#### Report of Majlis 2024

Etihad, the MUN society of Janki Devi Memorial College, organised the fourth edition of its annual inter-college MUN conference, MAJLIS 2024 on 25th April, 2024. The event was filled with experience, learning, and fun. The conference comprised two committees: UNHRC and Lok Sabha. Both the committees witnessed eager participation from the delegates.

#### **UNHRC-**

The agenda of the committee was 'Addressing Human Rights Challenges in Myanmar, Venezuela and Yemen'. Mr. Kushal Dubey and Ms. Maanya Prakash served on the Executive Board as the Chair and Vice-chair respectively. Mr. Kushal Dubey is a second year engineering student from KIET Group Of Institution. He has been an active participant of MUN's and YP's being conducted all across the country. He has a deep interest in policy making and a keen affection towards International laws. Ms. Maanya Prakash is currently pursuing Masters in History from University of Delhi. She has been doing MUNs for the last 10 years. She believes that MUNs bring out the best in a person and helps one groom their personality.

The committee started with the introduction of the EB, followed by a quick recap of the rules and proceedings of the committee. The debates began with the GSL (General Speakers' List) which was followed up by some quick moderated and unmoderated sessions. Various themes related to the agenda were explored and discussed by the delegates, such as protection of the most vulnerable groups, challenges faced by the refugees, the impacts of human rights violation on women and children, legal loopholes that might be the cause for such violation, etc.

#### LOK SABHA -

The Lok Sabha committee witnessed great participation from delegates representing various politicians of Indian politics. The agenda for this committee was 'Interim Budget – Assessing economic policies and sectoral allocations'.

Mr. Rajat Sharma and Ms. Saniya Soundele served in the Executive Board as Moderator and Deputy Moderator respectively. Mr. Sharma is a passionate orator and a national level debater. He is currently pursuing B.A Economics Hons from Hansraj College, Delhi University. He has been active in the debating and Mun Circuit from around 5 years and has done more than 106 Model United Conferences and Youth Parliaments. Ms. Soundele is a passionate public speaker and an experienced debater. She is currently pursuing B.A. History Honours from Janki Devi Memorial College, Delhi University. She has around 9 years of experience in debating and public speaking. Her interests span across History, Hindi sahitya, English literature and international a[airs.

The debates started o[ after the EB introduction, in which the delegates talked about various important aspects of the agenda. These aspects included subtopics such as economic policies and sectoral allocations in educational sector, environmental and political aspects of the interim budget, current state of Indian economy, deliberation upon women and religious minorities associated with the impacts of the interim budget, etc.

◆ At last, as the closing ceremony took place, the conference concluded on a positive note, where the results were announced and all the delegates were congratulated for their immense enthusiasm and engagement. #### Report on the registration and interview process for Etihad - The MUN Society

In preparation for the recruitment drive, *Etihad - The MUN Society* of Janki Devi Memorial College, on 19 September, 2024, floated a comprehensive and engaging announcement across various college communities to encourage student participation.

The key message emphasized the importance of joining the MUN Society to enhance diplomacy, debate, and leadership skills. The call for applications, which opened with a deadline of September 21, 2024, at 5 p.m., was aimed at attracting both newcomers and experienced MUN participants. The recruitment aimed to provide opportunities for students to engage in debates, shape resolutions, and collaborate with peers.

The promotional content highlighted several benefits for joining the society, including:

- Improvement in public speaking, research, and leadership skills
- Gaining knowledge of national and international crises
- Certificates for participation in certain conferences
- Opportunities to foster teamwork with like-minded peers

Etihad, alongside its MUN conferences, conducted a recruitment drive for various teams, including **Delegation**, **Logistics**, **Media**, **Finance**, **Marcom** & **Sponsorship**, **Editorial**, and **Research** & **Training**. Detailed roles were provided to ensure candidates understood their contributions.

The society received 120 diverse applications from students with varied interests, spanning international relations, logistics, media, and finance. This broad spectrum of applicants promised a wealth of perspectives and skills.

Consequently, to assess the applicants, interviews were conducted in online mode, giving the panel a chance to interact with candidates and gauge their skills, knowledge, and enthusiasm. These interviews provided insights into the candidates' abilities to think critically and work collaboratively, ensuring that the selected members would contribute effectively to the society's vision and objectives.



