JDMC's classes, courses and conferences, a national seminar has been held as a collaborative venture between JDMC and MGCC, while, a series of collaborative ventures and activities have commenced with the Devnar Foundation.

The College constantly endeavours to set new benchmarks for itself and give students a global platform to spread their wings. With this intent, the Centre for National and International Collaborations has only recently signed MoUs with the following: I. Research Centre for the Study of Eastern Culture and Heritage, Tashkent State University of Orientation Studies, Uzbekistan II. Samarkand Institute of Economics and Service, Samarkand, Uzbekistan III. Research Tourism Development Institute, Uzbekistan IV. Oriental University, Tashkent, Uzbekistan V. Margilan Technikum of Tourism and Cultural Heritage, Silk Road International University VI. Sherubtse College, University of Bhutan VII. BITS, Pilani (Pilani Campus) VIII. Furthermore, the Sanskrit department has signed an MoU with Kelaniya University Colombo. It is foreseen that in times to come, student and faculty exchange programmes will open avenues to greater opportunities of learning and progress.

The College believes in inclusivity and decentralization as well as participative governance. Stakeholders are a part of many Committees, including the IQAC, and play a constructive role in the development of the College. The College is prompt in resolving any grievance that are be brought to its notice. In order to do so, it has several active Committees in place, and adopts effective mechanisms for redressal.





PROF. SWATI PAL, PRINCIPAL

Dr. Swati Pal, Professor and Principal, has been a member of the Department of English, Janki Devi Memorial College, University of Delhi for the past thirty years. She has been a Fulbright Nehru Fellowship Awardee (2024), Charles Wallace Scholar (1997 and 2008), as well as the John McGrath Theatre Studies Scholar (2005) at Edinburgh University. She was the first Asian to receive the Award.

Prof. Pal has published widely and is the author of the book, *Look Back at Anger: Agit Prop Theatre in Britain from the Sixties to the Nineties*, and a co-author of the books, *A Handbook of Academic Writing and Composition* and *Creative Writing: A Beginner's Manual*. She has edited a volume of essays on *Modern European Drama: From Ibsen to Beckett, Indo-Australian Connections: Retrospect and Prospects* and *From Canon to COVID: Transforming English Literary Studies in India*. She has translated Premchand's stories into English and has written essays on a variety of subjects. She has also reviewed a number of books and written several newspaper articles that articulate her views on education and reflect her interest in drama. A fine poet, Prof. Pal's poems feature in several anthologies. She also has two anthologies of her poems titled, *In Absentia*, and *Forever Yours*, along with a curated collection titled *Living On*.

Prof. Pal has presented a number of Papers at both national and international conferences and has lectured at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival, where she spoke on the life and works of John McGrath. She is a Resource Person for many Workshops on Performance Studies, Creative Writing, etc.

She is the Vice-President of the Indian Association for Commonwealth Literature and Language Studies (IACLALS), and a member of the Executive Body of the Indian Association for the Study of Australia (IASA). Prof. Pal has been a member of many Committees of the University of Delhi, such as, the Standing





Committee on Academic Matters to the Academic Council; the Music Courses Admission Committee; the Platinum Jubilee Celebrations Committee of the Department of Library and Information Sciences, University of Delhi; the B.A. Programme Committee; the University Court, Delhi University Centenary Celebrations Committee; the ECA Admissions Committee of the University of Delhi, among others. She is also a member of the NAAC Peer Team, and has undertaken several Peer Team visits to grade HEI's across the country.

Prof. Pal was felicitated by the Women's Agency for Generating Employment (WAGE) for her outstanding contribution in the field of educational planning and administration as well as gender development. She has also been the recipient of the Award of "Exceptional Women of Excellence" in Academia for 2017, by the All-Ladies League and the Women Economic Forum (WEF). She was awarded the Dr. S. Radhakrishnan Memorial National Teacher Award in 2018. In 2023, she received the Jury Award from COAE International for her contribution in the education sector. Among other awards, the National EduTrust of India conferred on her, the Best Principal Award, for her dedication to environmental excellence on 5 June 2024, as also the Eco Visionary Certificate on 12 September 2024, for her visionary leadership and unwavering dedication to environmental sustainability. She is also the recipient of the Japan Hindi Bhushan Samman from *Hindi ki Goonj Patrika*, on 30 November, 2024.

As a Principal, Prof. Pal has endeavoured to create a workplace that offers facilities for quality teaching and learning as well as out-of-the-classroom education. She believes that an educational institution must strive to excel, not just in academics but in the creation of informed citizens who contribute meaningfully to society. Hence, she has encouraged the creation of an atmosphere of discussion and healthy debate about all contemporary issues and has provided a platform to students as well as staff to voice their views and hone their skills. She has also made efforts to enhance infrastructural facilities for a comfortable, sustainable ecosystem that is conducive to the teaching-learning process.

Prof. Pal believes that it is the collective responsibility of all stakeholders to take the College to new levels of success. She is convinced that an uncompromising commitment to the College is essential for it to scale greater heights. A transparent system, true self-assessment and a determination to strive against all odds, are the bedrocks on which the College must be built.

It is indeed a great delight to see you all here and share with you the wonderful journey of the College in the 2024-25 academic session. It is a privilege for the College to have as its Chief Guest, Dr Arvind Gupta, Director, Vivekananda International Foundation, New Delhi. Thank you so much Sir, for making time for us. My grateful thanks to Prof Sanjoy Roy, Dean, Faculty of Social Sciences, University of Delhi, our Guest of Honour, who has always been our well-wisher, it is wonderful to have you with us Sir. I would like to thank the Chairperson of our Governing Body, Ms Anuradha Krishna and ex-Chairperson, Dr Kusum Krishna, as also all members of the Governing Body for their unwavering support for all the endeavours of the College. And all of this time we have ensured that the quality of education we offer as an institution does not falter or weaken. Our A-Plus accreditation by NAAC, our ISO 21001 and ISO 9001 certifications, our presence in the NIRF, are some of the recognitions for our claims. What is perhaps more significant is that our students are now performing exceptionally well in all walks of life and carry with them the deepest affection for the alma mater that has shaped their personalities as well as their destiny. We certainly have reasons to believe that we shine like the sapphire, as everyone – be it students, Faculty members, the administration, non-teaching and support staff, and of course our ever-supportive Governing Body – all do their bit to make this institution true blue sapphire, reputed for durability, honesty of labour, sincerity and loyalty.

