
16 September – Blood Cancer Awareness.

NSS JDMC is proud to support DKMS BMST Foundation India, in their fight to save patients suffering from Blood Cancer, Thalassemia and Aplastic Anaemia. DKMS BMST is an international NGO and stem cell registry working for blood cancer and blood disorder patients. They continuously work towards improving the chances of

survival of these patients, which a lot of times entirely depends on finding a matching 'unrelated' stem cell donor.

Hence in the wake of Blood Cancer Awareness month, the National Service Scheme of **JDMC** in collaboration **with DKMS BMST** foundation organised a very informative seminar on 16th September, 2022 to spread awareness on Blood Cancer. The guest of honour was Dr. Jayanti P Sahoo, Programme Officer and Dr Rajinder Kumar, the Programme Coordinator.

The seminar included a presentation by the speakers of the organization who talked about blood disorders and cancer, and the process of blood stem donation and cited the brave warriors who have donated their stem cells and have saved a life. In the end, the interested students were asked to voluntarily register for this social cause by filling out the registration form and giving them their cheek swab samples to include them in the national database until their 61st birthday.



24 September – NSS Day Celebration Movie Screening






DIWALI MELA – 19TH TO 20TH OCTOBER

The program started at around 3 o'clock in the afternoon.


After the arrival of our chief guest Lt. Gen. Rtd. Shri Gurmit Singh, the program started with national anthem.




ORIENTATION DAY

POSCO ACT


Childhood should be carefree, playing in the sun, not living a nightmare in the darkness of the soul.


NSS JDMC organized a session on *POCSO ACT* on 6th February 2023 in College under the aegis of the government of India (Ministry of Youth Affairs) in partnership with the SAKSHI Organization.

This session was very informative as volunteers were educated about various forms of behaviour that can be classified as child abuse.

The session covered not just an overview of the act, but also included videos on how to speak with children in abuse cases and data on child abuse incidents which is massively underreported. Legal procedures and amendments related to the act were also included to enhance the understanding of the subject.

Following the session, a positive response was observed, and volunteers gained a lot of knowledge about the POCSO ACT and how to deal with patience with children who go through abuse, directly or indirectly. We wish to hold such sessions in the future as well.





DIGITAL LITERACY PROGRAMME

On 7th February 2023, 29 volunteers from NSS attended a session on " *Digital Literacy Programme"* . In collaboration with META, the entire session revolved around cybercrimes, how to detect them, how to prevent them and also how to report such crimes.

Through the means of PowerPoint presentations, videos and interactive conversations, the young minds were taught the severity of such crimes and the extent to which such perpetrators can go. Awareness on this topic was the need of the hour.

BLOOD DONATION

In addition, Volunteers also raised awareness about blood donation and corrected misconceptions among the people that they had regarding blood donation.



PROJECTS OF NSS

1. *Blind Students Teaching Project*

NSS also conducts educational projects in the college campus itself.

NSS has taken up the project Blind Students Teaching where NSS volunteers teach visually impaired students the college for 2 hours once a week.

Currently there are 24 students in enabling unit.

Also whenever they have their exams, NSS volunteers help them during that time. Where the volunteer helps them by dictating the question paper as to what is written in the question paper and then at times the volunteer helps them in writing the answers, the volunteer cannot write anything on its own, the student who is visually impaired will herself dictate everything from sentences to spellings.

The NSS family aims to brighten the future of our brothers and sisters, who are in darkness. It is to enlighten them with knowledge, information and to empower them with various skills that we have brought out this innovative programme.

2. *Sampark Sathi Foundation*

The National Service Scheme Society (NSS) of Janki Devi Memorial College collaborated with the Sampark Sathi Foundation.

The Sampark Sathi Foundation provides a platform for individuals from disadvantaged backgrounds to voice their concerns and access resources and services from government and non-governmental organizations.

This foundation connects people with NGOs and volunteers to resolve their daily issues in a transparent, accountable, and speedy manner.

The foundation aims to develop their capabilities to solve a wide range of common problems and encourages anyone with a concern, regardless of their background, to join the platform. Moreover, this also provides opportunities for organizing various types of camps, including donation, health, legal, skill and vocational, etc.

The NSS volunteers played a crucial role in ensuring that this collaboration was a success by participating in projects organized by the foundation. This collaborative effort highlights the importance of community service and the role of volunteers in improving wellbeing of those in need, which is one of the main objectives of NSS.

3.NEEV SLUM

INTRODUCTION :

The National Service Scheme, Janki Devi Memorial College aims at providing free education to the children living in our adopted slum situated at Anand Parbat, Shadipur .

Keeping this in mind our volunteers, under the Project NEEV started by NSS JDMC, are providing free education to the slum children for 2 hours, 6 days per week which includes Maths, Science, Social Studies, Spoken English, Hindi, and also awareness on current topics. We don't teach them on Sundays.

The main objective of this teaching was:-

- To bridge the gap between those who can not afford tutors and share our knowledge with them.
- To provide them with education and social awareness regarding topics like covid - 19, social distancing, menstruation, health, hygiene, etc.
- Improve the vocabulary of students in Hindi and English.

We are teaching 50-60 students under the NEEV project. 50 volunteers teach the students. The slum heads personally talk to them daily if they face any problem in the class or regarding anything else too.



ACTIVITIES :

Apart from teaching, different activities are conducted in Slum time to time. We talk to Students regarding their problems and needs and then make different donations like Food donation, Cloth donation, Stationery donation, Sanitary Pad donation. We also organize different competitions for students.

Weekly Donation Drive :

We conduct weekly donation drives in our college. In which we collect different items like Cloths, Books, Toffee/ Chocolate Boxes, Stationery, Biscuits etc. After collecting the items we further conduct donation drives.



Books and Stationery Donation Drive :

We organized a "Books and Stationery Donation Drive" keeping in mind the needs of the children.

The objectives for conducting this book and stationery donation are as follows:

- To help those who could not afford the books
- To help the environment by reusing old textbooks.
- To promote reading story books and spread literacy.



The proceedings of the event started at 10:30 when we all volunteers gathered in college auditorium, and collected all the clothes from NSS room and left college to reach slum by 11am.

After reaching the destination i.e Anand parvat, Shadipur slum, We marked our presence at Kalaakar trust and had a short meeting with the teacher coordinator

there. Then we moved out for distributing clothes by dividing ourselves into two groups so that none is left behind to get clothes. All of these clothes were collected from NSS Volunteers themselves as they marked their presence and contribution by donating their old/unused clothes for someone who could use and wear them. Volunteers under the guidance of their seniors distributed clothes to everyone, people belonging to different age groups i.e. children, teens, women, men, old-aged.

We were having all sort of clothes varying from t-shirts, shirts, trousers shawls sweaters, jackets, muflers, socks, innerwear etc suitable for people of all age groups and even sanitary napkins for womens. On the occasion of international women day it was a good step from team NSS for those women who were surviving and managing in very unhygienic condition during their menstrual cycle.

Our team had a great experience there exploring various aspects of life and making an impact towards the welfare and upliftment of such areas by distributing and contributing our bit. We are looking ahead for many more such events with these lovely people and children. Our combined efforts all together can bring a smile to millions of innocent faces.



4. SWACHTA MISSION


