- **Saraswati Pooja :**



On August 12, 2022 led by the vision of our Principal, Prof. Swati Pal, the Students' Union, Janki Devi Memorial in conjunction with a number of the college's clubs, celebrated the farewell of *Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav*. The event commenced with opening remarks delivered by the Principal, Prof. Swati Pal who has relentlessly encouraged the college in all endeavors. She has been an impactful leader and has continually motivated the students to strive for success daily. Her ability to empathize with students and constant belief in the staff inspires us all to learn new things.

#### *From the Principal's desk*

As life moves on, it often seems that we take everything for granted, including our *Azadi*, our freedom. We forget that this freedom came at a price, a price paid by our freedom fighters and their families, a price paid by those who suffered in the aftermath of the freedom movement from the tragic division of the country due to Partition. In forgetting, we do a grave injustice to the architects of the nation especially to those who have laid down their lives for us. It is thus fitting that we remember with pride, with gratitude and humility, those who have left their footprints on the sands of time. 75 years of leading a life free from tyranny and oppression, 75 years of choosing our own leaders to govern us, 75 years of striving to progress, to evolve as a dynamic republic, certainly calls for celebration. It is no mean feat. And we must remember through music, dance, performances, speeches, exhibitions, debates, discussions, seminars, poetry readings, tributes, and all other cultural as well as academic ways that are open to us as educational institutions. In doing so, we take stock of the fact today we have the freedom to do things that our ancestors were deprived of, including receiving quality education.

However, celebration is only one of the many ways that we remember those whose supreme sacrifice allows us a good night's sleep. If we really want to honour the heroic freedom warriors of our nation, we must emulate them. We must remember that they not only fought to free the country from foreign rule but they also helped to construct this nation as a modern, self-reliant entity. They made policies and ensured that these be implemented. Brick by brick they built civil society including schools, colleges and universities. They realised that simply attaining freedom from colonial rule would be to reduce the freedom to a technicality; they realised that freedom really meant, an opportunity to DO better than before, to BE better than before. They realised that the country has to be the *karmabhoomi* and each citizen must fulfill his/her *karma* in the best possible way. Only then could the country reach that 'heaven of freedom' that Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore speaks of in those magnificent lines, 'Where the mind is without fear'.

It is pertinent to ask, have we reached that heaven of freedom that the great poet speaks of? Is the mind of every Indian citizen without fear? Is the head of every Indian citizen held high? Is knowledge in India free? Is Indian society unfragmented? Yes, we have taken some gigantic strides ahead but the kind of freedom that the poet speaks of is yet an aspiration. *Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav* should mean a renewed pledge to realize that aspiration, a will and determination to see with our own eyes that which we dream off, that heaven we call freedom.


Selflessness and the ability to think of the greater good are essential traits that we must cultivate if indeed we respect our freedom fighters and genuinely believe that *Azadi* is amrit. Our own founder, the late Shri Brij Krishan Chandiwallah (*Bhaiji*) who gave up all his worldly wealth after having surrendered himself to the freedom movement and a Gandhian way of life, is a person whose life can be an example for all of us. He showed us that a true patriot is not one who rests easy at crossing a hurdle; instead, he is one who sets new benchmarks for the country to achieve and indeed who facilitates the citizens to reach those. Had Bhaiji felt he had done enough after 1947, we would not have had the privilege of being a part of such a great institution, our Janki Devi Memorial College with its 63 years of service to the nation through education.

Many people have died for the country. You and I should live for it. In the most honest and noble way possible. No matter where we are and what we do, we should never forget that we are first and foremost Indians. We should relentlessly strive to excel, no matter in which walk of life we are. Then truly will it be an *Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav*.




❖ **‘Remembrance of the Partition Horrors’ Silent March & Exhibition:-**