He was again, a quiet dedicated worker. We offer our gratitude to them for their meaningful contribution to the College and we pray that their souls rest in eternal peace.

In the last few years, we have all been privileged to witness the accolades that the College has received, and this academic session too, the College has received top honours and many institutional awards. I would like to mention just a few: first position in the State/District as the Best Action Research Institution 2024-25 (Skill-to-Entrepreneurship Programme for HEIs) organised by the National Edutrust of India (3 December 2024); first position in the 'Budding Entrepreneurship' category at the Skill, Startup and Entrepreneurship Expo & India Mushrooms Day 2024, organised by the University of Delhi (6 October 2024); District Environment Championship Award 2024-25 for Central Delhi by the National Edutrust of India, for demonstrating outstanding commitment and dedication to environmental conservation and sustainability (5 June 2024); 17 prizes including two trophies at the University of Delhi Garden Show, and four prizes, including one for best lawns by Indraprastha Horticulture Society, Delhi, for our wonderful



gardens. Of course, the most coveted award for NCC was that, the College secured the prestigious second runner-up position in the senior wing (SW Coy) category at the Delhi Directorate College level.

Apart from these remarkable achievements, the College signed two important International MoUs – one with the Centre of International and National Programmes (CINP) with Sherubtse College, Royal University of Bhutan, and the other with the Sanskrit Department of the University of Kelaniya, Colombo. The CINP also signed an MoU with BITS Pilani. These are significant landmarks in the evolution of JDMC as a major academic force.

It should be noted that the Annual Report is itself a compendium of all that takes place within the College in an academic session. It is extremely detailed and is accessible on the College website. Hence, to avoid complete duplication, I will only be giving a bird's eye view of some of the highlights of the 2024-2025 academic session.

To foreground some of the academic achievements of our students:

The pass percentage lies between 90 to 100% in the final year of B.A. (Programme) and B.A. (Hons.) English, Hindi, Political Science Programmes.

The College has a 100% pass result in the second year of B.A. Hons Economics, Hindi, History, Philosophy, Political Science, Sanskrit and B. Com (Hons.), more than 98% pass result in the second year of B.A. (Hons) English, Sociology, B.Sc. (Hons.) Mathematics, B.Com courses and the B.A. Programme.

In first year, the College has a 100% pass result in B.A. (Hons.) Economics, Hindi, History and B.Sc. (Hons.) Mathematics and more than 97% pass result in the first year of B.A. (Hons.) English, Philosophy, Political Science, Sociology, B.Com., B. Com (Hons.) and the B.A. Programme.

The students excelled not just in academics but also in extra-curricular activities, all of which are detailed in the Annual Report. A few illustrative examples are: Sukanya Datta, B.Sc. (Hons.) Mathematics III Year received the Best Paper Presentation Award, PAHAL Horizon SRIP, 2024; Anuja Malik, B.A. (Prog.) I Year won the first prize at the Bazm-e-Adab Ghazal Competition at Zakir Hussain College, University of Delhi and the first prize at the Mehfil-e-Ghazal Competition at Mata Sundari College, University of Delhi; Shristi Tewari, B.A. (Prog.) I Year won first prize at Bazm-e-Adab Competition at Zakir Hussain College, University of Delhi and the first prize in the Folk Song Competition at Vivekananda College, University of Delhi; Radhika Venkataraman, B.A.(Hons.) Sociology III Year won the second prize in Instrumental Music at the Cultural Council of India; Suhana Sharma, B.A. (Hons.) Philosophy III Year won first prize in the Essay Writing Competition, at the Department of Philosophy, University of Delhi; Iffat Aurooz and Shahida Mushtaq, B.A. (Hons.) Political Science III Year were awarded with the K.L. Bagga Memorial Eminent Social Activist Trophy at the NDMC Convention Centre. They were also awarded a Certificate for participating at the Conference on 'Women and Economy: Beijing 30+, Taking Stock and Looking into the Future', a multi-stakeholder consultation organised by Friedrich Ebert Stiftung, India, at the Constitution Club, New Delhi; furthermore, they won a Certificate of Noteworthy Performance from the Hon'ble Minister of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes and Employment, for their participation at the Delhi Yuva Sansad held at the Delhi Vidhan Sabha. These two exemplary students, were also awarded the International Felicitation and Appreciation for World Peace, Education and Promotion Award presented at New Delhi on the occasion of the 20th World Peace Congress, by the International Association for Educators of World Peace, affiliated to ECOSOC, United Nations. Tanisha Khemka, B.A. (Hons.) Sociology I Year was awarded a Certificate for her remarkable leadership and path breaking ideas presented at the Viksit Bharat Young Leaders Dialogue, at Bharat Mandapam, Delhi. Smruti Swadipa



Sahoo, B.A. (Hons.) Sociology II Year won the World Peace Education & Promotion Award, conferred by the International Association of Educators for World Peace. These are, to repeat, only a very few of the many prizes, awards and recognitions won by our students, which have brought laurels to the College.

The NCC got its first ANO (Associate NCC Officer), Lt. Dr Debahuti Brahmachari, from the Department of Political Science, who underwent three months of extremely rigorous physical and technical training at OTA Gwalior which she successfully completed with an Alpha grade. Kudos to Lt. Dr Brahmachari! The NCC has already won as many as 47 prizes and one is sure that more are on the way, as the session is still in progress. The cadets won 16 prizes at various training camps. The NCC has conducted a number of welfare, extension and outreach activities as also a number of workshops, especially for digital skilling and seminars as well as the Veerangana Lecture Series.

The students proved their mettle in sports yet again. Yashita and K. Haritha attended the Indian team trials in Shooting and Football. Harshika Joshi won a bronze medal at the National Games, a silver at the Junior nationals, and Riddhi Jain won a silver at the All-India Inter University Games, while 50 JDMC players represented Delhi University and the state in Inter-University and national tournaments in different games. JDMC secured 12 first, 11 second and 5 third positions in the team and individual categories of Inter-College, state and other tournaments in different games, where 55 players took part.

JDMC always believed that education is not just the teaching of a curriculum long before the NEP was implemented. There had to be additions to it, and the Add-on Courses Committee under the Skill Enhancement Centre of the College has offered 11 add-on courses this academic session with a wide range of themes such as Gender and Sexuality, Early Intervention for Children with Disabilities, Kathak, Acupressure, AI, Legal Literacy and Awareness. The Pratibha Foundation courses too provided foundational knowledge as orientation for various competitive examinations. Apart from add-on courses, under the aegis of Khoj, the student research cell, 49 student-led research projects and 29 students-cum-Faculty projects have been taken up and a wonderful book entitled *Reimagining Fairytales* has been published this session; it was launched at the IIC on 15 April 2025.