## Report on the inter-college Hackathon Event

The eagerly awaited **Hackathon**, orchestrated by *Etihad – The MUN Society* of **Janki Devi Memorial College** as part of the **Yuva Manthan experiential program**, marked a significant milestone in the academic calendar. It brought together a diverse group of participants, judges, faculty, and spectators for an inspiring and intellectually stimulating day, designed to foster creativity, innovation, and problem-solving skills by encouraging participants to develop solutions for real-world issues.

The event began with a warm and heartfelt welcome to all attendees, setting the tone for a day filled with collaborative e[orts, followed by a moment of gratitude extended to all present—participants, judges, guests, and spectators—for their essential roles in making the event a success.

Throughout the day, teams presented their innovative ideas, facing challenging questions from the panel of esteemed judges. The event not only served as a platform to showcase the remarkable talents of the students but also facilitated meaningful interactions with emerging technologies and contemporary issues.

Before the official start of the competition, the founder teacher convenor of Etihad - The MUN Society, **Prof. Poonam Bewtra** was invited to conduct the felicitation ceremony, where she warmly welcomed the principal, chief guest, organizing committee, and participants, expressing sincere gratitude to the judges and setting a formal tone for the event. Prof. Bewtra extended her appreciation to everyone who contributed in making the event possible and shared her enthusiasm for the inauguration of the Etihad Hackathon under the Yuva Manthan program, wishing the participants luck and encouraging them to embrace the spirit of innovation and collaboration.

Following the addresses, the judges for the Hackathon were introduced: **Dr. Chanchal Chopra**, Professor of Commerce at Janki Devi Memorial College, University of Delhi, with 42 years of experience in International Business and Taxation. She is the author of Foreign Investments: Liberalisation and WTO, has published extensively in UGC Care Listed and SCOPUS Indexed Journals, and has presented award-winning papers at various forums. **Mr. Dinesh Ahirrao**, Assistant Professor of Political Science at Janki Devi Memorial College, holds a B.Tech. in IT and an MA and M.Phil. in Political Science from JNU. A recipient of the UGC Junior Research Fellowship and the 2024 National Teacher Award, he is known for simplifying complex concepts and fostering critical thinking in Western Political Thought and Indian Politics.

The stage was then set for the main event—the highly anticipated Hackathon, which was followed by a brief explanation of the rules and procedures for the competition. Each participant was given a unique problem statement that they had to address within a limited timeframe. They would have 15 minutes to brainstorm and prepare their pitch, focusing on problem-solving, feasibility, and impact. The presentations would last 7 minutes, followed by a 3-minute Q&A session with the judges.


The facilitation of the chit selection process was set into motion, where participants were allotted a problem statement. The topics were varied and covered a range of pressing global issues, such as communication in disaster response, mental health support, urban mobility, and water conservation.

The participants showcased innovative solutions such as, featuring satellite-based AI applications for disaster response with training workshops and AI-driven call services to bolster community resilience. Remote learning initiatives aimed at underserved children

called for government support, while innovations like the 'Blissful Being' app—designed to enhance overall well-being and o[er therapist support, targeting teenagers and older adults—were presented. Emergency preparedness was highlighted through evacuation tactics and CPR workshops, and urban mobility was reimagined with AI driven 'skylanes' to ease traffic congestion. Participants faced ethical and technical questions, such as prioritizing individuals during a disaster or the challenges of implementing AI in congested urban environments.

After all the presentations, closing remarks were delivered by expressing gratitude to the participants, judges, teachers, and organizing committee members. The creativity and collaboration demonstrated throughout the day was praised and reminded everyone that the Hackathon was about more than just winning—it was about learning and gaining valuable experience.

#### Report on '21st Century Soft Skills & Personality Development' seminar

Two insightful seminars focused on enhancing soft skills and personality development were held, featuring distinguished speakers in the field.

The first development session focused on honing soft skills, led by **Ms. Shirly Rex**, a distinguished academician and Ph.D. scholar with extensive experience, including four years at KPMG-Big4 and four years as an Assistant Professor. Currently pursuing research in marketing at Jamia Hamdard University, she has authored two Scopus-indexed and peer-reviewed publications. Ms. Rex shared her insights on the significance of soft skills in both corporate and academic settings, drawing from her extensive experience as a Corporate and Academic Trainer and her involvement in organizing TEDx events and international conferences.

The seminar highlighted essential skills for personal and professional success, beginning with situation-based questions that examined the presentation and communication abilities of a cab driver and a delivery driver, illustrating how effective soft skills are crucial across all professions, regardless of the sector.

Ms. Rex outlined seven key soft skills necessary for success: **effective communication**, **a positive problem-solving attitude**, **motivation**, **teamwork**, **adaptability**, **self-confidence**, and **professional grooming**. Each of these were explored in depth, with practical advice on how to cultivate them.

