






CONSTITUTION DAY (ENGLISH)


November 26, 2021







NATIONAL COMMUNAL HARMONY WEEK


19th November 2021 to 25th November, 2021



OATH CEREMONY


October 1, 2021






INDEPENDENCE DAY

Then, the Coffee Table Book, which captures the 60 years of the college, was unveiled. Prof. Pal thanked everyone who made this possible.