In addition, the Departments organised not just talks by external experts, but also a number of national and international conferences and seminars. Some of the significant ones are: a two-day International Conference on 'Economic Development in Contemporary India: Theory, Practice and Experience', by the Department of Economics, at the Indian Habitat Centre, on 23-24 September 2024; a one-day National Seminar and Inter-College Competition on 'Innovating Pathways for a Sustainable Future: Bridging Environment, Entrepreneurship and Sustainability', by the EVS Department in collaboration with Avani and National EduTrust of India, on 21 March 2025; and a two-day international conference by the Sanskrit Department on 6-7 March 2025, focusing on 'The Impact of Emperor Ashoka and his Dhamma on Indian and Global Literature'. Scholars from Sri Lanka, Vietnam, Myanmar (Burma), Thailand and various states of India, shared their invaluable knowledge, marking a truly historic moment. A National Seminar on 'Addressing Violence against Women' was organised on 25 November 2024, on the UN-designated International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women, by the Centre for Gender Equity Studies. The Centre also organised a two-day National Conference on 'Policies for Encouraging Women to Remain in the Workforce in India: Leave Policies and Addressing Violence in the Workplace' by Bystander JDMC, in collaboration with the Women's Development Centre, on 25-26 September 2024. Sponsored by ICSSR and IQAC-CUVE, the Centre for the Study of Indian Knowledge Systems organised a two-day International Conference on 'Indigenous Knowledge Systems and their Relevance in Contemporary Times', on 23-24 April 2024. More recently, the Centre for International and National Programmes

organised a two-day International Conference on 'Indigenous Knowledge Systems and Cultural Resilience' on 26-27 March, 2025, and the History Department organised an International Conference on 'Revisiting Regional Histories: Transitions and Transformations' on 11-12 April 2025. The Centre for the Study of Disability Inclusion (CSDI) at JDMC, organised a two-day Young Scholars' National Conference on 18-19 April 2024, on 'Disability: Identity, Representations, and Inclusion.' The Conference aimed to foster empathy and promote inclusivity. Dr. B.R. Alamelu from Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi delivered a Keynote Address on 'A Call for Renaissance in Disability Discourse'. The event featured six sessions and 34 Paper presentations from scholars across the country, with Mr. Samiran G. Ghissing and Mr. Shivam Sharma as Faculty coordinators.

Under the Centre for Career Counselling and Career Opportunities, the Placement Cell of the College conducted thirteen seminars, webinars, and workshops for students, focusing on career guidance, employability tests, and industrial visits, including Haier, and Mother Dairy. The Cell has successfully conducted the holistic development programme- cum-add-on course, with Mahindra Pride Classroom for three hundred students from various disciplines such as Commerce, Sanskrit, English, Hindi, BA Programme, etc. The Cell has successfully facilitated placements for twenty-seven students across thirty-three renowned companies, including EY, Accenture, Optum, Corizo, Teachnook, Innovist, etc. The placed students have secured roles such as Business Development Associate, Assurance Core, Tax Analyst, and Accounting Analyst. Furthermore, around eighty students have benefited from various internship opportunities provided by the Cell, securing positions in twenty-two companies like Skill Tank, KRG, Womenite, Prodigal AI, and Social Parindee, etc. The internship profiles span diverse domains such as Sales, Marketing, HR, Social Media Marketing, and Operations, equipping students with valuable industry experience. Not just the Placement Cell, the various Departments too enabled internships. Their details can be obtained from the Departmental Reports within the Annual Report.

The faculty members shone in various domains. The faculty members have achieved as many as 49 awards, including recognitions, best paper awards and fellowships. Seven teachers have been awarded PhDs. They are: Dr Ravindar Meena, Department of Commerce; Dr Abu Afzal Tauheed, Department of Economics; Dr Peisnlu Gagnei and Dr Sakshi Bansal, Department of Economics; Dr Teena Kohli, Department of Mathematics; Dr Karnika Jain, Department of Political Science; and Dr Jyoti, Department of Sanskrit. Congratulations to all! One hundred forty-three Lectures, Presentations, chairing of sessions, conduct of Workshops as Resource Persons have been organised by fifty-six Faculty members in 2024-25, thus far. This is no mean number and all the faculty members concerned deserve the deepest appreciation. The faculty members have published forty-seven research articles/ creative pieces, six books, nine chapters/ creative pieces in books, one e-content publication and eleven other publications, including Book Reviews this academic session. Sixty faculty members either participated as attendees or as Resource Persons in one hundred and thirty-one FDPs. Sixteen faculty projects funded by the college have been taken on by twenty-six teachers, and there are three ongoing externally sponsored projects led by four faculty members, including two funded by the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR) and one funded by the Indian Council of Philosophical Research (ICPR). Eight Faculty members are guiding doctoral students in this academic session.

Always ready to hone their skills, the non-teaching staff also participated in training programmes. Mr. Surender Kumar, Dr Kaushal Kishore, Mr Navraj, Mr Vijay Prakash, Mr Vijay Pratap, Mr Krishan Kumar, Mr Manpreet, Mr Sumit Kumar Singh, Mr Varun Jain, Mr Dheeraj Kumar, Ms Deepti Chauhan, Mr Arvind Pal, Ms Pushpa Rawat, Mr Manoj Sharma, Mr Avinash, Mr Sumit Kumar Singh participated in a job-

oriented skill enhancement programme in IT and Documentation. Mr Randhawa Singh, Mr Himanshu Sharma, Mr Harsh Kumar, Mr Ankit, Mr Dinesh Chand Bahuguna, Mr Avinash, Ms Pushpa Rawat, Ms Pushpa Rawat, Ms Deepti Chauhan, Mr Navraj, Mr Vijay Prakash, Mr Vijay Pratap participated in a five-day Capacity Building Workshop on 'Empowering Non-Teaching Staff for Institutional Excellence' conducted by the Shri Ram College of Commerce (SRCC).