She also stressed the importance as how effective communication goes beyond words and incorporates **non-verbal elements** such as body language, tone, and facial expressions, as well as the **7 C's** of communication: clear, concise, concrete, correct, coherent, complete, and courteous.

The second session, featured **Prof. Shalu Mehra**, a renowned trainer and published author specializing in language enhancement, personality, and communication. She has empowered thousands of students through her engaging workshops, Prof. Mehra captivated the audience with her insights and practical guidance.

The session began with a quiz that introduced the core principles of personality development. Participants reflected on their individual e[orts and the essential pillars that contribute to a well-rounded personality.

These pillars were outlined as follows:

- **Physical**: Emphasizing the importance of health, hygiene, and grooming, which significantly impact first impressions.
- Mental: Highlighting how our thoughts influence both voluntary and involuntary actions, alongside the necessity of emotional regulation and channelling emotions effectively.
- Intellectual: Focusing on the continuous pursuit of knowledge and skills.
- **Social**: Stressing the value of interpersonal relationships and effective communication.

Throughout the seminar, attendees participated in activities designed to help them circle their strengths in relation to their personality. The interactive session prompted participants to reflect on their grey areas and consider how they could hone these aspects. Prof. Mehra introduced the concept of **SWOT analysis**, encouraging participants to identify their opportunities and threats while focusing on personal development.

The primary aim of the seminar was to empower attendees to recognize their key pillars that required honing, as well as to clarify their strong pillars for enhanced robustness. To further support personal growth, Prof. Mehra provided several actionable tips for refined personality traits, including: waking up early to seize the day, welcoming challenges as opportunities for growth, and embracing constructive criticism as a pathway to improvement.

Both speakers o[ered valuable insights and practical strategies for enhancing soft skills and personality traits, fostering personal and professional development among participants. The interactive formats appreciated real-world examples and enriched the

learning experience, leaving attendees equipped to apply these concepts in their daily lives.

#### Report for the Training Session of Entente 5.0

Etihad – The MUN Society of Janki Devi Memorial College, successfully organized an online training session to prepare delegates for the annual intra-college event, Entente 5.0, with an Executive Board comprising highly experienced people. The session witnessed the participation of 50+ delegates.

#### Key Highlights-

Etihad, the MUN society of Janki Devi Memorial College, organized the fifth edition of its annual intra-college MUN conference, ENTENTE 5.0, under the Yuva Manthan Experiential Learning Programme, on October 23, 2024. The event was rich with experience, learning, and enjoyment. This year's conference featured three committees: Lok Sabha, Rajya Sabha, and Hindustan Press, all of which saw enthusiastic participation from delegates across our institute.

To assist delegates in understanding the conference proceedings, a training session with the Executive Board was held on October 22, 2024, from 8:30 to 10:00 p.m. online. During the session, Ms. Mehak Gupta, Ms. Diksha Pati, and Ms. Gunjan Goyal, who served as the Executive Board for Lok Sabha and Hindustan Press, provided a thorough explanation of procedural rules and other key information. This included the significance of lobbying and its mechanisms, documentation procedures, various points to be raised by delegates in committee, and guidelines for camera settings. The session concluded with well-wishes from the EB for all delegates' performances in the upcoming conference.

#### • RAJYA SABHA -

The Rajya Sabha committee witnessed the participation of a total of 16 delegates. The agenda of the committee was 'Deliberating upon Environmental Sustainability with special Emphasis on the Impact of the Forest Conservation (Amendment) Bill on Tribal Rights'. Mr. Dhruv Singhal, Mr. Tanishq Kumar, and Ms. Riya Malhotra served as the Executive Board for the committee. The committee was outlined with the introduction of the EB, followed by a quick recap of the rules and proceedings of the committee. The speeches began from the GSL (General Speakers List), and went on throughout the various sections of the committee like the PSL (Provisional Speakers List), moderated caucus and unmoderated caucus.

The session began with a discussion on the Forest Conservation (Amendment) Bill's provisions. The bill intends to ease forest clearances for certain projects, granting the government greater authority in leasing forest land for infrastructure and development purposes, and revising classifications of "forest lands" that may exclude tribal areas.

