List of Modules

1. Orientation About Competitive Exams Module (1 Lecture)

Objective: To provide a clear roadmap for the structure, pattern, and expectations of major competitive exams.

Components:

- Overview of UPSC CSE, State PCS, NTA, and other examinations
- Syllabus demystification
- Examination pattern, stages, and marking schemes
- Strategy formulation for Prelims, Mains, and Interview
- Time management and study planning
- Do's and Don'ts for beginners

2. NCERT Readings Module (2 Lectures)

Objective: To build strong foundational concepts essential for all competitive examinations.

Components:

- Coverage of Class VI–XII NCERTs (History, Polity, Geography, Economics)
- Identification of key themes and exam-relevant areas
- Concept-to-application techniques for Prelims and Mains
- Linkage with advanced standard books

3. Newspaper Reading Module (2 Lectures)

Objective: Train students to extract exam-relevant content efficiently from newspapers.

Components:

- How to read The Hindu / Indian Express strategically
- Identifying exam relevant issues in newspapers
- Note-making techniques (digital + handwritten)
- Editorial analysis
- Linking newspaper content to General Studies papers

4. Current Affairs Module (2 Lectures)

Objective: To build a strong and dynamic understanding of national and international events.

Components:

- Approaching different current affairs sources such as newspapers and magazines
- Distinction between issues and events
- Mapping current affairs with the static syllabus
- Thematic analysis (Economy, Polity, Environment, International Relations, Society, etc.)

5. MCQs Module (3 Lectures)

Objective: To strengthen conceptual clarity and improve accuracy in solving multiple-choice questions.

Components:

- Understanding traps, distractors, and negative marking
- Techniques: elimination method, intelligent guessing, and time management
- Performance analysis and error-correction strategies

6. Answer Writing Module (3 Lectures)

Objective: To develop the skill of writing crisp, analytical, and high-quality answers for Mains.

Components:

- Understanding the demand of questions: keywords and directives

- Introduction–Body–Conclusion structure
- Use of flowcharts, diagrams, and examples
- Writing balanced, multi-dimensional answers
- Model answers and discussion
- Improving speed, clarity, and expression

7. Essay Writing Module (2 Lectures)

Objective: To develop the ability to write analytical, structured, and high-quality essays.

Components:

- Understanding essay structure: introduction, body, and conclusion
- Techniques for brainstorming and theme-building
- Use of examples, case studies, data, and arguments
- Maintaining coherence, flow, and originality
- Model essays and their discussion
- Evaluation criteria based on UPSC standards

8. Interview Skills Module (2 Lectures)

Objective: To develop confidence, clarity, and personality-based responses for interviews.

Components:

- Understanding the expectations of interview boards
- Detailed Application Form (DAF) analysis and personality profiling
- Body language and communication skills
- Handling stress-based and opinion-based questions
- Ethical and balanced answer framing
- Voice modulation and articulation exercises

9. Assessment Test Module (1 Lecture)

An assessment test covering MCQs, short answers, and essay writing.

10. Discussion on Assessment Test Module (1 Lecture)

Detailed discussion and feedback on the assessment test.