The College has also undertaken enhancement of facilities by adding six smartboards in classrooms. One computer lab was upgraded by adding sixty all-in-one desktop computers and a new computer lab with fifty-five Laptops was created. Furthermore, as part of infrastructure development, the parking area was reconstructed by laying of inter-locking pavers. The gents staff toilet was reconstructed, the first floor of the Academic Block was renovated with tiles on the walls and centralized air-conditioning of the Library Reading Room was completed. In addition, the work of reconstruction of the Sports Changing Room, the construction of the sitting steps at the sports ground, the construction of a lift for Teachers' Staff Room and Seminar Hall are ongoing. To facilitate the completion of errands, the College has purchased a new electric scooter in March this year.

No education is complete unless it teaches us to be sensitive to others' needs. To ensure the consistency of extension and outreach sensitization activities, the Centre for Outreach and Extension Activities and its various arms such as the NSS, NCC, the Community First Initiative (CFI) of the H DFE Department, Samarth the Enabling Unit and the Equal Opportunities Cell, undertook wide-ranging activities all through the academic session. The NSS conducted four seminars on hygiene, menstruation, and voter registration and conducted awareness sessions on the same in different parts of Delhi. Volunteers also contributed to health and awareness camps, such as the anemia screening camp. Numerous visits to local schools and community centres to distribute stationery and assist underprivileged individuals with necessary documents such as voter IDs and ABHA (Ayushman Bharat Health Account) Cards complemented these efforts. The National Cadet Corps (NCC) organised several impactful events throughout 2024 and 2025, focusing on social responsibility and environmental awareness, be it sanitary napkin donation (and awareness) drives; a donation drive for children; swachhata pakhwada; Vasundhara sustainability campaign and Earth Day plantation drive. The CFI conducted activities such as Sensitizing the Community on Early Identification of Hearing Disability in Children; Sensitization on Retinoblastoma; Donate a *Thali*; Joy of Giving Week; Daan Utsav; a Talk on 'Stronger India through a Million Health Educated Students' (SMILES), Risks of Fatty Liver Disease; donation drive for Mission 10M Meals; and Vidyanjali Programme Registration. Samarth conducted the Women in Data and Women in AI Programme, Mobility Training Workshop, White Cane Day, Braille Reading Competition, the Adaptive Gaming Challenge, etc. I must also mention the enormous work done by the Fee Assistance Committee in helping to partly fund students who find it difficult to pay the fees and do not have access to scholarships; it is a lot of work and is done with great care, sensitivity and compassion—thanks to all who contribute and the team that takes care of the collection and disbursal.

One of the most significant contributions towards building a spirit of inclusivity has been the work of the Centre for Study of Disability Inclusion (CSDI) which organised many events aimed at promoting awareness, education, and inclusivity. The CSDI team created 21 informative posters highlighting disabilities recognized under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Act, 2016. These posters educate individuals about various disabilities, their impact, and the measures for inclusion and accessibility. Topics covered include blindness, cerebral palsy, autism spectrum disorder, and multiple disabilities, offering a clear understanding of the challenges faced by persons with disabilities. The

International Day of Persons with Disabilities was observed on 3 December 2024; White Cane Safety Day was observed on 17 October 2024; the Annual Two-Day Braille Workshop (Second Edition) was held on 9-10 October 2024; the Bystander Assistance Programme for Social Inclusion was organised with various departments; A movie on Muscular Dystrophy *Salaam Venky*, was screened on 17 September 2024 featuring.

The Students' Union for the current session was extremely proactive as always and organised several events for the 2024-25 session. The Staff Advisors, Dr Kanika Kakar, Ms Ruchi Kalita and Dr Ankita Kumar and the Students Union – Somya Narula, President; Gunjan, Vice President; Mannat Sharma, General Secretary; and Pragati Joshi, Treasurer, were meticulous and absolutely exemplary in the manner in which they conducted activities accompanied with great cheerfulness. These included, Mentorship Sessions; a Seminar on 'Financial Literacy: Women's Prosperity', organised in collaboration with Canara Bank; the glorious and thrilling *Symphony'25*, the Annual Cultural Festival of JDMC held from 6-8 February 2025; the 76th Republic Day celebrated on 26 January 2025; National Youth Day celebrated in collaboration with National Edu- trust of India and NCC JDMC, on 9 January 2025; a Logo-Making Competition for *Symphony'25*; an Information Seminar in collaboration with IQAC-JDMC conducted by AIESEC, IIT Chapter on 6 November 2024; *Jyotsana 2024*, the annual Diwali Mela, held on 25 October 2024; a Styling and Fashion Workshop in collaboration with Pearl Academy; a Study Abroad Workshop in collaboration with Upgrad; Teachers' Day celebrated on 5 September 2024. Deeksharambh, the Student Induction Programme, was conducted over multiple days; the 77th Independence Day celebrated on 15 August 2024; Clay Pottery Painting Workshop; the College's 65th Foundation Day held on 1 August 2024; the 10th International Yoga Day celebrated in collaboration with the Department of Physical Education, JDMC, and NSS, JDMC, on 21 June 2024; World Environment Day celebrated in collaboration with Upvan, the Garden Club, JDMC, and Avani, the Environment Club, JDMC, on 5 June 2024.

The College is proud of the work done by Aamdani: the Finance and Investment Cell; Abhivyakti – the Hindi debating society; the Alumnae Association; Anubhuti – the street theatre society; Avani – the Environment Club; Bardolators: The Shakespeare Society; Chetna Society: The Spiritual Consciousness Cell; Enactus; Ethiad: The MUN-Youth Parliament Society; Euphonie: The Western Music Society; Girl Up Nitara; Heritage Club; Inquizition: The Quiz Society; Impreneurs: The Entrepreneurship Cell; Incubation Programme – Anupam; Iridescent: The English Creative Writing Society; Jhankaar: The Indian Folk Dance Society; the Kalakriti Art Club; Logos: The English Literary Society; Lumiere – The Film and Photography Club; North East Students' Group (NESG); Nritya: The Western Dance Society; Parag; Rhetorque: The English Debating Society; Sarang: The Classical Indian Music Society; Spic Macay Heritage Club; Upvan: The Garden Club, all of whom conducted innumerable Workshops, Competitions, Talks and various other activities all through the academic session. They have been relentless in their efforts.

