#### Report on the orientation program for the session 2024-25





Etihad word is derived from the Arabic word "Ittihad" meaning "united" aims to train students in diplomacy, leadership and make them aware about international relations through MUN conferences.

#### Report on the Registration and Interview process for Etihad - The MUN Society

Etihad – The Model United Nations Society of Janki Devi Memorial College (University of Delhi) commenced its recruitment and registration drive on **September 4, 2025**. A well-structured and engaging announcement was circulated across various college networks and student communities to encourage widespread participation.

The recruitment campaign emphasized the significance of joining the MUN Society as a means to develop essential skills in **diplomacy**, **debate**, **and leadership**. The **application process**, which remained open until **September 21**, **2025** (8:00 PM), aimed to attract both first-time participants and experienced MUN enthusiasts. Through this initiative, Etihad sought to provide students with an opportunity to engage in intellectual discussions, draft resolutions, and collaborate effectively on global issues.

The promotional outreach highlighted several key benefits of joining the society, including:

- Enhancement of public speaking, research, and leadership skills.
- Exposure to national and international affairs and crisis simulations.
- Certification for participation in select conferences.
- Opportunities to collaborate and network with like-minded peers.

Recruitment was conducted across multiple departments, namely **Delegation**, **Logistics**, **Media**, **Finance**, **Sponsorship**, **Editorial**, **Research**, **and Training**. Detailed role descriptions were provided to help applicants understand the responsibilities and objectives associated with each team.

Etihad received an impressive **143 applications** from students with diverse interests ranging from international relations and media to logistics and finance. This broad spectrum of applicants ensured a rich pool of perspectives and talents.

To evaluate candidates effectively, **interviews were held online**, allowing the selection panel to interact with applicants and assess their analytical abilities, communication skills, and enthusiasm. These interactions offered valuable insights into each candidate's potential to contribute meaningfully to the society's vision and collective goals.

Objective of the event	To educate students on personal finance management, early investment planning, risk assessment, and making informed financial decisions to ensure a secure and independent future
Name and affiliation of the speaker	Dr. Sairam Moturi, Assistant Professor at IFMR GSB, Krea University, holds a doctoral degree in Accounting from the University of Hyderabad and is a twotime recipient of the UGC-JRF. His research focuses on accounting manipulations, audit quality, and auditor rotation, with publications in leading journals and presentations at prestigious conferences including the American Accounting Association and PAN-IIM World Conference.

**Etihad – The MUN Society of Janki Devi Memorial College** successfully organised an insightful seminar on Managing Your Personal Finances. The session was aimed at empowering students with practical financial knowledge and guiding them towards making informed money decisions at an early age. The event witnessed enthusiastic participation from students across various departments and academic years. The seminar fostered a highly interactive and engaging environment, encouraging students to reflect on their financial goals and actively participate in discussions.

## **Session Highlights**

The session began with a thought-provoking question posed by **Dr. Moturi** — "What do you want?" — encouraging students to reflect on their goals, whether material (money, cars) or personal (relationships, stability). This set the tone for a highly engaging and insightful seminar.

- Power in Your Twenties & Understanding Finance: Emphasised the importance of starting early with financial planning and investments, leveraging the compounding effect to build long-term wealth.
- **50:30:20 Rule**: Explained the widely recommended budgeting principle 50% of income for needs, 30% for wants, and 20% for savings/ investments.
- **Investment Avenues**: Guided various investment options such as mutual funds, equities, and fixed-income instruments.
- **Lifestyle Decisions** Cars: Discussed whether buying a car is a feasible investment, introduced the 20-4-10 rule, 30-5-15 rule, and 50% car value rule to help students make responsible purchasing decisions.
- Retirement Planning & Life Stages: Highlighted the benefits of early retirement planning and strategies to adapt across different life stages.
- **Risk Management**: Shared practical tips to identify, assess, and manage risks effectively.
- **Withdrawal Strategies**: Explained the 4% Rule, a popular retirement withdrawal strategy, to ensure sustainable post-retirement income.
- **Asset Allocation & Diversification:** Demonstrated a sample portfolio and introduced the Three-Bucket Strategy to balance short-term, medium-term, and long-term financial needs.
- **Housing Decisions** Buy vs Rent: Presented a comparative analysis of renting versus buying a house, helping students understand the long-term financial implications of both choices.

