These prizes are given for academic excellence, all round development, proficiency in sports, music, and cultural activities display of leadership qualities. There are prizes awarded for excellence in NCC and NSS.

In consonance with our commitment to inclusiveness there are special prizes for physically challenged students. The college also acknowledges the hard work and dedication of non-teaching staff.

Some of the samples for the selection of the prizes/ scholarships instituted by some of the departments are listed below.

Department of English

Criteria for the selection of candidates for Prizes include the following:

Aruna Chakravarti Prize for Creative Writing involves conducting a creative writing competition for assessing the recipient. The competition is open for students of all years and courses. Topics are given on the spot and the students are given an hour's time to write. The first prize winner receives the award.

Shri Krishan Scholarship for proficiency in English Language is given to the student getting highest marks in English Discipline B.A. Prog. in the preceding semesters, as these students actually study English Literature over a course of three years and get an immersive experience of English.

Department of Sociology

A.M. Shah Memorial Scholarship is awarded to the student who scores highest marks at the end of six semesters.

Department of Mathematics

Nominations are invited for the following prizes from II and III Year students only.

Shri Sham Krishan Scholarship for the best student of Mathematics.

Mrs. Manohar Lal Silver medal for the most talented student of Mathematics.

Eligibility criteria:

1. Average SGPA of all the semester exams given to date must be at least 8.
2. (i.e. For III-year students, an average SGPA for semesters I+II+III+IV+V and for II-year students, the average SGPA of semesters I+II+III has to be at least 8.)
3. Participation in extra-curricular activities of the department and college.
4. Any other achievements (if any).

Department of Commerce

The department uses a combination of parameters: Academic performance, regularity in classes and performance in co-curricular/extra-curricular activities to select the student best suited for the Prize.

1. Shri Sham Krishan Scholarship for the best students of B.Com (Hons.) II Year

Process:

- a) Applications are invited from the II year students for being considered for the prize. Students submit their details- SGPA for previous semester, CGPA, Attendance for previous semester as well as ongoing semester and their list and proofs of co-curricular/extra-curricular achievements including prizes won in various competitions, research projects, publications, active contribution to department association activities and any other similar activities.
- b) Department meeting is held to scrutinize each student's details. The prize-winner is selected after careful examination of all claims and detailed deliberations among the faculty. The department chooses the best suitable student from II year.

2. Shri Sultan Chand Memorial Scholarship for the best student of B.Com(Hons.) I Year

Process:

- a) Applications are invited from I Year students for being considered for the prize. Students submit their details– SGPA and CGPA for I Year, Attendance for previous and ongoing Semester and their list and proofs of co-curricular/extra-curricular achievements including prizes won in various competitions, research projects, publications, active contribution to department association activities and any other similar highlight.
- b) Department meeting is held to scrutinize each student's details. The prize-winner is selected after careful examination of all claims and detailed deliberations among the faculty.

3. Shri R.K Arora Prize by V Arora for the best student of B.Com (Hons.) I Year

Process:

- a) Applications are invited from I Year students for being considered for the prize.