The College has been functioning efficiently all through the year with the cooperation of the three wings that form the non-teaching section of the College, the administrative staff, the accounts staff and the library staff. Much of what was achieved such as recruitment and promotions as well as disbursal of funds in a timely manner was possible only because of the constant efforts of the non-teaching staff who left no stone unturned to ensure that everything moved seamlessly. In the same breath, I must thank Dr Chugh who is devoted to the well-being of all within the campus and takes tremendous care of the medical needs of faculty staff and students. I must also convey my thanks to the nurse, Sushma, who is efficient in the

discharge of her duties. The support staff of the College keep our college clean and green and are the behind-the-scenes workers without whom the atmosphere of the College would not be favourable for a strong teaching-learning process. Additionally, we are grateful to JDVC and its dynamic Director, Madhuri Verma, who have offered excellent courses for skill enhancement of our students and helped us whenever we required it.

A number of other Committees and individuals worked tirelessly through the academic session, such as the Teachers-in-charge of all Departments, Centre core team members, Admission and Admission Grievances Committees – especially the Nodal Officer, Attendance Committee, Workload Committee, Time-Table Committee, Examination Committee, Central Cluster Committee, SEC and VAC Nodal Officers, Library Committee, Decoration Committee, Discipline Committee, Building and Maintenance Committee, Hostel Committee – that looks into each aspect for the wellbeing of the hostel and its inmates – Website Committee, Canteen Committee, Refreshment Committee, ICT and Automation Committee – whose conveners, Prof Ritu Arora and Prof Amita Charan, along with their team members provide excellent training sessions all through the year for faculty and non-teaching staff, the Swachhata team, the Nadi Ko Jano team, Garden Committee, Internal Complaints Committee, Apex Grievance Committee, SC/ST/OBC Liasion Officers, the College Bursar, the Staff Council Secretary, the PIO, the Magazine Committee, the Nodal Officer for Foreign students and Kashmiri students, NESG Committee, Anti-Smoking and Anti-Ragging Committees, the Prospectus Committee, Prize Distribution Committee, Equal Opportunity Cell, Enabling Unit, Publicity and Media Committee, ISO Team, IQAC-Promotion Committee, Screening Committee, the NEP Committee, the NIRF Committee, the Provident Fund Committee, the Purchase Committee, the Moderation and Monitoring Committees, the Alumnae Executive Committee, the Counselling Committee – that looks into the mental wellbeing of all in the College through many specialized sessions, the Annual Budget Committee, the e-Waste Committee, Add-on Course Committee, Fee Assistance Committee, Green Audit Committee, Rajbhasha Committee, Bhartiya Bhasha Samiti, Gandhi Study Circle, Committee for Online Forms, Remedial Classes Committee and the College Grievance Redressal Committee, Viksit Bharat Nodal Officer and Committee, and the newly formed Cyber Committee. I must also mention the efforts of the Internal Audit Committee, which painstakingly audits the work of the administrative office, Accounts Office and the Library, which helps to redress weaknesses and enhance strengths. Apart from these, I must congratulate the NCWEB Coordinator and Deputy as well as the entire NCWEB team for the dedication with which they have worked for the NCWEB students of our Centre. This academic session has seen a great surge in the media representation of the College and for that, many thanks to the media team as also all those who individually took the initiative to help.

Constantly and consistently striving for excellence in all spheres, assessing current requirements, ensuring that benchmarks are created and met, looking into the wellbeing of all within the JDMC family, the IQAC team led by the IQAC Coordinator, Prof Payal Nagpal and assisted ably by the Accreditation support group, has been working nonstop. On behalf of the entire College, much appreciation and gratitude to the Coordinator and her team. While many practices have been adopted and innumerable activities have been conducted, two that stand out, are: the Pedagogy Series where we have invited experts in each Department to teach innovative pedagogic methods to the faculty, to handle the NEP papers and also use the right tools for evaluation; and the Research Methodology Workshops conducted by all Departments benefiting students and teachers alike. Kudos for these efforts!

Furthermore, I must thank Dr Shilpa Chaudhary, Dr Ruby Bharadwaj and the ISO team for the determination and positivity with which they have worked to ensure that the College sails through the Audit process for the continued validation of the ISO certification. It is understandable that at a time when we are beleaguered with work, any additional labour feels heavy. But there is tremendous satisfaction in knowing that the systems and processes of the College are in place. The ISO Coordinators and their team ensure that. I am delighted to note that JDMC has been a trail blazer in this regard and following our example, other colleges of the University of Delhi are also applying for ISO certification.

I must thank the Vice-Principal, Prof Sandhya Garg who can always be relied upon to help in any of the processes that require her skills and expertise – be it for Rajbhasha, promotions, NIRF or ISO. In their administrative capacity, the two Administrative Officers, Dr Kaushal Kishore and Mr Surendra Kumar and the Section Officers, Mr Arvind Pal, recently retired Ms Pushpa and Mr Manpreet for their cheerful and ever-willing commitment to getting all tasks done on time. Thank you all.

The Garden Committee and their Club, Upvan, have done a splendid job not only in maintaining the College lawns and gardens, they have also added a large number of herbal and indigenous plants. The Club won 17 prizes, including two trophies, in multiple categories, at the 67th Annual Flower Show of the University of Delhi. Not just within the University, the College has also won awards for its lawns and plants at the Indraprastha Horticultural Society, this academic session. Truly, JDMC lawns and gardens are a joy to behold and we must be eternally grateful to our gardeners who work hard all day no matter what the weather and the Committee that looks into all the requirements. Just as we must be thankful to our security guards for making sure that the campus is a safe place and the safai karamcharis for working hard to keep this campus as clean as possible.

The Annual Report Committee always has a challenging task in documenting the year's events in a manner that is easy to read and pleasing to the eye. I thank them for their great efforts in ensuring that we are able to take stock of our achievements for the year. My personal thanks to all members of the Committee: Rajshree Chandra, Sangeeta Gupta, Deepti Sethi, Tanu Gupta, Sakshi Bansal, Sonia, Tannu Sharma, Kush Gayasen, Raju Keshari, Nancy Rao, Shivani Burnwal, Poonam Khatana, Harshbala, Madhulika Nirmal, Shalini Singh, as also to the assistance provided by various members of the non-teaching staff. I must also thank Ms Tannu Sharma for her unflagging efforts, over the last ten years, in making the PowerPoint for the presentation of the Annual report – she has set a very high standard indeed.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

JDMC's Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) is committed to fostering excellence in all aspects of college life. The Annual Quality Assurance Report (IQAC) successfully submitted the IQAC Report for 2023-2024. It also applied for National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) 2025, and renewed the College's ISO certification. Focusing on its primary stakeholders— the students – the IQAC team organised several sensitisation sessions. Regular mentoring sessions were held for students to help them address challenges both inside and outside the classroom.

