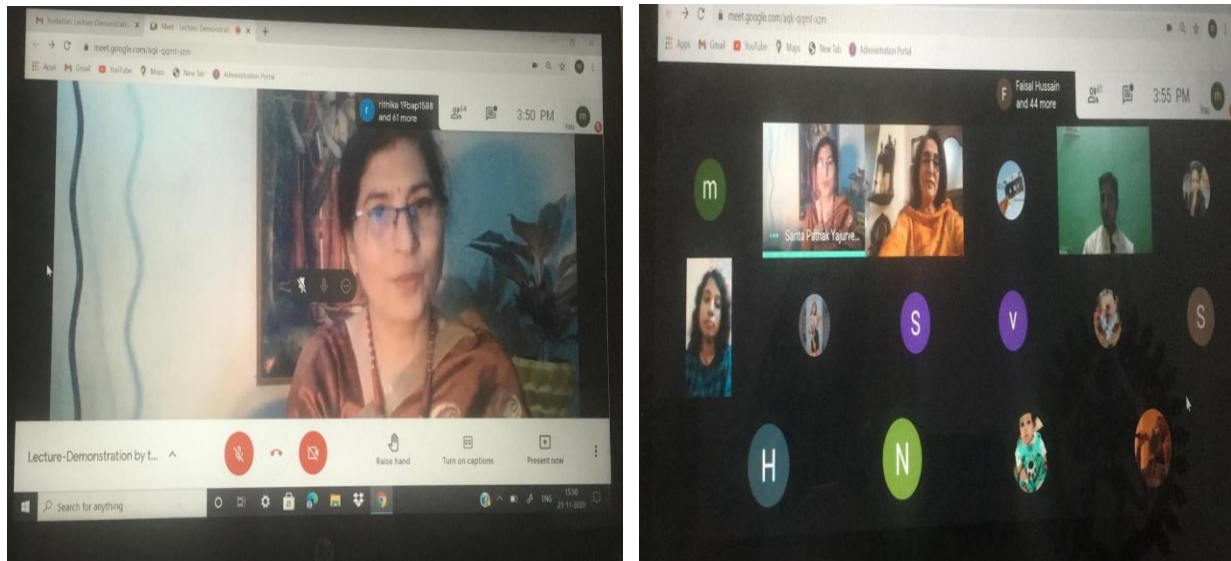

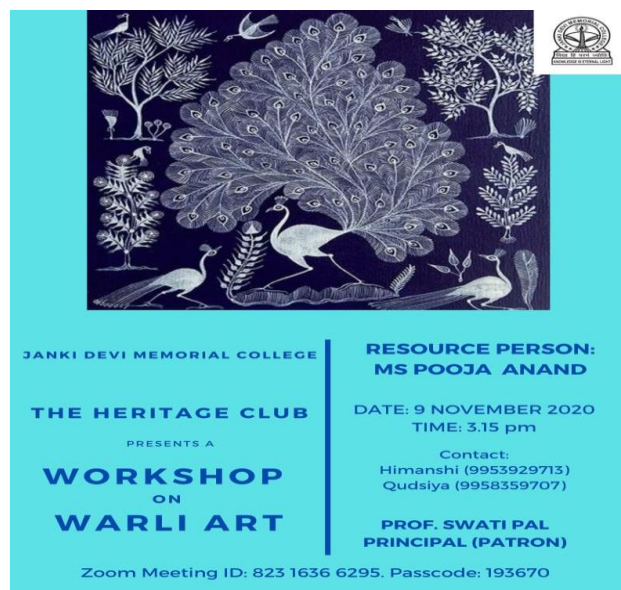
Poster of Lecture-Demonstration on Hindustani Classical Music on 21 November 2020



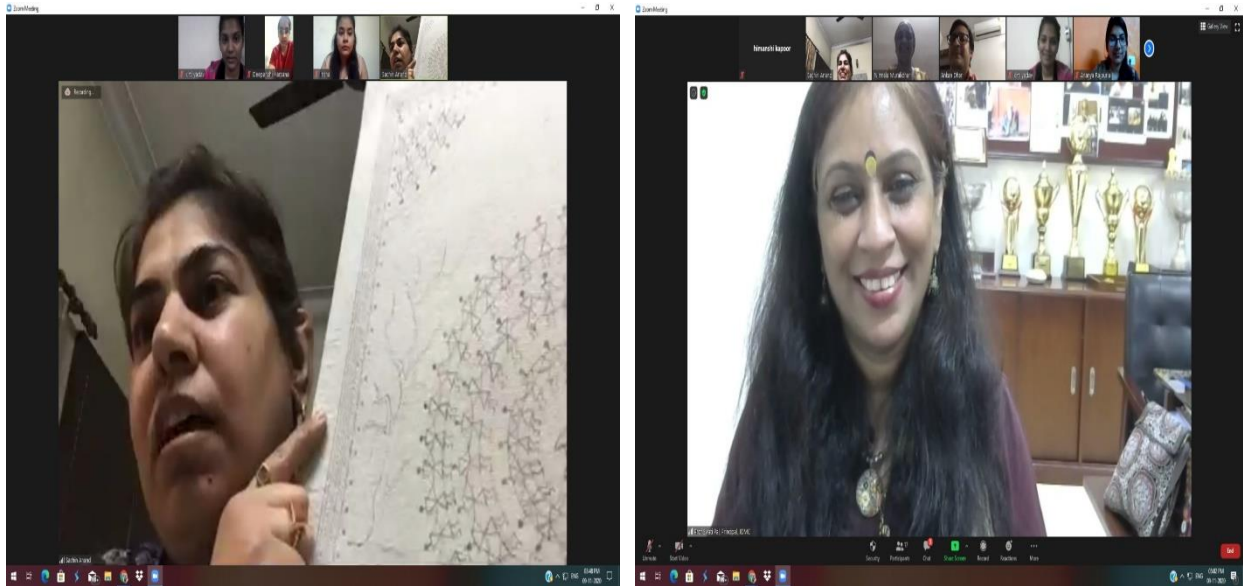