#### **Key Points Discussed:**

- Environmental Impact Assessments (EIAs): Delegates debated the bill's impact on environmental health, with many raising concerns that the relaxation of EIAs could lead to unchecked deforestation.
- **Development vs. Conservation:** Delegates discussed whether the bill tilts too heavily in favour of development, jeopardizing India's forest cover and biodiversity.
- **Biodiversity and Ecosystem Protection:** The discussion covered the long-term ecological effects of development on forest ecosystems, with emphasis on protecting endangered species and ensuring minimal ecological degradation.
- Community Forest Resources (CFR): Delegates discussed the importance of CFR rights granted under the Forest Rights Act (FRA) and questioned how the bill might affect these rights.

The main sub-agendas discussed by the delegates in the committee were diverse in nature creating a rigorous flow for the debate. By the end of the conference, the committee was divided mainly into two groups – those supporting amendment and those against it. Lastly, an unmoderated session took place where the delegates had a heated debate on the Indigenous Knowledge and Traditional Practices, Educational Outreach Programs, Legal Literacy on Tribal Rights, and Environmental Health Risks.

#### LOK SABHA –

The Lok Sabha committee had a total of 30 delegates. The agenda for this committee was 'Consideration on the possible ways of reforms of the nation through special emphasis on the question of marital rape'. The Executive Board comprised of Mr. Rajat Sharma, Ms. Mehak Gupta, and Ms. Diksha Pati. The committee began with the introduction of the EB. The delegates started the debate and quickly began the teamwork of coordinating with the other politicians of their political party. The committee witnessed representatives tackle the complex issue of marital rape and its potential impacts on family values, cultural norms, and legal boundaries. The opening statement emphasized the importance of respect and mutual consent in marriage, underscoring that protections must exist for women suffering non-consensual marital experiences. A stark statistical overview was presented, noting that 6% of Indian men between ages 15-49 believe marital consent is not necessary, with 19% viewing women as objects, and 82% of women reporting anger over non-consensual spousal intercourse. The legal considerations around **Section 375** were then raised, questioning its applicability in marital cases.

Prominent voices argued that criminalizing marital rape might disrupt family harmony, while others cautioned that such legislation could lead to increased divorce rates and emotional instability within families. In contrast, opposition members voiced support for marital rape laws, challenging the contradiction in revering women while denying their rights. As the session approached its end, representatives captured the warnings of potential harm to children due to parental disputes, and others noted that the absence of marital rape legislation could normalize rape culture.

The session concluded with a call for decisive action against the normalization of marital rape. The committee was then suspended, with an acknowledgment of the diverse perspectives surrounding marital rape and a collective understanding of the legal, cultural, and societal implications that such legislation would entail. This debate showcased the intense emotions and value-driven arguments tied to the topic, underscoring the importance of a sensitive approach to potential legal reforms in this area.

#### • HINDUSTAN PRESS -

Throughout the committee's proceedings, Hindustan Press played a crucial role in documenting the debates, discussions, and resolutions. A team of 6 skilled

photographers provided insightful coverage, capturing the essence of each session and preserving the dynamics of the Youth Parliament. Their presence offered delegates and attendees a unique perspective on the high-stakes environment of the Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha committees.

■ The conference ended on a positive note with the closing ceremony, where the results were announced and all the participants were congratulated for their immense e[orts and enthusiasm. All the delegates expressed their happiness and satisfaction with the event and results. The MAJLIS 2025 training sessions for the All India Political Parties Meet (AIPPM), the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women (UNCSW), and the International Press (IP) were designed to equip delegates with the necessary knowledge and procedural understanding to engage effectively in committee proceedings. These orientation sessions provided a comprehensive overview of MUN structure, rules of procedure, research techniques, and speech formats, ensuring that participants were well-prepared to represent their assigned portfolios or countries with accuracy and diplomacy.

The session witnessed the participation of 30+ delegates. During the two hour session, the honourable EB's explained the valuable information for the three committees – UNCSW, AIPPM, AND IP.

These preparatory workshops laid the foundation for critical thinking, collaboration, and parliamentary conduct, essential for fostering meaningful dialogue and solution-oriented debate throughout the MAJLIS 2025 conference.

#### UNCSW

The UNCSW training session for MAJLIS 2025 began at 1:15 PM with an introductory briefing on the fundamental structure and purpose of Model United Nations. Participants were introduced to the concept of a "delegate," representing a country and its stance on global issues. The session also outlined the hierarchy of the MUN framework, explaining the role of the Executive Board (EB) and the Secretary-General, who oversees the smooth functioning of the conference.