The College established a Skill Enhancement Centre, offering a variety of courses beyond the curriculum-based SEC courses.

The IQAC set up the Centre for International Programmes and later renamed it the Centre for International and National Programmes (CINP). This initiative focused on partnerships, both within the country and abroad. The College successfully signed Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) with Sherubtse College, Royal University of Bhutan, and BITS Pilani. A delegation comprising CINP members and the IQAC Coordinator, visited Bhutan, where they conducted sessions for the Faculty and students. Additionally, a delegation of Faculty members and the Principal visited Pilani.

To engage with the community, the Centre for the Study of Disability Inclusion signed MoUs with local schools to raise awareness at a young age. Several national and international conferences were organised. In line with its efforts to establish a Foundation for Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS), the IQAC renamed the Centre for Universal Values and Ethics as the Centre for the Study of Indian Knowledge Systems.

In compliance with the NEP policy, the IQAC collaborated with Departments to organise a series of Workshops on Research Methodology from 31 March to 5 April 2025. The College held a session on gender awareness for students on 25 March 2025.

A fire drill was conducted for students and Faculty on 20 January 2025, to prepare them for disaster situations. Students were encouraged to practice self-governance, and the Students' Union organised regular discipline and cleanliness drives. A two-day Workshop on 'Disaster Management and Fire Safety' was held on 9-10 January 2025.

In collaboration with the ICT Academy, a seminar was organised virtually, on 'Applications of Artificial Intelligence', for students on 30 November 2024. Several other Capacity-Building Sessions were also conducted for students.

To establish best practices for the year, the IQAC encouraged Departments to conduct Faculty Pedagogy Series in both semesters, aligned with NEP requirements for their respective disciplines.

In collaboration with GAD-MMTTC, a Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on "NEP Orientation and Sensitization Programme" was organized from 1-11 October 2024, for Faculty members.

Orientation Sessions were conducted on 12 September 2024 for the permanent Faculty, to raise awareness about the requirements for various promotion levels.

At the beginning of the semester, IQAC encouraged the Faculty to focus on internal assessment (IA) and continuous assessment CA divisions, as per the NEP, and to sensitise students about the same. Orientation Sessions were organised by the respective Departments in collaboration with IQAC, to

raise awareness about the NEP structure among students. A Special Orientation Session was conducted as part of 'Deeksharambh' on 9 September 2024, to inform students about the various options under the Central Cluster for AEC, SEC, and VAC courses.

A Financial Awareness Session was conducted on 30 August 2024 for the faculty.

A 'Drone Demonstration Event' was organised for students on 29 August 2024, in collaboration with the Centre for Innovative Skill-Based Courses and the Open Learning Development Centre.

To equip non-teaching staff with the latest skills, a One-Week Orientation Programme was organised for newly recruited office staff from 9-16 August 2024. Additionally, a 'One-Week Job-Oriented Skill Enhancement Programme', was held in collaboration with GAD-MMTTC, from 18 to 22 June 2024, for non-teaching staff. This course was open to the university's non-teaching staff as well, and received wide participation.

The IQAC remains focused on all-round development and therefore, organises FDPs, Capacity-Building Workshops, and Sensitisation Sessions for Faculty. Sessions on the 'Prevention of Sexual Harassment at the Workplace (POSH)' and the Code of Conduct were conducted on 17 and 15 May 2024, respectively. A course on General Financial Rules was organized for the non-teaching staff on 14 May 2024, in collaboration with the Library. Additionally, a Seminar in collaboration with NIPAM on 'Intellectual Property Rights' and a Session on 'Gender Awareness' was held for students on 24 April 2024.

THE KRISHNA HOSTEL

Krishna Hostel is a residence for full time undergraduate students of Janki Devi Memorial College. The newly constructed hostel was inaugurated by the Former Honorable President of India, Shri Pranab Mukherjee, on Founder's Day on August 1, 2018.

The Hostel is aesthetically designed and provides safe and comfortable accommodation facilities. It offers accommodation to 105 residents in 35 rooms on triple sharing basis. 20 of the rooms are air-conditioned. Each room has en-suite facilities with toilet and an attached balcony. A fully air-conditioned common room, and an outdoor green garden area provide space for leisure and recreational activities. Apart from these, a hygienically maintained dining area caters to residents' dietary and nutritional needs. Safety and security of residents is of prime concern. Guards are deputed to provide 24* 7 security to residents. The entire hostel is under CCTV surveillance. The Krishna Hostel also has a kitchen garden wherein residents engage in gardening.

Krishna Hostel is a home away from home and girls here thrive in the precincts of its supportive and secure environment.




THE COLLEGE LIBRARY





To create a pool of trained human resource on Braille script, sign language and accessible technologies, add-on courses are offered by the Centre. The CSDI team created **21 informative posters highlighting disabilities** recognized under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPWD) Act, 2016. These posters educate individuals about various disabilities, their impact, and the measures for inclusion and accessibility. Topics covered include blindness, cerebral palsy, autism spectrum disorder, and multiple disabilities, offering a clear understanding of the challenges faced by persons with disabilities.

The **International Day of Persons with Disabilities** was observed on 3 December 2024. With the theme “Seeing by Touch – Transformative Solutions for Inclusion,” the event raised awareness about accessibility and inclusion. The accessibility exhibition featured assistive tools like white canes, Braille slates, Braille books, and Braille visiting cards, providing attendees with hands-on experience of sensory-based learning tools. **White Cane Safety Day** was observed on 17 October 2024, emphasizing the importance of the white cane and its safe use. The event featured practical learning, interactive sessions, and live demonstrations, highlighting how the cane aids safe movement and boosts confidence.

The **Annual Two-Day Braille Workshop (Second Edition)** was held on 9-10 October 2024. Dr. Md. Zubeer Ahmed, Associate Professor at JDMC, University of Delhi, served as the Resource Person for the event. The Workshop focused on individuals with visual impairments, teaching them to understand and use Braille. Under the guidance of Dr. Ahmed, students gained hands-on experience in writing Braille alphabets, numbers, and symbols.

The **Bystander Assistance Programme** on 23 September 2024, led by Apoorva Roy from Saksham (CSDI), focused on respectful communication with PwDs and accessibility, featuring a basic ISL demonstration by students. Additionally, a session at Bal Bharati Public School, as part of the **Bystander Assistance for Social Inclusion** initiative, educated students on disability inclusion and



communication. The Sign Language demonstration introduced participants to basic Indian Sign Language (ISL) for communicating with the Deaf and hard-of-hearing community.

