

The esteemed speaker for the event was Pavel Sagolsem, co-founder of The Chinky Homo Project, an initiative that documents the lived experiences of queer individuals from Northeast India.

The discussion aimed to explore the themes of Indigeneity, Indigenous identity, and the lived experiences of Nupi Maanbi - transgender individuals from Manipur who are reclaiming their voices and space in


society. The focus was on fostering empathy, challenging stereotypes, and building a more inclusive understanding of Indigenous and queer identities.





The event was a vibrant celebration of creativity and talent across various artistic and cultural fields.









The discussion was moderated by Mr. Martin Kamodang, Assistant Professor in the Department of Sociology, Jamia Millia Islamia. The panelists included:


NESSDU Sports Meet

The event was a great opportunity to build teamwork and sportsmanship.











Manipuri Dance Workshop






NESG Stall in Symphony '25

Folklore Workshop - 'Telling the Tale'