The first procedural step introduced was the Roll Call, where delegates respond with either "Present" or "Present and Voting." This was followed by a detailed explanation of the General Speaker's List (GSL), during which delegates deliver opening speeches. These speeches must include the country's stance, ongoing efforts, solutions proposed, and calls for international collaboration. While data and facts can be incorporated, the focus should remain on diplomatic tone and clarity.

The training then moved to moderated caucuses, a form of informal debate that breaks down the main agenda into sub-topics for deeper discussion. Delegates were encouraged to come prepared with motions, keeping in mind the relevance to their country's foreign policy and international relations. Healthy, respectful conversation and persuasive dialogue were emphasized as essential tools to gain support for proposed motions.

Additional guidance was given on time yields (reallocating unused speaking time) and reliable research sources such as UN reports, country PM statements, official government sites, and news channels. The session successfully familiarized the participants with key MUN protocols and helped build a foundation for effective and informed participation in the committee.

#### **AIPPM**

The AIPPM training session for MAJLIS 2025 commenced at 11:30 AM with an enthusiastic gathering of participants. The session began with a brief interaction led by Mr. Swapnil Pathak, who gauged the prior experience of the delegates and introduced them to the procedural and structural framework of the All India Political Parties Meet. A foundational understanding was laid, starting from Article 79 of the Constitution, followed by a discussion on the purpose and significance of All Party Meetings (APMs), which are called to reach consensus on critical national issues.

Delegates were then guided through the essentials of portfolio preparation. It was stressed that every speech and intervention must reflect the ideology, political thought, and background of the portfolio assigned. This includes understanding the party's history, constituency details, and policy position on the agenda. Research must be fact-based and well-supported, with recommended sources such as official government websites, government reports, PIB, PTIB, and parliamentary records. The opening statement format was explained as a blend of personal introduction (10 seconds) and issue articulation (30 seconds), backed by party ideology and thorough research.

The session also covered public and private statements. Public statements are made once or rarely twice during the session and are used to propose a specific sub-agenda under the broad theme. Private sessions are off-record discussions where confidentiality is to be maintained and all language must remain parliamentary. Procedural tools such as Roll Call (to determine quorum), Lobbying Sessions (to finalize sub-agendas), and Motion Raising were explained in detail, including the format for raising a motion during committee proceedings.

The session was then followed by an online briefing led by **Mr. Saksham Tuteja** to familiarize the delegates with the important parliamentary operational protocols. A major focus was placed on Points of Information (POIs), both verbal and written via chits. Chits must be written in either Hindi or English, not both, and follow a clear format—three lines with a question mark. Delegates were also introduced to Points of Order for factual corrections and Points of Personal Privilege and Enquiry for comfort and procedural clarity, respectively.

The session concluded with a brief on documentation. Delegates were informed that they would be required to submit a final written resolution or summary reflecting their portfolio's stance and the house's consensus. This documentation should be original and distinct from the opening speech and can be completed individually or in groups on Day 2. Overall, the session provided a comprehensive overview of the structure, procedures, and expectations from delegates in the AIPPM committee.

#### ΙP

The International Press training session at MAJLIS 2025 provided delegates with a comprehensive understanding of their crucial role in a Model United Nations conference. Unlike committee delegates who engage in policy discussions and debates, International Press delegates are tasked with observing, analyzing, and reporting on the proceedings of all committees with clarity, neutrality, and creativity. The session emphasized that the press is not merely a passive participant, but an active storyteller responsible for capturing the tone and essence of the conference.

Delegates were introduced to the different formats of content they are expected to produce, including formal reports summarizing debates, feature articles offering indepth analysis, interviews with delegates and Executive Board members, satirical pieces (within respectful limits), and photographic documentation. Each of these formats

serves a distinct purpose in capturing various perspectives and developments during the conference. The importance of maintaining journalistic ethics, ensuring factual accuracy, and avoiding bias was strongly underlined.

Time management was discussed as a vital skill, given that the International Press must produce daily reports within tight deadlines. Delegates were encouraged to divide responsibilities—such as reporting, editing, photography, and design—based on individual strengths to ensure efficient output. They were also guided on how to conduct interviews, observe committee dynamics discreetly, and transform raw observations into compelling narratives. The final deliverable would be a well-designed newsletter or magazine that reflects the diversity and depth of discourse at MAJLIS 2025.

Lastly, delegates were advised to make use of official sources—such as government portals, UN documents, reliable news agencies, and speeches—to back their reports with accurate references. This session helped shape the International Press not just as a media team, but as the memory keepers of the conference, whose work will serve as the enduring record of the voices, visions, and verdicts that emerged within the committee rooms.