A movie screening on Muscular Dystrophy on 17 September 2024, featured *Salaam Venky*, a heartfelt film about Venkatesh, a young man living with Muscular Dystrophy. The film highlighted the strength, hope, and challenges faced by people with disabilities.

The **Bystander Assistance for Social Inclusion** events were held across various dates and collaborations. On 10 September 2024, at Janki Devi Vocational Centre, the role of bystanders in promoting accessibility was highlighted; it included an **ISL demonstration** by students.

Bystander Assistance for Social Inclusion in collaboration with the Department of History was held on 28 August 2024, with 62 participants. The session focused on respectful interaction with individuals with disabilities. A demonstration of basic sign language by students helped participants communicate with the hard-of-hearing, emphasizing active bystander roles in promoting inclusivity and respect for accessible spaces.

Bystander Assistance for Social Inclusion at St. Thomas Senior Secondary School was held on 27 August 2024. Dr. Md. Zubeer Ahmed, Ms. Pouriangthanliu, and Dr. Raju Keshari led the session, which aimed to sensitize teachers and students about interacting with individuals with visual, hearing, and locomotor disabilities. It focused on respectful interaction protocols and terminology.

Bystander Assistance for Social Inclusion in collaboration with NSS, JDMC was held on 29 August 2024. Dr. Md. Zubeer Ahmed and Dr. Raju Keshari educated participants on inclusive interactions, appropriate social protocols, and respectful language when engaging with persons with disabilities (PwDs), fostering a community that supports accessibility for all.

The Centre for the Study of Disability Inclusion (CSDI) at JDMC, University of Delhi, organized a two-day Young Scholars' National Conference on 18-19 April 2024, on the theme "Disability: Identity, Representations, and Inclusion." The Conference aimed to foster empathy and promote inclusivity. Dr. B.R. Alamelu from Jawaharlal Nehru University delivered a Keynote Address on "A Call for Renaissance in Disability Discourse". The event featured six sessions and 34 Paper presentations from scholars across the country, with Mr. Samiran G. Ghissing and Mr. Shivam Sharma as faculty coordinators.

The **Bystander Assistance for Social Inclusion Workshops** were held in collaboration with Springdales School on 20 May 2024, and Bal Bharati Public School on 6 April 2024. Led by Dr. Md. Zubeer Ahmed, Ms. Pouriangthanliu, and Dr. Raju Keshari at Springdales School, the Workshop focused on raising awareness and promoting the social inclusion of individuals with disabilities. Similarly, at Bal Bharati Public School, Dr. Zubeer Ahmed, Dr. Khachungla Chalhang, and Dr. Raju Keshari conducted a session aimed at emphasizing social inclusion and demonstrating the basics of Indian Sign Language (ISL) to the school faculty. The CSDI has signed MoUs with the following neighbourhood schools: Bal Bharati Public School, Springdales School, and St. Thomas Senior Secondary School for Girls.

Established in September 2024, the Skill Enhancement Centre seeks to empower women students through skill development opportunities that promote self-reliance, industry exposure, and enhanced employability, in line with the National Education Policy 2020.



An orientation session was held on “Measurement of Happiness”, on 14 February 2025. It was led by Dr. Archi Banerjee from the Rekhi Foundation of Happiness. The primary objective of this session was to introduce MindLab's unique methodology for quantifying happiness, focusing on the integration of psychological and scientific metrics. The session gave participants a deeper understanding of how happiness can be scientifically evaluated and how these measurements can inform strategies for enhancing well-being in various contexts.

Dr. Rekhi Singh, Founder of the Rekhi Foundation of Happiness, conducted a session on “The Science of Happiness” on 10 January 2025. The objective was to provide practical strategies for cultivating joy, resilience, and meaningful connections, enabling participants to enhance emotional well-being, reduce stress, and lead more fulfilling lives using science-based insights and practices. This session was further strengthened by the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Center and the Rekhi Foundation, fostering a deeper collaboration in promoting happiness and well-being.

Dr. Axel Baisch, Managing Director of the Hertie School in Berlin, conducted a session on “Cultural Diplomacy and Higher Education: The Competitive Advantage for Skilled Migrants from India to Germany” on 21 October 2024. The session aimed to highlight how cultural diplomacy and higher education can empower skilled migrants from India to thrive in Germany, creating unique opportunities and fostering cross-cultural innovation in the global workforce.

A session on “Upskilling for Better Employment Opportunities” was held on 7 October 2024, with Ms. Madhurima Verma, Director of JDVC, Ms. Jyoti Khurana, Beauty Expert at JDVC, and Ms. Yashika Bhagat, Freelancer in Social Media Marketing at JDVC, as resource persons. The objective was to enhance participants' skills to meet current job market demands, equipping them with updated knowledge and practical tools to improve employability and career opportunities.

The Centre is working through its various constituents/committees in the college. A brief report of each constituent is as follows:

National Service Scheme (NSS)

In the 2024-2025 academic year, the NSS' JDMC unit organized and participated in several impactful community outreach initiatives. A total of four seminars were conducted, focusing on hygiene, menstruation, and voter registration. On 12 and 14 February 2025, two volunteers each from the NSS unit conducted hygiene and menstruation awareness sessions in Mansarovar Park and Rohini respectively, while distributing sanitary pads to the local communities. In addition, on 25 September 2024, in collaboration with the Sampark Sathi Foundation, a menstruation awareness session was organized in different areas of Jangpura, Silver Park Slum, and Pragati Maidan, where women were educated on menstrual hygiene and common myths were debunked. Volunteers also contributed to health and awareness camps, such as the anemia screening camp at the Government Senior Secondary School in Nathupuria on 27 January 2025, and voter registration and ID distribution camps in areas like Rajiv Nagar and Timarpur. Numerous visits to local schools and community centres to distribute stationery and assist underprivileged individuals with necessary documents such as voter IDs and ABHA (Ayushman Bharat Health Account) Cards complemented these efforts.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The National Cadet Corps (NCC) organized several impactful events throughout 2024 and 2025, focusing on social responsibility and environmental awareness. A **sanitary napkin donation drive**, in collaboration with The Women Story, was held on 25 January 2025, at Yamuna Khadar, with seven participants. A similar event took place on 16 November 2024, at Wishes and Blessings NGO, also with seven participants. Additionally, a **children's donation drive** was organized on Children's Day, 14 November 2024, at Karol Bagh, with 10 participants, and a **donation drive** in collaboration with Baal Seva Sansthan was held with 12 participants on 23 October 2024, benefiting children. As regards environmental activities, a **Swacchta Pakhwada** (plantation and cleanliness drive) was held on 30 September 2024, with 25 participants, followed by a Silent March on 23 August 2024, at Karol Bagh, with 20 participants. A Plastic Bag-Free Week, part of the **Vasundhara sustainability campaign**, was organized on 3 July 2024, at JDMC with 20 participants, and an **Earth Day plantation drive** was undertaken on 22 April 2024, with 20 participants.

