2018

September

12th September-Monis Shamsi of 'You Can' Foundation conducted a meeting in committee room from 12 to 2pm informing about the importance of social service. They talked about how NSS provides a medium to understand and observe different aspects of the society so that we can offer changes to uplift them and brighten their lives.

15th September- To commemorate the International Day of Democracy, on the topic 'Challenges to Indian Democracy' held at IHC New Delhi was organized by Chief Electoral Officer. Importance of participation in the decision or law making processes by the youth was stressed upon.

19th September- A session was held in the college premises on the topic of 'Power of Communication' by Ms.Neha Sethi. She explained about the need to have good oratory skills, combination of verbal and nonverbal communication and importance of such attributes for personality development.

Then they visited Delhi Cantonment and interacted with the general officer commanding and handed over the poems and paintings. Overall it was an enriching experience for the students.

23rd October- A CPR session was held at Tal Katora Stadium in order to teach people survival methods in times of emergency.