The seminar concluded with an interactive Q&A session, where students actively engaged with Dr. Moturi, seeking clarity on investment opportunities, savings techniques, and career-linked financial planning. The seminar was well-received and attracted a large audience. It successfully created financial awareness among students and equipped them with practical tools to make informed decisions regarding budgeting, investing, and long-term planning. The insights shared by Dr. Moturi were highly valuable for students preparing to step into financially independent lives.

#### Report on the intra-college Hackathon Event

The eagerly awaited **Hackathon**, orchestrated by **Etihad – The MUN Society** of **Janki Devi Memorial College** as part of the **Yuva Manthan experiential program**, marked a significant milestone in the academic calendar. It brought together a diverse group of participants, judges, faculty, and spectators for an inspiring and intellectually stimulating day, designed to foster creativity, innovation, and problem-solving skills by encouraging participants to develop solutions for real-world issues.

Throughout the day, teams pitched their groundbreaking solutions and prototypes and engaged in rigorous Q&A sessions with the expert judges. This platform served as both a showcase for the students' technical talent and creativity and a hands-on environment for tackling complex, real-world issues with emerging technologies

Before the competition officially began, the founder teacher convenor of Etihad - The MUN Society, Prof. Poonam Bewtra, conducted the formal inauguration. Expressing profound gratitude to the principal, judges for their expertise, organizers, and participants, she then offered a warm welcome and formally inaugurated the competition. Prof. Bewtra concluded by encouraging all participants in the second Etihad Hackathon to embrace the spirit of innovation and collaborative problem-solving.

Following the addresses, the judges for the Hackathon were introduced **Prof. (Dr.) Neeru Vasishth**, a highly distinguished Professor in the Department of Commerce, Janki Devi Memorial College, University of Delhi, with over 38 years of experience teaching Management and Taxation. She is an acclaimed author and a recipient of the 'Distinguished Teacher' award presented by former President Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam. **Dr. Md Khurshid Alam,** Assistant Professor of History at Janki Devi Memorial College, University of Delhi, specializes in Medieval Indian History. He has written numerous research papers on Sufism, Cultural Centres, and Urban Centres, and has presented at many national and international conferences.

The official commencement of Hackathon 2.0 was marked by a detailed briefing on the rules and procedural guidelines. Each participant was assigned a unique problem statement requiring a high-stakes, rapid ideation process. The structure mandated a maximum of 5 minutes for brainstorming and pitch preparation, with strict criteria focusing on the solution's feasibility, impact, and problem-solving efficacy.


Subsequently, the chit selection process was initiated to distribute the problem statements, which spanned critical global domains such as disaster communication, mental health support, urban mobility, and water conservation. Participants then delivered 7-minute presentations, immediately followed by a 3-minute rigorous Q&A session with the judging panel.

Participants showcased innovative solutions across the aforementioned critical domains. For Food Security, teams developed AI-driven frameworks optimizing supply

chain logistics to minimize waste and ensure equitable distribution. In Mental Health, innovations featured integrated digital platforms for personalized, early intervention support. Cultural Heritage Preservation proposals included high-tech methods like Augmented Reality (AR) tours and decentralized digital archives. Solutions for Crisis Communication focused on establishing resilient, decentralized mesh networks for continuous emergency connectivity. To bolster Ethical Consumerism, participants designed blockchain-based ledger systems to ensure transparent product provenance. Furthermore, Rural Development models utilized integrated IoT and solar micro-grids to create smart, self-sustaining ecosystems. Finally, Financial Inclusion was advanced through fintech applications leveraging decentralized identity to expand access to credit and savings for the unbanked population.

After all the presentations, closing remarks were delivered by expressing gratitude to the participants, judges, teachers, and organizing committee members. The creativity and collaboration demonstrated throughout the day was praised and reminded everyone that the Hackathon was about more than just winning—it was about learning and gaining valuable experience.