Community First Initiative (CFI)

The Community First Initiative (CFI) works as an initiative of the HDFE Department. The following activities were conducted in 2024-25

- **Sensitizing the Community on Early Identification of Hearing Disability in Children** (January-February 2025): Third-year students from the HDFE Department raised awareness on early identification of hearing disabilities in children.
- **Sensitization on Retinoblastoma: A Community-Based Approach** (4 February 2025): On World Cancer Day, the HDFE Department, in collaboration with Community First Initiative, organized an event to create awareness about screening eye cancer (Retinoblastoma) in children at JDMC, distributing pamphlets to the community.
- **Donate a *Thali*** (19-30 October 2024): In collaboration with Love Care Foundation, the Initiative distributed *thalis* to children, women, and the elderly in Kaushambi, Ghaziabad. Certificates of Appreciation were received from Love Care Foundation.
- **Joy of Giving Week** (2-8 October 2024): Celebrated **Daan Utsav** by distributing food, stationery, and other essentials to residents in RHA slum clusters and nearby neighbourhoods.
- **SMILES (Stronger India through a Million Health Educated Students), Risks of Fatty Liver Disease** (30 September 2024): In collaboration with the Institute of Liver & Biliary Sciences and The Liver Care Foundation, a **session on fatty liver disease** was organized, with expert speakers including Dr. Priyanka Aggarwal, Dr. Preeti Pandey, and others.
- **Mission 10M Meals** (26 August 2024): Contributed dry ration (Dal, rice, and atta) to support the initiative in collaboration with RobinHood Army.
- **Vidyanjali Programme Registration** (12 July 2024): The college registered for the Vidyanjali Programme, an initiative by the Ministry of Education.
- **Sensitization on Retinoblastoma (World Retinoblastoma Awareness Week)** (12-18 May 2024): In collaboration with the Community First Initiative, the HDFE Department sensitized community members about Retinoblastoma in preschools, NGOs, health centres, and Anganwadis.

Samarth - The Enabling Unit

Samarth, the enabling unit of JDMC, began the academic session with activities aimed at empowering students with disabilities across JDMC. The students participated in events organized by the unit, as well as by different societies of the college and JDVC. Below is an overview of the various activities:

Extension Activities

Women in Data and Women in AI Programme: For the past three years, the Unit has continued its collaboration with DELL Technologies, empowering women in Data Analytics through the Learning Links Foundation, the CSR unit of DELL Technologies. The programme has successfully trained over a thousand students, including both regular and NCWEB students. The initiative provides students with a certificate from DELL Technologies, free access to online courses, and career opportunities. Training for NCWEB/Regular students is currently in progress.

Mobility Training Workshop – 14-16 October 2024: The unit organized a three-day mobility-training workshop in collaboration with Saksham. Students learnt the use of the white cane, prepare assignments with modern software, and become more self-reliant. Trainers also introduced students to the latest gadgets.



White Cane Day – 14 October 2024: This day commemorates photographer James Briggs's invention of the white cane, designed to help visually impaired individuals travel independently and alert them to obstacles in their path.

Braille Reading Competition – 20 September 2024 **Anubhuti - Street Play Society** – 4 May 2024: Students participated in the Annual Day street play competition, promoting inclusivity and boosting student confidence.

Adaptive Gaming Challenge – 19 April 2024: This inclusive activity provided students with a fresh perspective on how persons with disabilities have adapted common board and field games to engage, learn, and grow.

A National Seminar on “Addressing Violence against Women” was organised on 25 November 2024, on the occasion of the UN-designated International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women. During the 2024-25 session, the Centre organized the following events:

Sponsored by ICSSR IQAC-CUVE, the Centre organized a **two-day International Conference** on "Indigenous Knowledge Systems and their Relevance in Contemporary Times" on 23-24 April 2024. The Conference began with an Inaugural Session where Prof. Swati Pal discussed Indigenous Knowledge Systems, Dr. Prerna Arora introduced the theme, and Prof. Dhananjay Singh highlighted their contemporary relevance. The day included multiple sessions, such as a Paper presentation on "Spirituality and Consciousness," followed by the second parallel session on 'Consciousness and Spirituality', with eight presentations. A Plenary Session on 'Environmentalism: Sustainability and Traditional Practices,'





featured four speakers, and a parallel session on 'Classical Music in Indian Knowledge Systems' saw five presentations. This was followed by a parallel session on 'Sustainability and Conservation', with six presentations. The Conference concluded with a Valedictory Session reflecting on the importance of Indian Knowledge Systems.

Chetna Society - The Spiritual Consciousness Cell

This Society has been working for more than the last four years. All the members of the three societies (Chetna, Gandhi Study Circle, and Avani) are part of the Centre and are also members of the executive body.

Chetna, Janki Devi Memorial College's Spiritual Consciousness Cell, plays a vital role in shaping students' lives by offering training that encourages personal growth and awareness. The Society inspires students through real-life success stories, and promotes core values of humanity and ethics. During the 2024-25 academic session, Chetna organized several impactful events, including a **Full Body Health Check-Up Camp** on 27-28 February 2025, offering free health services such as dental, BP, and nutrition check-ups, to raise awareness about healthy living. The seminar was conducted as part of the Living Ethically with Nature Series, LENS 2024, on 27 November 2024, under the aegis of IQAC and the Centre for Universal Values and Ethics, JDMC with Dr. Gaurav Barhadiya, Assistant Professor and Herpetologist, discussing the unique nature of snakes and their critical role in maintaining ecological balance.

Gandhi Study Circle

The Gandhi Study Circle (GSC) at Janki Devi Memorial College, a decade-old co-curricular society and a constituent unit of the Centre for Universal Values and Ethics, promotes Gandhian values through pedagogy, social outreach, and a focus on material simplicity and service.
